WHEREAS, Broome County, like all other Counties in New York State, have an indigent burial program where those who cannot afford a burial or cremation receive one paid for by the Broome County Department of Social Services (DSS), and

WHEREAS, per Social Services Law §141, expenditures up to \$900 made on or after April 1, 1987 are subject to reimbursement by New York State for indigent burials/cremations even though the average cost of an indigent burial/cremation is roughly \$1,900, and

WHEREAS, prior to January 1, 2011 the reimbursement rate from New York State was 50%, after which it was amended to a reimbursement rate of 29% with the remaining being local county tax dollars, and

WHEREAS, in 2015 DSS approved 179 indigent burials, with the total cost for the burials being \$332,311, of which New York State reimbursed Broome County in the amount of \$46,197 and the remaining cost of \$286,114 was borne by Broome County taxpayers, and

WHEREAS, with New York State lowering the reimbursement rate from 50% to 29% and putting the added 21% cost on Broome County taxpayers, the local share amount will only continue to rise as is expected the cost of most goods and services, and

WHEREAS, the only equitable solution is for New York State to return to even cost sharing of indigent burials/cremations and reimburse all Counties in the State at the rate prior to 2011, which is 50%, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that this County Legislature hereby requests that New York State increase the reimbursement to the Counties of New York for indigent burials/cremations back to 50% as it was prior to 2011 to alleviate the unnecessary burden put on local taxpayers, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Legislature shall forward a certified copy of the resolution to Governor Andrew M. Cuomo, Senate Majority Leader John J. Flanagan, Assembly Speaker Carl E. Heastie, Senator Frederick J. Akshar II, Assemblyman Clifford W. Crouch, Assemblyman Christopher S. Friend, Assemblywoman Donna A. Lupardo, and the New York State Association of Counties.

Mrs. Myers made a motion, seconded by Mr. Whalen to amend the Resolution to add a paragraph to read: "FURTHER RESOLVED, that at the discretion of any Broome county funeral home, additional funds up to \$750 may be supplemented by the deceased family, friends or community for otherwise not included services of an indigent burial without the funeral home violating their reimbursement contract with Broome County." Acting on the opinion of the County Attorney, the Chairman ruled that the amendment was not germane to the Resolution and no action was taken on the amendment.
