

WHEREAS, in accordance with Social Services Law § 141 Broome County's Department of Social Services is responsible to provide for the care, removal and burial of the bodies of indigent persons who die within Broome County, and

WHEREAS, this County Legislature, by Resolution 572 of 2006, established procedures and rates for indigent burials by the Department of Social Services, and

WHEREAS, this County Legislature, by Resolution 163 of 2011, transferred the administration of General Municipal Law § 148 Veterans' Burials to the Department of Social Services, and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate and necessary at this time to revise said rates, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that this County Legislature hereby authorizes the following rates and procedures, with an effective date of January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2025 at the following rates and conditions:

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The allowances in #1 will also apply for body donations of indigent individuals. This allowance will be paid to the funeral directors for their services involving arrangements for the body with transportation costs to the medical facility paid separately. Pre-registration with the donation facility is required.

- 4. In addition to the above allowances, an extra allowance up to \$300 will be allowed to cover expenses of an out of county funeral director who assists the local funeral home with a burial or cremation.
- 5. Full service burials and cremations will only be allowed for veterans who were honorably discharged from service and their spouses. A Defense Department Form 214 (DD214) is required to identify the veteran's condition of discharge.
- 6. All full service burials and cremations are to include the following: transfer of the remains within Broome County to the funeral home, embalming (as required), cosmetology, dressing and casketing, hairdressing, arrangements and supervision, minimum of one hour calling or visitation at the funeral home, funeral ceremony, livery (hearse or alternative funeral coach), acknowledgment cards and register book. Funeral services may be held at an appropriate venue other than the funeral home as determined by the deceased's family, with prior approval from Social Services.
- 7. In addition to the above allowances, out of County transportation costs shall be paid at \$3.00 per loaded mile. The maximum number of reimbursable miles shall be 100, unless the Department of Social Services determines that it would be more economical to reimburse for greater distance.
- 8. In addition to the above allowances, there shall be an allowance for the actual cost of a minimum cost casket, not to exceed \$600. If necessary and pre-approved by Social Services, an additional allowance shall be allowed for the actual cost of a minimum cost oversized casket.
- 9. In addition to the above allowances, \$50 to pay for additional help transferring remains, not to exceed \$200, will be allowed if pre-approved by Social Services and an oversized casket is necessary.
- 10. In addition to the above allowances, there shall be an allowance for all actual minimal cemetery and cremation costs and equipment for burials and cremations (when necessary) within Broome County, including, but not limited to the following: grave liner (when mandated by the cemetery), grave opening and closing, casket lowering, tent, cremation, allowance for a minimum cost grave plot available at the approved cemetery at which the burial takes place, plus winter storage if needed. DSS will not purchase grave plots or urns for cremains unless the Resource Consultant deems necessary or client funds are available. Burial Plot deeds or a statement from the cemetery indicating plot section and number are to be sent to the DSS Resource Consultant upon DSS payment.
- 11. In the case where no next of kin can be located, it will be the obligation of the funeral director to ensure that a free death notice for all indigent burials or cremations is published in the newspaper. The notice is to include the deceased individual's name, age, place of residence, day of death, and name of funeral home.

Services, there shall be credited to the burial, cremation or other related expenses, all assets of the indigent deceased individual, including but not limited to, benefits offered by Social Security, Veteran's Administration and any life insurance, up to the allowance authorized herein.

