## WHAT IS THE HEALTHY NEIGHBORHOODS PROGRAM (HNP)?

The Healthy Neighborhoods Program is a **FREE** program dedicated to improving the quality of life for Broome County residents by reducing exposure to health and safety risks in the home.

The HNP provides **FREE** home safety surveys, **FREE** safety supplies with product demonstrations for qualifying residents that will help with environmental health and safety issues in:


- asthma control
- smoking cessation
- housing and property maintenance
- mold control
- pest control
- childhood lead poisoning prevention
- fire and burn safety prevention
- carbon monoxide poisoning prevention
- residential injuries (falls, poisonings)
- effects of radon



This program is for residents with health and housing concerns who live in in zip codes:


### 13903

The north boundary is the Susquehanna River, south to the Town of Binghamton line, east to Sandy Beach and west to Mill Street.



### 13790

The north boundary is the railroad tracks closest to Route 17, south to Floral Avenue, east to Floral Avenue intersection with Main Street and west to Riverside Drive.



## WHAT TO EXPECT AT A HNP HOME SAFETY SURVEY?

Healthy Neighborhoods program staff will be looking for health and environmental hazards, providing educational materials, free safety supplies with product demonstrations to deal with:



### **Asthma:**

*Discussing asthma triggers in the home including: house dust and dust mites, High fume cleaners, perfumes, air fresheners, pest control, pets, secondhand smoke*

### **Lead Poisoning Prevention:**

*Reviewing and examining potential housing based sources of childhood lead poisoning including peeling, cracking and chipping paint, discussing importance of blood lead testing*

### **Fire and Burn Prevention:**

*Testing smoke detectors and changing batteries, reviewing fire escape plans (E.D.I.T.H.)*

### **Carbon Monoxide Poisoning:**

*Checking carbon monoxide levels in the home, reviewing symptoms of CO poisoning*
