RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF BROOME AND THE BROOME COUNTY OFFICE OF THE SHERIFF AS JOINT EMPLOYERS AND BROOME COUNTY SHERIFF'S CORRECTIONS EMPLOYEES LOCAL 2012, COUNCIL 82 AFSCME, AFL-C10

WHEREAS, the Office of the Broome County Sheriff's Corrections Division is experiencing a current staffing shortage, and

WHEREAS, the Corrections Division currently has approximately nine vacancies, and

WHEREAS, the parties agree to provide an incentive for new employees who are lateral transfers, now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the parties agree as follows:

For lateral transfers hired between January 30, 2024 and December 31, 2026,

- 1. Article 13 of the Collective Bargaining Agreement shall be amended to add a Section 13.9.1 to read as follows:
  - 13.9.1 Hiring Bonus, Any employee hired through a lateral transfer as defined by the Civil Service Law and Broome County Civil Service Rules shall receive a hiring bonus of \$5,000 payable as follows: \$2,500 shall be paid in the employees first paycheck; \$1,250 shall be paid after the completion of one year of active employment as a Corrections Officer and the remaining \$1,250 shall be paid at the completion of two years of active employment as a Corrections Officer.
  - 13.9.2 No bonus shall be paid until the Broome County Personnel Office certifies that the lateral transfer complies with the Civil Service Law and Broome County Civil Service Rules.
  - 13.9.3 Should an employee eligible for this hiring bonus leave employment prior to completing three years of active employment as a Corrections Officer, the employee shall be required to repay the hiring bonus and the County may deduct any amounts owed from the employee's final paycheck. Should the amount of the hiring bonus exceed the employee's final paycheck, the employee shall remain obligated to repay the remaining amount owed to the County.
  - 13.9.4 For purposes of calculating years of active employment under Section 13.9.1 and 13.9.3, the employee's anniversary date in title as defined in Section 13.1.2 shall apply. For purposes of calculating years of active employment, any days during a year where the employee is on a leave of absence shall not be counted as active employment.
  - 13.9.5 An employee hired as a lateral transfer under this section shall be given credit for their years of DCJS certification for purposes of determining their salary and eligibility for future steps under Exhibit B of the Collective Bargaining

Agreement. For example, if a lateral transfer received their DCJS certification more than three years but less than four years prior to their date of hire at the Sheriff's Office, they will receive the salary for completion of third year as their starting salary. This credit for length of DCJS certification shall not apply for any other purposes other than starting salary under this MOU.

- 2. Except as set forth herein all terms and conditions of the Collective Bargaining Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.
- 3. Seniority for the lateral employee would begin at their hire date with the Broome County Sheriff's Office. All lateral employees must start at the rank of Corrections Officer, regardless of the rank that they have at the time of transfer. Vacation and sick time usage and accrual will begin at the same rate as a new hire. Time needed to take a promotional examination will only begin after the employees transfer date.

- 2. Seniority for the lateral employee would begin at their hire date with the Broome County Sheriff's Office. All lateral employees must start at the rank of Deputy Sheriff, regardless of the rank that they have at the time of transfer. Vacation and sick time usage and accrual will begin at the same rate as a new hire. Time needed to take a promotional examination will only begin after the employees transfer date.
- 3. This agreement shall expire on December 31, 2026.
- 4. Except as set forth herein all terms and conditions of the Collective Bargaining Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.
