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

THE CHRIS THATER MEMORIAL is dedicated in memory of Christopher Thater, a 23 year-old cycling enthusiast and Binghamton University graduate who was killed by a drunk driver in Broome County on October 16, 1983. In 1984, the Broome County STOP-DWI Program started an annual bicycle race to remember Chris and to elevate public awareness of substance abuse and traffic safety.



Medical Assistance

- This event is fully supported with on-site medical staff, a medical tent, and ambulance located on Court Street near the intersection of Water Street
- Please seek any necessary medical attention on-site so that the organizers can maintain a record of assistance rendered and fulfill insurance requirements
- The nearest hospital is at Riverside Drive and Beethoven Street, approximately 1.5 miles from the venue: Lourdes Hospital 169 Riverside Drive Binghamton, NY 13905 (607) 798-5111

Manager's Meeting

There is no manager's meeting. If desired, team managers may bring rider licenses and exchange original signed waivers for bib numbers at registration.

Registration (located inside the Binghamton MetroCenter)

- Discounted race fees by pre-registration only through BikeReg (www.bikereg.com/chris-thater-memorial-races). Day-of registration is available.
- Registration closes 30 minutes before races start
- A valid USAC license, UCI license, or printed *Authorization to Ride* receipt must be presented at registration to receive your race numbers. One-day licenses for Citizen's racers will be available for \$10. Per USAC rules, one-day licensees must never have held an annual USAC license over Cat 5 (men) or Cat 4 (women). Electronic licenses (i.e., via the USAC Mobile app) are encouraged.
- All Juniors under age 18 must have their parent or legal guardian sign their waiver. Proof of legal guardian status is required; power of attorney does not qualify. If coming to the race without a parent or legal guardian, get a wet signature on a waiver form before leaving home!

Number Placement

- All riders will be issued two (2) full size numbers. The first number shall be placed on the LEFT SIDE PANEL of the jersey for visibility from the stage, as shown in the picture below. Align the bottom of the number with the front seam of the side panel. The second number shall be placed on the center back, covering the jersey pockets for visibility from the rear. If issued, frame numbers will be attached to the head/top tube inside the triangle unless the frame is too small, in which case they may be attached under the saddle.
- Men and Women's pro races on Sunday will run "in reverse" of Saturday's PRT event, so bibs for those events only will be on the right side.
- Please make sure numbers are visible to the officials throughout the entire event. Improperly worn/placed numbers may result in the rider not being placed. Numbers that are not visible to the camera will not be included in the results.



Riders who crumple, trim, fold, or reduce the size of the number will be charged a \$20 fee and have their number replaced or refused to start.

Staging

- At ten minutes prior to race start amateur riders should do final warm-ups in the large parking lot north of the metro center on the inside of the course
- Time permitting riders will be allowed to warm up on the course prior to their race start. Under no circumstances may non-racing riders warm up on the course while a race is in progress!
- At 5 minutes prior to race start riders will be staged on the course about 50m in front of the start line for call-ups

Helmets

- Riders are required to wear a securely fastened helmet at all times while mounted on a bicycle (does not apply to riding rollers/trainers).

Neutral Support and Pit

- There is one neutral pit located approximately 200m before the start/finish line
- Neutral support and pace vehicles provided by *The Bike Loft East*
- Riders may cut the course or run backwards on the course to get to the pit. Under no circumstances may a rider ride backwards on the course!
- One free lap per mishap
- No free laps once the leader crosses the finish line with 7 laps to go. After that, riders may obtain pit support and chase to finish the event.



Junior Roll-out and Junior Neutral Support

- All Juniors, no matter what category, must report to rollout immediately after finishing each race. Per USAC rules the maximum chain gear ratio allowed is 7.93 meters (rollout 26'). Rollout will take place at or near the pit.
- Courtesy rollouts will be available prior to each race. However, riders are reminded that they must also report to junior rollout after they finish each race.
- Junior riders are reminded that if they need a rear wheel change from neutral support that they need to ask for a junior wheel. If one is not available, the rider is responsible for blocking out the lower gears before proceeding with the race.

Special Regulations and Considerations

- Parking is located on-street throughout the city and in the parking garages located at Henry St and State St with entrance on State St, or Henry St and Water St with entrance on Water St. Note that the height of the parking garage ceiling is probably less than the height of your car with a bike on top!
- No littering - discard bottles and other refuse only at the service pit. Please respect our city by taking at least as much trash home as you brought with you.
- Feeding - No hand-ups are permitted except in case of extremely hot weather at the discretion of the Chief Referee. If so, the location and duration of permitted feeding will be announced.
- Unacceptable behavior (including but not limited to foul language, public urination, fighting) will be severely penalized. This is a community event with fans of all ages present. Please behave accordingly.

Pro Road Tour Races Point Distribution

The Chris Thater Memorial is a PRT event. Points are distributed in accordance with the PRT Points Table (www.usacycling.org/usa-cycling-pro-road-tour-points-table-scoring.htm); i.e., for each place:

1. 25 Points
 2. 19 Points
 3. 14 Points
 4. ...down to 1 points for 10th place
- The course opens for warm-up up to 30 minutes prior to race start
 - Staging for call ups and national Anthem is at 10 minutes prior to race start about 50m in front of the start line
 - Podium ceremony will be held immediately after the race under the finish line truss

Anti-Doping Controls and RaceClean® Program

- The Chris Thater Memorial is a proud supporter of the USA Cycling RaceClean® program.
- All riders, both amateur and professional, are responsible for checking the results to see if they have been selected for anti-doping controls and if so immediately reporting to the doping control station located inside the Metrocenter (at registration) within 15 minutes of results being posted.
- For Pro races, chaperones will provide immediate escort of selected riders to the control station.



Awards Ceremony and Payout

Podiums will take place at the Start/Finish area after the 15-minute protest period, usually within 30 minutes of the conclusion of the race. Payouts will be at the registration area. Prize winners over \$600 will need to fill out applicable US tax forms before receiving payment.