- 13. All burials/cremations and service herein to be paid for by the Department of Social Services shall be approved by the Department prior to the funeral arrangements. Documents requested by the Department to determine eligibility, including but not limited to the application, bank statements, and DD214, shall be submitted by the funeral home on behalf of the arranging party. If approval is needed on a weekend, approval can be obtained on the Monday after the actual weekend that approval should have been obtained, provided costs are kept within allowable limits. DSS will not pay overtime or weekend charges for burial services.
- 14. Before any allowance authorized herein is paid by the Department of Social Services, the funeral director making claims for such funds shall submit the "Itemization of Funeral Services and Merchandise Selected Form" and supporting documentation for all actual costs (casket invoice, vault invoice, cremation or cemetery receipts and any other expenses incurred) with 90 days from the Department's approval. A copy of the death certificate, at no additional cost, must accompany all billings. In addition, the provided Attestation of Burial Expenses must be completed and submitted to the department prior to any allowances paid. Said invoices to be in such a form as may be prescribed by the Broome County Comptroller and the NYS Department of Health.
- 15. The Funeral directors providing services paid by the Department of Social Services shall maintain accurate and detailed records of the services performed by it and/or its employees pursuant to this Resolution, reflecting the nature of the work performed, and to have such records available for six years after this Resolution's term for inspection and audit by appropriate representatives of Broome County, Broome County Department of Social Services (BCDSS) and/or the Broome County Comptroller, upon reasonable notice of said Departments. All services, billings and burial details are subject to audit by Broome County DSS. In addition, the funeral director shall perform the services authorized under this Resolution in a spirit of cooperation with BCDSS, and shall be available to entertain reasonable requests for information from appropriate BCDSS personnel, as well as other County Departments as may be designated by BCDSS.
- 16. When there is no next of kin, the Department of Social Services will provide certain identifying information, including but not limited to social security number and date of birth of the deceased, to the funeral home. This information is to be used solely for providing indigent burial services and the funeral home shall not re-disclose any of this confidential information.
- 17. Before any allowance authorized herein is paid by the Department of Social Services, the funeral director who is making a claim for such funds shall report any monies paid or to be paid from friends or relatives of said deceased indigent individual or from any other source whatsoever to the Department of Social Services, in order that such funds be applied toward any allowance granted herein. Any funds received by the funeral director, subsequent to the funeral, shall be reported and forwarded to BCDSS.







WHEREAS, the Broome County Handbook, the Broome County Policy and Procedure Manual, the Broome County Charter and Code and Resolution 451 of 1985 established County policies and procedures regulating business travel including authorization and reimbursement of expenses incurred, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary at this time to update the County's Travel Regulations, Policies and Procedures as shown on Exhibit "A", now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that this County Legislature hereby authorizes updating the County's Travel Regulations, Policies and Procedures as shown on Exhibit "A", and be it

## **Travel Regulations and Procedures**

<u>Purpose</u>. To establish County policies and procedures regulating business travel including its authorization, and reimbursement of expenses incurred.

<u>Scope</u>. Applies to all County officials, and employees, job applicants, and non-county individuals who incur expenses while traveling on County business.

Responsibility. The Department of Audit and Control through the audit of payment claims is responsible for determining that the expenses claimed are in compliance with the policies and procedures for reimbursement of travel expenses. The head of each administrative unit (department head) or a designee is responsible to review each claim for supporting documentation, its completeness, accuracy, and compliance with all requirements and to approve the claim as reimbursable from budgetary appropriations.

<u>Source/Contact</u>. The Department of Audit and Control. Employment contracts between the County of Broome and the bargaining units for County employees; <u>Broome County Employee</u>

<u>Handbook</u> Section 506-507; <u>Broome County Policy and Procedure Manual</u> Section 507-508, General Municipal Law, Article 5, Section 77-b; <u>The Broome County Charter and Code</u> Administrative Code, Sections 214, 215 and 302 (G) and Chapter 169; Broome County Legislative Resolution No. 451 (12/31/85), Amended by Resolution 188 (5/19/16); United States Census Bureau.

### Policy/Procedure.

- 1. The following general policies regulate all County business travel.
  - a. All requests, accounts or statements must be submitted on the applicable approved form and the claim approved by the department head or his designee and certified by the individual making the claim.
  - b. The mileage rate is determined by the appropriate employment contract or by Legislative action. Audit and Control will notify departments each year of the IRS mileage reimbursement rate.
  - c. The County assumes no responsibility for any tickets or citations issued to an employee operating either a County-owned or privately owned vehicle for official County business. Responsibility for payment remains with the individual charged with the violation.

