RESOLUTION ADOPTING LOCAL LAW INTRO. NO. 2 OF 2017, ENTITLED: "A LOCAL LAW OF THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF BROOME REPEALING THE WIRELESS COMMUNICATIONS SURCHARGE AUTHORIZED BY ARTICLE SIX OF THE COUNTY LAW OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK; AND IMPOSING THE WIRELESS COMMUNICATIONS SURCHARGES PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY OF TAX LAW § 186g."

WHEREAS, the Wireless Communications Surcharge has hitherto only been applied to providers of contractual wireless communication plans and coverage, and

WHEREAS, New York State authorized counties to impose a surcharge on the retail sale of Prepaid Wireless Communications to help facilitate and maintain 911 Emergency Services, and

WHEREAS, the Prepaid Wireless Communications Surcharge will offset system costs, eligible wireless 911 service costs, or other costs associated with the administration, design, installation, construction, operation, or maintenance of public safety communications networks or a system to provide enhanced wireless 911 service to maintain and facilitate functional 911 Emergency Services throughout Broome County, and

WHEREAS, in the interest of fairness and to help provide the necessary services including, but not limited to, those mentioned above and to facilitate 911 Emergency Services throughout the County, in accordance with recent amendments to New York State guidelines, this Broome County Legislature authorizes the existing Wireless Communications Surcharge be applied to Prepaid Wireless Service Providers, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that Local Law Intro. No. 2 of 2017, entitled: ""A Local Law Of The County Legislature Of The County Of Broome Repealing The Wireless Communications Surcharge Authorized By Article Six Of The County Law Of The State Of New York; And Imposing The Wireless Communications Surcharges Pursuant To The Authority Of Tax Law § 186-G." be and the same hereby is adopted and approved in accordance with the Broome County Charter and Administrative Code and all the applicable statutes and laws pertaining thereto.

"A LOCAL LAW OF THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF BROOME REPEALING THE WIRELESS COMMINICATIONS SURCHARGE AUTHORIZED BY ARTICLE SIX OF THE COUNTY LAW OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK; AND IMPOSING THE WIRELESS COMMUNICATIONS SURCHARGES PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY OF TAX LAW § 186-g."

Be it enacted by the County Legislature of the County of Broome as follows:

SECTION 1. A Local Law Imposing a Local Surcharge for an Enhanced Emergency Telephone System, authorized by Local Law No. 11 of 1989, as amended, is hereby repealed.

SECTION 2. Imposition of wireless communications surcharges.

(a) Pursuant to the authority of Tax Law § 186-g, there are hereby imposed and there shall be paid surcharges within the territorial limits of the County of Broome on: (i) wireless communications service provided to a wireless communications customer with a place of primary use within such County, at the rate of thirty cents per month on each wireless communications device in service during any part of the month; and (ii) the retail sale of prepaid wireless communications service sold within such County, at the rate of thirty cents per retail sale, whether or not any tangible personal property is sold therewith.

(b) Wireless communications service suppliers shall begin to add such surcharge to the billings of its customers and prepaid wireless communications sellers shall begin to collect such surcharge from its customers commencing December 1, 2017.

(c) Each wireless communications service supplier and prepaid wireless communications seller is entitled to retain, as an administrative fee, an amount equal to three percent of its collections of the surcharges imposed by this Local Law, provided that the supplier or seller files any required return and remits the surcharges due to the New York State Commissioner of Taxation and Finance on or before its due date.

SECTION 3. Administration of surcharges. The surcharges imposed by this Local Law shall be administered and collected by the New York State Commissioner of Taxation and Finance as provided in paragraph (8) of Tax Law § 186-g, and in a like manner as the taxes imposed by Articles Twenty-eight and Twenty-nine of the Tax Law.

SECTION 4. Applicability of State law to surcharges imposed by this Local Law. All the provisions of Tax Law § 186-g shall apply to the surcharges imposed by this Local Law with the same force and effect as if those provisions had been set forth in full in this Local Law, except to the extent that any of those provisions is either inconsistent with or not relevant to the surcharges imposed by this Local Law.

SECTION 5. Net collections received by this County from the surcharges imposed by this Local Law shall be expended only upon authorization of the County Legislature of the County of Broome and only for payment of system costs, eligible wireless 911 service costs, or other costs associated with the administration, design, installation, construction, operation, or maintenance of public safety communications networks or a system to provide enhanced wireless 911 service serving such County, as provided in paragraph (9) of Tax Law § 186-g, including, but not limited to, hardware, software, consultants, financing and other acquisition costs. The County shall separately account for and keep adequate books and records of the amount and object or purpose of all expenditures of all such monies. If, at the end of any fiscal year, the total amount of all such monies exceeds the amount necessary for payment of the above mentioned costs in such fiscal year, such excess shall be reserved and carried over for the payment of those costs in the following fiscal year.

SECTION 6. Effective date. This Local Law shall take effect December 1, 2017.

WHEREAS, the "Community Heroes Protection Act", introduced by Senator Frederick J. Akshar II would classify all offenses against first responders such as law enforcement officers, firefighters, and emergency services personnel as hate crimes if they are intentionally aimed at first responders based on the profile of their career, now, therefore be it

WHEREAS, in recent years throughout Broome County, New York State, and across the United States, there has been a significant rise in the use and addiction to heroin and other opioid drugs, and

WHEREAS, this increased use has occurred in all communities; urban, suburban, and rural, regardless of demographics, including race, gender, age, and income, and

WHEREAS, according to the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), the strongest risk factor for heroin use is the misuse of prescription opioids and that nearly all individuals who use heroin also use and/or misuse other substances, and

WHEREAS, under current New York State Law, medical insurance companies are required to provide at least 60 days of outpatient visits per year to treat substance use disorders and are required to provide inpatient substance use disorder treatment, including detoxification and rehabilitation, with the number of days of inpatient care determined by each individual plan, which varies from plan to plan, and

WHEREAS, according to the National Institute on Drug Abuse, the length of treatment has a direct effect on the rate of recidivism and/or recovery, and treatment of less than 90 days has little to no effect on truly helping those in rehabilitation, and

WHEREAS, legislation has been introduced by Senator Patricia A. Ritchie and Assemblyman Albert A. Stirpe, Jr., and is co-sponsored by Senator Frederick J. Akshar II, and Assemblymembers Clifford W. Crouch and Donna A. Lupardo, which would require insurance companies to provide at least 90 days of inpatient rehabilitation services to insured individuals who obtain a doctor's prescription, now, therefore be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that this County Legislature applauds the introduction and urges the passage of Senate Bill S.2009 and companion Assembly Bill A.492 by the New York State Legislature and signing into law by the New York State Governor, and be it
