

COUNTY ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES
January 14, 2016

The County Administration Committee of the Broome County Legislature met on Thursday, January 14, 2016 in the Legislative Conference Room, Sixth Floor, Edwin L. Crawford County Office Building, Binghamton, New York.

The County Administration Committee meeting was called to order by the Chairman at 4:00 PM. Mr. Whalen made a motion to move the agenda, seconded by Mr. Shaw.

The Committee took the following action with regard to the matters before it:

#31 RESOLUTION ADOPTING LOCAL LAW INTRO. NO. 1 OF 2016, ENTITLED: "A LOCAL LAW AMENDING THE BROOME COUNTY CHARTER AND ADMINISTRATIVE CODE CHAPTER 257-40 FEES SCHEDULE AND CHAPTER 305-5 DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH FEES FOR OPERATING PERMITS AND REVIEW OF PLANS"

Ms. Edwards stated that the State Department of Health had handled the inspection of tanning salons since 2012, but the State has shifted the responsibility to the local County Health Departments under new regulations. She further stated that the County will honor current state permits until they are up for renewal. One new regulation is that tanning bed timers will no longer be set by the user, but by the owner or manager of the tanning salon. She further stated that the Health Department employees have been properly trained in how to review/inspect tanning salons with regard to the new regulations.

#32 RESOLUTION ADOPTING LOCAL LAW INTRO NO. 2 OF 2016, ENTITLED "A LOCAL LAW REPEALING CHAPTER 228 OF THE BROOME COUNTY CHARTER AND CODE"

Mr. Schofield stated that the Administration wants to repeal the current Road Use Agreement (RUA) law because it is outdated and negatively affects local businesses, which it wasn't originally intended to. He further stated that a new RUA local law will be coming before the Legislature in either February or March.