2. The following policies, subject to the appropriate employment contract, regulate travel while conducting County business outside of Broome County:

#### a. Authorization to Travel

- 1) An electronic travel authorization request is required for every official, employee, job applicant, and non-County individual traveling outside of Broome County. Employees making in-County visits who must briefly travel across the County line to complete field work are an exception.
  - If the electronic travel authorization is unable to be completed an e-mail stating the date and time of the anticipated departure from and return to Broome County and appropriate approval may be substituted.
- 2) All employees traveling outside of Broome County must have authorization to do so even if they are passengers in a car and do not expect to have any reimbursable expenses.
- 3) Department heads cannot authorize their own individual travel and should receive Executive or Legislature approval according to their Department for such travel requests. Elected officials can approve their own and their staff's travel.
- 4) Department heads or a properly identified and approved designee can authorize employee business travel costing less than \$500 per employee. Designees should be emailed and on file with Audit and Control.
- 5) All travel costing more than \$500, except for separate elected officials' offices, must be submitted to the Executive or Legislature Office for approval.
- 6) Attendance at conventions or meetings of associations or organizations must be authorized and approved prior to such attendance. Any claim for reimbursement based on retroactive approval to attend may be disallowed.
- 7) When modes of transportation other than an automobile are authorized, the employee shall utilize "coach class." It is prohibited to accumulate "frequent flyer" miles on government business/travel and keep them for personal use when the expense was paid or reimbursed by Broome County.
- 8) All air travel by County employees and/or vendors using commercial airlines on County business at County expense shall utilize the Greater Binghamton Airport, if financially reasonable and logistically practical.

#### b. Mode of Travel

- 1) The authorizing official determines the most economical (in terms of cost and time) mode of travel.
- 2) Such determination is subject to the policy established for the use of County and personal vehicles for County business.
- c. Criteria and Guidelines for Approval of Travel Authorization Requests
  - 1) Business travel must be directly and precisely related to an employee's work responsibilities in Broome County government.
  - 2) The travel request must state a specific goal of demonstrative value to Broome County.
  - 3) Employees are encouraged to use technology (conference calls, webinars, etc.) to eliminate unnecessary travel.
  - 4) While the County recognizes the value of and encourages participation in non-governmental professional organizations, it, as a general rule, considers such participation a personal betterment which, should be financed by the individual rather than by the County as a membership expense. Exceptions to the County's policy to not sponsor professional organizations and finance attendance must demonstrate a direct purpose to County government which advances its interests.
- d. Criteria and Guidelines for Automobile Expense Reimbursement
  - 1) County-owned vehicles should be fully fueled using County fuel pumps before leaving the County. Fuel may be purchased for county-owned vehicles utilizing a travel card, only when access to the county fuel pumps is not possible.
  - 2) Emergency repair work will only be authorized for County vehicles while out of the County. In claiming reimbursement, an explanation of the reason for such repair is required.
  - 3) The mileage reimbursement is allowed to the vehicle owner only, regardless of the number of employees traveling in said automobile on the same trip.
  - 4) Any individual or employee traveling by an indirect route must assume any extra expense since reimbursement will be based only upon actual direct-route charges. This rule may be waived when the use of expressways or other

alternate routes, even though not the most direct route, will result in the reduction of travel time.

- 5) Except for incidental expenses such as tolls or parking, claims for expenses not specified on the original <u>Travel Authorization Request</u> or email must be approved by the authorizing official.
- 6) All individuals or County employees must claim their own expenses and personally sign the <u>Broome County Travel Expense Voucher</u> form when making claims. Employees may not pay expenses of other employees and claim such expenses on their form.

