Section 2. SEQR DETERMINATION. It is hereby declared to be the intent of this County Legislature that the projects listed above shall not commence until all steps have been taken under the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQR), to the extent applicable, to ensure that said proposed projects are in compliance with the provisions thereof and, to this end, it is hereby determined that, until such compliance has been accomplished, the only obligations which shall be issued pursuant to this resolution shall be to provide funds for engineering, architectural and legal fees, including studies, surveys and testing of the site thereof, which will, at least, assist in the SEQR compliance process.

Section 3. The aggregate maximum estimated cost of the aforesaid classes of objects or purposes is \$56,499,000 and the plan for the financing thereof is by the issuance of \$56,499,000 bonds of said County, hereby authorized to be issued therefor pursuant to the Local Finance Law and by the application of \$14,509,000 from the Federal government in the following monies and allocated in their entirety to the following projects \$6,750,000 for the Reconstruct Runway Safety Area-Runway 34 EMAS project, \$4,995,000 or the Rehabilitate Taxiway, Airfield Lighting-Construct project, \$320,000 for the CR 20 BIN 3349250 & 3349370 Maintenance Design project, and \$1,280,000 for the Hooper Rd Bridge Rehab (BIN 3349750)-Constr project, \$180,000 for the Purchase Five Lifts project, \$280,000 for the Purchase Generator For Full Facility/Bus Charging project, \$104,000 for the Purchase Replacement Service Truck project, \$480,000 for the Purchase Six Cutaway Buses project, \$120,000 for the Upgrade Transit Front Landscaping project, there being anticipated \$2,790,000 received from State government in the following amounts and allocated entirely to the following projects: \$337,000 for the Reconstruct Runway Safety Area-Runway 34 EMAS project, \$277,000 for the Rehabilitate Taxiway, Airfield Lighting-Construct project, \$650,000 for the Core Building Rehabilitation project, \$100,000 for the Music Practice Area-Renovation Phase II project, \$1,000,000 for the Nursing Program Expansion Furniture and Equipment project, \$150,000 for the Roofing Projects project, \$45,000 for the Purchase Five Lifts project, \$70,000 for the Purchase Generator For Full Facility/Bus Charging project, \$26,000 for the Purchase Replacement Service Truck project, \$120,000 for the Purchase Six Cutaway Buses project and \$15,000 for the Upgrade Transit Front Landscaping project, however, that the amounts of bonds to be issued shall be reduced to the extent of Federal and/or State grants received in connection therewith.

Section 4. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the serial bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes is hereby delegated to the Director of the Office of Management and Budget, the chief fiscal officer. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said Director of the Office of Management and Budget, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 5. All other matters except as provided herein relating to the bonds herein authorized including the date, denominations, maturities and interest payment dates, within the limitations prescribed herein and the manner of execution of the same, including the consolidation with other issues, and also the ability to issue bonds with substantially level or declining annual debt service, shall be determined by the Director of the Office of Management and Budget, the chief fiscal officer of Broome County. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals, in addition to those required by Section 51.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the Director of the Office of Management & Budget shall determine consistent with the provision of the Local Finance Law.

Section 6. The faith and credit of said County of Broome, New York, are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest of such bonds as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds becoming due and payable in such year. There shall annually be levied on all the taxable real property of said County, a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same become due and payable.

Section 7. The validity of such bonds and bond anticipation notes may be contested only if:

- 1) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said County is not authorized to expend money, or
- 2) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with, and any action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or
- 3) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 8. This resolution shall constitute a statement of official intent for purposes of Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2. Other than as specified in this resolution, no monies are, or are reasonably expected to be, reserved, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside with respect to the permanent funding of the object or purpose described herein.

Section 9. This resolution, which takes effect upon its approval by the County Executive, shall be published in full in the Press & Sun Bulletin, which is the only newspaper having a general circulation in the County, together with a notice of the Clerk of the County Legislature in substantially the form provided in Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law.

Section 10. The Director of the Office of Management and Budget is hereby authorized to make a short term non-interest bearing interfund loan from the General Fund and other Enterprise Funds, Internal Service Funds, or Special Revenue Funds to provide sufficient cash to proceed with these Projects until the bonds authorized by this Resolution are sold.
