The Department of Audit and Control has compiled a summary of the status of accounts receivable balances in various County Departments as of July 31, 2006.

- For the quarter ended July 31, 2006, we noted no substantial percentage increase in Accounts Receivable balances when compared to the first (1) quarter Accounts Receivable Report.
- We also note that former Aviation Commissioner Carl Olsen still owes the Airport \$487.50 that is in excess of 120 days old.

Attached are schedules summarizing the status of significant receivables as of July 31, 2006. The criteria that we established for monitoring was to track balances that were in excess of \$100,000 as of July 31, 2006 and generate from fee for service transactions. If you are aware of other receivable categories that are at risk of becoming uncollectable, please advise.
