Alex Tweedie hit 2 free throws down the stretch and Dylan Jacob came up with a steal as time expired to help Walton hold on for a 70-67 win over Union-Endicott in the Tarricone Division of the STOP DWI Winter Classic.

Entering the 4th quarter down by 10, Sadeeq Terry put the Tigers on his back, scoring 7 of his game high 26 points, including a 3-point basket with under a minute left to bring the Tigers within 1 point.

Tweedie hit the front end of a 1 and 1, to give Walton a 2-point lead. Matt Polemni attempted a 3-point shot for the Tigers but it was no good. Tweedie got the rebound and was fouled. He made the first, but missed the second, giving U-E one last chance. However, Jacob got a steal and the Warriors held on to take 3^{rd} place in the Tarricone Division.

The Tigers took a 19-12 lead after the first quarter thanks to back to back 3-pointers by Polemeni. Walton would respond in the 2nd quarter as Tweedie hit back to back 3-pointers to give the Warriors a 37-33 halftime lead.

Tweedie continued his hot streak, scoring the Warriors first 5 points in the 3rd. He scored 11 straight to give Walton a 41-35 lead, but Terry would answer with 8 straight of his own to bring the Tigers within 4. Walton would then go on a 8-2 run, ending with a Tweedie jumper.

Terry ended with 26 points, 5 rebounds and 5 assists and was named to the All-Tournament team. Polemeni ended with 13 points and 15 rebounds for U-E.

Tweedie led Walton with 18 points and 7 rebounds. Teammate Dylan Jacob had 16 points and 5 assists. Jacob was also named to the All-Tournament team.

Steele Hamme was honored with the Thomas Schwan award, given to the unheralded player who represents the "true heart and soul" of his team.
