Gallagher was 10-of-21 from the floor and added a team-high 10 rebounds and four assists. Senior Alec Wisniewski chipped in 14 points and five rebounds for the Spartans.

Sophomore Andre Hawkins scored all of his team-high 10 points in the second half to lead Binghamton. Junior Nick Snyder added eight points and a game-high 11 rebounds. Junior Anthony Weakland also scored eight points for the Patriots.

Maine-Endwell, who led from start to finish, used a decisive 12-0 run in the third quarter to break open the contest. The Spartans shot 52 percent in the second half to take its largest lead of the game (38-19) late in the third quarter.

After a brief flurry of baskets by Hawkins to pull Binghamton within seven (26-19), Maine-Endwell embarked on the game-changing run. Gallagher netted nine of the 12 points during the Spartan run helping Maine-Endwell take a 40-21 lead into the fourth quarter. The Patriots never pulled any closer than 14 in the final eight minutes as the Spartans cruised to the 20-point victory.

Gallagher led Maine-Endwell with 13 first-half points helping the Spartans stake out a 10-point halftime lead (21-11). Maine-Endwell forced 12 Binghamton turnovers in the first half as Gallagher scored nine of the Spartan's 11 points in the opening quarter. Gallagher also contributed six rebounds and three assists to M-E's cause during the first half.

The second quarter witnessed Snyder keep Binghamton within striking distance scoring six points, all coming in the paint. The 6-foot-4 Patriot big man also collected eight rebounds as Binghamton held a slim 23-22 rebounding advantage. However, turnovers and poor shooting (5-for-21) hampered Binghamton's offense. The Patriots limited the Spartans to 0-for-9 shooting from beyond the arc.

Maine-Endwell moves on to play in the championship game of the Regional Division I bracket Monday night at 7:15. Binghamton will play for third place of the Regional Division I bracket Sunday morning at 9:30 a.m.
