On January 4, 2018, the Oneida Indian Nation (the "Nation") received an email and documentation from the Division of Historic Preservation of the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation (OPRHP) concerning the Otsiningo Park State project (the "Project") located in the Town of Dickinson, Broome County, New York.

The Nation has reviewed the archaeological study *Phase 1 Archaeological Survey, Otsiningo Park Stage Project, Town of Dickinson, Broome County, New York* from the Public Archaeological Facility (PAF). The Nation concurs with PAF's recommendation that the site identified during this study, the Otsiningo Stage Site (00760.000068), is eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places.

The Nation advocates for avoidance over mitigation of historic properties that may be related to the activities of Oneida ancestors. If avoidance is not feasible, the Nation requests the opportunity to review and comments on the scope of work for any additional archaeological study of the Otsiningo Stage Site.

As planning for the project progresses, the Nation requests continued consultation before making any decisions or determinations in the Section 106 process concerning the Project's APE, level of effort to identify historic properties, presence or absence of historic properties, National Register of Historic Places eligibility, findings of no effect or adverse effect and measures to address or resolve adverse effects.



#### Introduction:

The purpose of this service agreement is to define the service expectations for maintenance and support for the *Town of Vestal*. This service agreement is intended to document the understanding between the *Town of Vestal* and Broome County IT regarding the type and level of services that the Broome County Division of Information Technology will provide.

#### Summary of Services:

Broome County IT will provide maintenance and support for the following services according to the responsibilities, performance measurements and costs listed in the attached catalog of services.

#### *Terms of Agreement:*

This service agreement is for minimum of two (2) years, starting January 1, 2018 (or upon this agreement being signed by both parties) and ending December 31, 2019. This agreement may be renewed at the end of this term by agreement of both the *Town of Vestal* and Broome County IT.

In cases of disasters due to the "acts of god" or other *Town of Vestal* system or equipment failure, Broome County IT is not financially responsible for the replacement of components or time and materials associated with this agreement.

All changes to this agreement must be authorized in writing by both the Town of Vestal and Broome County IT.

If Broome County IT or The Town of Vestal finds it necessary to alter this agreement due to a change in network and/or Internet connectivity, it will notify the other party of the proposed change ninety (90) days in advance.

#### **Responsibilities:**

#### **Broome County IT:**

1. Will make every effort to maintain, support and provide access to the systems listed under the attached catalog of services for *Town of Vestal*.

#### Town of Vestal:

- 1. Provide Broome County IT telephone and e-mail contact information with a representative of the *Town of Vestal or their agent*. This person must be available to work with Broome County IT when necessary to help resolve any issues.
- 2. Users and those with access to the County Network and Systems shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws.
- *3.* Anyone with access to the County Network and Systems shall also comply with the Broome County IT Security policy.
- 4. Only supported/approved hardware and software will be used.

#### **Performance Measurements:**

#### Support and Maintenance:

Broome County IT will respond within one (1) business day to all problems associated with the services provided and will schedule a time to fix the problem based on its severity and impact to daily functions. Broome County IT will provide Helpdesk support at (607) 778-2483 from 8:00am to 5:00pm Monday through Friday, excluding holidays.

- Support outside normal maintenance as described in the attached Catalog of Services may be billed at \$50.00/hour.
- Windows 7 and 10 are the only supported desktop/laptop operating systems at this time.
- Failure to provide supported/approved hardware/software or tampering with County supported or provided hardware/software will void the SLA portion of this agreement and any support offered will be "best effort" only.
- Email support is limited to webmail. We cannot support desktop applications, so although we will help with instructions for use of outlook with exchange email, it is the responsibility of Vestal IT to support the desktop.

#### Indemnification:

The Town of Vestal and County each agree as follows:

- 1. The Town of Vestal shall not be liable or financially responsible, in any way, for County hardware, software, peripherals, equipment, supplies, etc. located at County sites.
- 2. Likewise, the County shall not be liable or financially responsible, in any way for Town of Vestal hardware, software, peripheries, equipment, supplies, etc. located at Town of Vestal sites.
- 3. The Town of Vestal shall defend, indemnify, and save and hold harmless the County and any of its officers, agents, and employees from and against any and all losses, claims, damages, costs, judgments, lawsuits, expenses, risks of loss or liability of whatever nature arising out of injuries to persons or property of whatever kind or nature as a result of negligence on the part of the Town of Vestal as the County provides services pursuant to this agreement.
- 4.
