Sophomore guard Aaron Davis drained a corner three as the shot clock expired with just over a minute to play handing Kennedy Catholic a 39-37 victory over Nottingham, Saturday afternoon in the 2016 STOP-DWI Winter Classic Howland Division at Binghamton High School. The Gaels ended the game on an 8-0 run to finish the tournament with a 1-1 record.

Kennedy Catholic was led by all-tournament selection AJ Morales, who scored a team-high 14 points. Senior center Jaz Burton was a force in the paint all day picking up a game-high 13 rebounds while adding seven points. Davis finished the day with eight points and two steals.

Senior Jevon Jones highlighted Nottingham's performance with a game-high 17 points on 8-of-18 shooting to earn a position on the all-tournament team. The 6-foot-3 swingman was limited to just five second-half points missing a go ahead jumper with under 10 seconds to play. Nottingham also finished the tournament with a 1-1 record.

With the game tied at 30-30, Nottingham went on a 7-0 run ignited by a Jakair Sanchez triple. The Bulldogs closed the run after a steal by Mohamed Abdi and breakaway layup from Malcom Sanchez with 3:30 remaining. However, Kennedy and Morales responded with a three from the top of the key and a pair of free throws before Davis' heroics.

Both teams played to a stalemate in the third quarter scoring seven points apiece as Nottingham maintained its one-point edge heading into the final period. An offensive rebound and putback by Brian Szpindor gave the Gaels a brief 27-26 lead, but a pull-up jumper by Jones regained the lead for the Bulldogs, who held a 28-27 advantage at the end of third quarter.

In the first half, Nottingham staked a four-point lead after the opening eight minutes thanks to 12 first-quarter points from Jones. Kennedy Catholic attempted to utilize the three-ball to stay in the game, but hit just 1-of-11 shots from beyond the arc in the half. Morales netted seven points the lead the Gaels.

Kennedy took an 11-8 lead midway through the first quarter behind five quick points from Morales. Nottingham employed a full-court pressure defense that resulted in six points off turnovers to take a 14-13 advantage. Jones netted a beautiful floater in the lane as time expired in the opening quarter to provide the Bulldogs with an 18-14 lead.

The second quarter didn't witness much offense as Kennedy Catholic outscored Nottingham, 6-3, to pull within one at the break, 21-20. A three-pointer by Sanchez gave Nottingham its largest lead of the half, but those were the only points the Bulldogs could muster in the second quarter.

Senior guard Malik Zachery poured in a game-high 31 points to lead West Genesee past Binghamton, 81-66, in the Howland Division finale of the 2016 STOP-DWI Winter Classic, Saturday night at Binghamton High School. Zachery averaged 29 points per game to earn Most Valuable Player honors and lead the Wildcats to the only 2-0 record in the tournament.

Also reaching double-figures and earning all-tournament recognition for West Genesee were senior Jack Bova (20 points) and sophomore Lucas Sutherland (15 points). Senior Nate Phillips was also named to the all-tournament team for the Wildcats.

Binghamton was led by senior guard Muhammad Trammell, who netted a team-high 14 points going 4-for-7 from beyond the arc. Sophomores Tyshawn High and Isaiah Rogers both recorded double-figure efforts with 12 points apiece.

The Patriots burst out of the gate in the first quarter going on an 8-0 run to open the game after converting pair of West Genesee turnovers into fast-break layups. The Wildcats responded, however, with a 33-6 run to close out the opening eight minutes of play. Binghamton had no answer for the three-ball by West Genesee, who connected on 6-of-9 three-pointers in the first quarter. Bova netted four of the six triples in the opening frame while Zachery scored a pivotal 16 points.

West Genesee opened the second quarter on a 10-3 spurt to extend its lead to 30, but Binghamton ended the first half on a 14-4 run to trim deficit to, 54-34, thanks to a buzzer-beating three-quarter court heave from Devin Tyler. Rogers led the Patriots with nine first-half points.

Binghamton outscored West Genesee in the second half, 32-27, but was never able to get within striking distance. The Patriots cut the Wildcat lead to 12 with under four minutes to play after High drained a pretty floater in the lane. West Genesee quickly responded as Sutherland deposited a ferocious one-hand jam to quiet any momentum from the Patriots.

West Genesee shot a blistering 66 percent from the floor in the first half (18-for-30), but finished the game shooting 46 percent after the reserves played much of the third quarter. The Wildcats finished the game 9-of-27 from three-point land while the Patriots converted on six of their 17 three-point attempts. West Genesee was strong on the glass, outrebounding Binghamton 42-35, highlighted by Sutherland's game-high 12 boards.
