An offensive rebound and put back layup by Maine Endwell sophomore Alec Wisniewski with under a minute to play proved to be the decisive points in the Spartans 48-43 victory over Vestal in the third place game of Regional Division I at the 20th annual STOP-DWI Holiday Classic.

Vestal, who led much of the second half, relinquished its lead at the 4:41 mark after sophomore Kyle Gallagher made a hard drive down the right side and connected on his attempt. Wisniewski scored six points of his ten second-half points in the game's final minutes including a difficult runner in the lane to give the Spartans a three point lead with under four minutes to play.

Maine Endwell outscored Vestal 20-11 in the fourth quarter after trailing by four heading into the final frame. The Spartans won the rebounding battle in the second half (23-13) after being dominated on the boards in the first, as three key offensive rebounds for Maine Endwell helped seal the game.

Wisniewski finished with a game-high 15 points and added six rebounds for the Maine Endwell. Gallagher, who had a rough first half, recorded 11 points (had 26 against Union Endicott Wednesday morning), eight rebounds and six assists. Junior Steve Eggleston, who made three crucial three-pointers to keep Maine Endwell in the game, ended up with 12 points.

The Vestal senior duo of Erik Kearns and Jeremy Liss registered a pair of double-doubles for the Golden Bears. Kearns posted 13 points (10 in second half) and 13 rebounds, while Liss added 11 points and ten rebounds. It was the second straight double-digit effort for Kearns, who scored 19 points versus Binghamton Wednesday night.

After an 8-0 start by Maine Endwell to begin the game, Vestal outscored its STAC foe 21-7 over the next 12 minutes of the half to take a 21-15 lead into the break. A pair of three-pointers by junior Frank D'Esti and senior Devin Mullins gave Vestal a 12-10 lead early in the second quarter.

An alley-oop layup by Gallagher, who had just four first-half points (2-of-7 shooting), cut the Golden Bears' lead to three with under a minute left in the half. But senior Erik Kearns converted a three-point play (first points of game) with 40 seconds remaining to give Vestal the six-point halftime margin.

Vestal's run was led by Liss who netted eight first half points, while Kearns worked the boards hard for eight rebounds. The Golden Bears out rebounded Spartans, 16-10 in the first half for five second-chance points. Maine Endwell won the overall rebounding battle 33-29.

With Gallagher struggling from the field sophomore Alec Wisniewski led the Spartans with five points in the opening half. Gallagher added two rebounds and two assists to his four points.

Vestal maintained its lead throughout the third quarter, but two free throws by Gallagher trimmed the lead to four heading into the fourth quarter. Junior sharpshooter Pat Norris sunk five three-pointers off the bench for a gamehigh 18 points to lead Chenango Valley over Susquehanna Valley 64-51 in the opening game of Regional Division II at the 20th annual STOP-DWI Classic.

A swarming Chenango Valley defense forced ten Susquehanna Valley turnovers in the second half, which led to a 17-3 run over the opening six minutes of the fourth quarter handing the Warriors a 55-46 lead with two minutes remaining, one they would not surrender.

Norris rattled home his fifth three-pointer of the game to cap the run and help Chenango Valley advance to the Regional Division II championship game Friday evening against Norwich at 5:45 p.m.

Senior Robert Heller and junior Chris Ruffo joined Norris with double-digit scoring efforts, dropping 14 and 11, respectively. Chenango Valley shot a deadly 48 percent from the floor (19-of-39), including 9-of-18 from beyond the arc.

Junior Brendon Normile led Susquehanna Valley with a double-double performance, recording 13 points and 14 rebounds. Fellow big man, senior Trenton Benton added 11 points and nine rebounds for the Sabers, who move on to the consolation bracket of Regional Division II against Owego on Friday afternoon at 2:45 p.m.

Susquehanna Valley dominated the boards (36-15) holding a considerable size advantage over Chenango Valley (a roster that boasts four players 6-foot-6 or taller), while the Warriors have just one player that is at least 6-foot-4. The height advantage allowed the Sabers to take a one-point lead into the half, 27-26.

Balanced scoring by both teams, each shooting over 40 percent in the first half, led to an evenly played first two quarters between the Sabers and Warriors. Impressive offense was displayed by each team as Susquehanna Valley worked the inside game and Chenango Valley heated up from outside. A combined 11 different players entered the scoring column for the two teams in the first half.

The Susquehanna Valley frontcourt tandem of Normile (6-foot-7) and Benton (6-foot-6) combined for 13 of the Sabers 27 first-half points. Norris went 3-of-5 from beyond the arc to lead the Warriors with nine points in the opening two guarters.