### e. Documents Required for Reimbursement

- All claims for reimbursement of expenses submitted by employees traveling outside of the County on authorized County business must be submitted on the <u>Broome County Travel Expense Voucher</u> together with the approved <u>Travel</u> <u>Authorization Request</u> or email and required receipts and/or explanations of the charges.
- 2) Vouchers submitted without the required receipts will be returned to the employee. If, in the opinion of the Comptroller, circumstances were such that receipts were not obtainable, the receipt requirement may be waived.
- 3) Vouchers must identify the start and end times of the event requiring the travel as well as the time of departure from and return to Broome County.

- If the mode of transportation is different than that authorized, the reason for the change must be given.
- If the receipt for any toll is not available, the toll gate or such bridge crossed must be identified.

### 2) Lodging: Itemized Hotel or Motel Bill

When possible, lodging should be booked at the "daily lodging rate" as published by the U.S. General Services Administration (GSA) Per Diem Rates.

If lodging is not available at the published daily lodging rate, the department head may authorizing lodging to a maximum rate of up to 300% of the published daily lodging rates for the location where lodging is obtained. Lodging greater than 300% requires approval by the County Executive, Chairman of the Legislature or other elected official.

GSA provides lodging rates by travel location and then month of travel. Below is an example of the daily lodging rate as if the employee was traveling to Binghamton.


- The absence of lodging charges while on an overnight trip should be explained.
- Room Tax is not an eligible expense in New York State since the County is tax exempt. Tax, however, will be allowed for out-of-State hotel expenses if the County's exemption certificate is rejected.
- When the spouse accompanies a County employee, the amount of room charges allowable will be computed on the basis of the ordinary single room charge allowable to a County employee unaccompanied by a spouse.

#### 3) Meals & Incidentals

Meals & Incidentals shall be paid in accordance with the published rates by the U.S. General Services Administration (GSA) Per Diem Rates for the destination zip code.

At the time of this publication GSA Per Diem Rates can be found here: <a href="https://www.gsa.gov/travel/plan-book/per-diem-rates">https://www.gsa.gov/travel/plan-book/per-diem-rates</a>.

GSA provides Meals & Incidentals (M&EI) by travel location. They then provide a breakdown for each meal, incidentals, first & last day of travel, etc. Below is an example of the M&EI rate as if the employee was traveling to Binghamton.



Please note: The total per diem amount for the first and last calendar day of travel is equivalent to 75% of the Meals and Incidentals total of the primary destination zip code.

<u>Notes:</u> Since the intent and purpose of the Resolution is to reimburse officers and employees for actual and necessary expenses the following conditions must be met:

• The total M&IE are the amounts which may be claimed unless meals were included in transportation service charges or in registration fees or conference fees, conventions, and similar events.

For example: If the employee is traveling to Binghamton (see sample above) and on day two of the trip, lunch is already included as part of a conference, \$16 would be subtracted from the \$64 M&IE total. The employee would be paid \$48 for day two of travel.

Note: If this was the first or last day of travel, the employee is paid 75% of the total M&EI. Using the example above, if it was the first or last day of travel the employee would be paid: \$36. (Take the M&IE total of \$64 subtract the \$16 for the prepaid lunch which equals \$48. 75% of \$48 is \$36).

- Meals are reimbursed on a per-diem basis with no receipts required except when a travel card is used. When a travel card is used, the exact amount subject to the maximum reimbursement rate is paid and employees are responsible for any charges over the maximum.
- For those meals reimbursed that do not require any overnight stay (day meals) they are taxable meals and are included in the employees taxable wages.
- No reimbursement will be made for alcoholic beverages.
- To claim the allowances, a meal must actually be purchased. The time of departure from Broome County must be before 7:00 a.m. to purchase breakfast and the time of arrival back in Broome County must be after 6:00 p.m. to purchase dinner. No claim will be processed without the departure and return times.
- A meal is not deemed necessary if the time actually needed to reach a destination at a scheduled hour is not consistent with the time criteria for claiming reimbursement. For example, a meeting or conference in Syracuse scheduled for 9:00 a.m. does not require departure before 7:00 a.m., or a dinner is not necessary when the event is over in time for the return to Broome County before 6:00 p.m. A lunch is not necessary (traveling time considered) when the day of departure is the day prior to the day of the meeting, conference, etc.
- 4) Registration: Receipt or similarly acceptable evidence of registration
- 5) Taxi/Ride Share Fares: Fare Receipt

#### Notes:

- The starting point and destination for taxi/ride share fares must be listed.
- If claiming such fares when an automobile is available, the reason must be given.

