

EMERGENCY ORDER

Local Emergency Order for Broome County:

I, Jason T. Garnar, the Chief Executive of Broome County, in accordance with a declaration of a State of Emergency issued on March 14, 2020, and pursuant to Section 24 of New York State Executive Law, do hereby order:

That in accordance with the Governor's Executive order 202.10 non-essential gatherings of individuals of any size for any reason are canceled or postponed at this time.

Examples of non-essential gatherings include conferences, festivals, parades, concerts, sporting events, weddings, and other types of assemblies. Events that are covered by this executive order include events that can be planned not only by organizations and communities but also by individuals.

This order does not apply to the day to day operation of organizations such as schools, institutes of higher learning, or businesses which are addressed in other emergency orders or executive orders of the governor.

This order shall take effect immediately and shall remain in effect for five (5) days unless rescinded earlier by order of the Chief Executive. This order may also be renewed in (5) five-day increments.

Failure to obey this order is a criminal offense, punishable by law under New York State Executive Law §24(5).
