Overview of the Upcoming Week

NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE

Long duration snow event, starting as widespread rain to snow across Western NY overnight and Thursday, evolving into significant lake effect snow with **BLIZZARD** conditions east and southeast of the lakes through Friday, with lake effect snow continuing through Saturday. Expect significant blowing and drifting snow.

Storm totals

5-9" over Niagara Frontier with snow rates over 1"/hr at times 2-3 feet, locally higher over the Tug Hill, snow rates over 2"/hr at times 1-2 feet, locally higher terrain east of Lake Erie, snow rates over 1"/hr at times

West winds gusting to 50 mph with whiteout conditions in blizzard areas.

Dry weather returns for Sunday and Sunday night. Next system arrives later Monday and Tuesday. Expect much warmer weather with next system, with highs exceeding 50F.














Wind and Waves Thursday 7AM












Today through Thursday

 Rain arrives by this evening, then changes over to snow from southwest to northeast overnight. Snow will be heavy at times with lake effect conditions developing east of the lakes by Thursday. Accumulations tonight:

NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE

- 3-5" Western NY, Niagara Frontier
- 1-3" Genesee Valley
- 0-T Northern Finger Lakes, maybe an 1" Tug Hill Plateau
- Widespread snow tapers off Thursday while lake effect ramps up and becomes heavy, particularly east of Lake Ontario. West winds gusting 45-55 mph with <u>BLIZZARD</u> conditions within lake effect bands. Blowing/drifting snow elsewhere. Accumulations Thursday:
 - 1-4" Western NY, Niagara Frontier, but 4-8" east of Lake Erie
 - 1-3" Genesee Valley and Northern Finger Lakes
 - 3-6" eastern Lake Ontario, up to 1 foot Tug Hill Plateau
- Temperatures:
 - Today: near 40
 - Tonight and Thursday: mid 20s to near 30



Thursday Night through Saturday

- HEAVY lake effect snow and <u>BLIZZARD</u> conditions continue east of the lakes. Heaviest snow will be Thursday night and Friday. Most other areas will see mainly blowing and drifting snow into Friday, but with some additional accumulations as flow becomes more WNW. Lake effect event continues Saturday into Saturday night with decreasing impacts.
- Accumulations:
 - 1-3" Western NY, Niagara Frontier, Northern Finger Lakes

- 2-5" Genesee Valley
- 2-4" St Lawrence Valley
- 6-18" east of Lake Erie
- 1-3 FEET Tug Hill Plateau
- Temperatures:
 - Highs:
 - Mid 20s
 - Lows:
 - Teens, near zero by Saturday Night east of Lake Ontario.







Sunday through Tuesday

- High pressure Sunday. Any residual lake effect ends.
- Rain may arrive Monday, if not Tuesday.
- Temperatures:
 - Highs: 30s Sunday, 40s Monday, and 50s Tuesday
 - Lows: Teens Sunday night, and upper 30s Monday night and Tuesday night.





Ice Cover