- 3. The following policies, subject to the appropriate employment contracts, apply to business travel within Broome County:
  - a. Criteria and Guidelines for Local Mileage Reimbursement
    - 1) Reimbursement to an employee for use of a privately owned vehicle for intra-County business must be authorized and approved by the administrative head or preferably by the supervisor most familiar with the individual's work assignments. Approving the reimbursement voucher represents such authorization and approval.
    - 2) All vehicles are eligible for use for reimbursement except motorcycles.
    - 3) No mileage reimbursement will be allowed for travel between residence and the post of duty except when specifically authorized by Federal or State Law, by regulations of the County Legislature, when an employee starts from his or her residence on official business, in which case this must be stated on the mileage claim, or when specifically authorized by union contract.
    - 4) Employees using their vehicles regularly should submit their claims monthly. Those who use their automobiles occasionally may submit their claims quarterly.
  - b. Documents Required for Reimbursement
    - 1) Mileage must be recorded on the <u>Broome County Claim for Mileage Expense</u> form to receive reimbursement. All business stops and the distances between them for local, inter-municipal mileage must be listed. Within any one municipality, all stops must be listed only if the intra-municipal distance traveled exceeds five miles. Otherwise, the mileage traveled can be recorded after the last stop within the municipality. The employee claiming reimbursement must also certify the forms by signing it and obtaining supervisor approval.
    - 2) Payment can be requested by submitting the <u>Broome County Claim for Mileage Expense</u> form which will be processed in the PeopleSoft system and will require the <u>PeopleSoft Electronic Transaction</u> form to be properly completed and approved.

### Notes:

It is advisable for employees to keep the <u>Broome County Claim for Mileage Expense</u> form in the vehicle to facilitate accurate, mileage recording after all stops as required.

#### c. Criteria and Guidelines for Attending Local Conferences

- 1) Attending conferences, meetings, or functions within Broome County requires approval of the department head if under \$500 and the approval of the County Executive or Chairman of the Legislature, except for separately elected official's offices, for department heads regardless of cost and for employees if the cost exceeds \$500.
- 2) If local mileage will be the single expense claimed, only the <u>Broome County</u> <u>Claim for Mileage Expense</u> form and the <u>PeopleSoft Electronic Transaction</u> must be completed to process for payment.

#### d. Criteria and Guidelines for Meals

- 1) Local Conferences and Functions: Meals obtained in Broome County while attending a conference or function are reimbursable if served as part of the conference or function and may be either a set price or by individual order from the menu. Set prices, as evidenced by a billing or registration, will be paid in full. Meals ordered from the menu are subject to the per-diem allowances.
- 2) Local Restaurants: In a limited number of situations, meals obtained in local restaurants may be reimbursable. When the County is a host to out-of-town officials, guests, or job applicants and an authorized County official determines that Broome County is obligated to pay for the meal, the County staff attending the meal may be reimbursed. The reimbursement is limited to the guest or guests and a reasonable number of County staff who are directly involved in the discussion of County business with the guest(s). However, if all individuals involved pay for their own meals, County staff may not claim reimbursement. When County staff attends a meal with local officials or guests, County staff may be reimbursed for the meal of the non-County individual if, in the opinion of the authorizing County official, payment for the meal is in the best interest of Broome County. County staff may not be reimbursed for their own meals.

### e. Documents Required for Local Meal Reimbursement

1) The <u>PeopleSoft Electronic Transaction</u> must be properly supported by listing the individuals at the meal, the purpose of the meeting and where it was served. Claims must be approved by the County Executive, Chairman of the Legislature or other elected official prior to the submission for audit and payment.
