

- Working to provide situational awareness, logistics management, and support Health Department when needed.

- Stood up mobile testing site
- Converted BC Transit Bus to be a laboratory
- Completed hundreds of tests

 - Monday Friday 1p 7p




Mobile Testing

- •Abbot ID Now 15-minute rapid tests
- •8 machines on bus
- •13 being pushed into the community

Health Department

- ❖ Positive cases have taken a dramatic increase we had been steadily around 50 active cases and now at 540 active cases.
- ❖ 2300 people are in quarantine in Broome County
 - ❖Staff from other County Departments reassigned and assisting
 - ❖NYS DOH staff assisting



Governor Cuomo's New Cluster Action Initiative

Yellow Zone - Precautionary Zone

- House of Worship 50 percent capacity
- Mass Gatherings: 25 people maximum, indoor and outdoor
- Businesses: Open
- Dining: Indoor and outdoor dining, 4 person max per table
- Schools: Open with mandatory weekly testing of student and teachers/staff for in-person settings. The NYSDOH will establish a percentage pf teachers/staff who need to be tested by Friday 10/9.
