

RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE FOLLOWING SECTION 504 POLICIES AND GRIEVANCE PROCEDURES FOR BROOME COUNTY

SECTION 504 RESOLUTION/BROOME COUNTY

WHEREAS, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability in programs and activities conducted by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) or by grantees that receive financial assistance from HUD, and

WHEREAS, Part 8 of Title 24 of the Code of Federal Regulations (24 CFR) requires adoption of grievance procedures to address complaints of those who feel they may have been discriminated against on the basis of disability and also requires the provision of notice of said grievance procedures, and

WHEREAS, it is the policy of Broome County not to discriminate against any individual, person, or group on the basis of disability and it is the intent of Broome County to address any complaints that may arise pursuant to Section 504, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED that Broome County does hereby adopt by resolution internal grievance procedures (the "Procedure") providing for the prompt and equitable resolution of complaints alleging any action prohibited by Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services regulations implementing the Act, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that Broome County does hereby designate the Personnel Officer, Thomas Behan, as the Grievance Coordinator who shall be responsible for receiving and addressing complaints pursuant to the Procedure adopted hereby and attached hereto, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that Broome County will place its employees, the public, and potential beneficiaries of certain federal public programs on notice by undertaking certain actions that will include, but may not be limited to (1) providing a copy of the grievance procedure to its employees, (2) putting the public on notice by placing a notice in the county's official newspaper, posting of notices in the county's offices and facilities, placing notices in the county's publications, and/or distribution of memoranda or other written communications subsequent to adoption of this Procedure, (3) placing copies of the Procedure in the Personnel Department, 3rd Floor, Broome County Office Building, 60 Hawley Street, Binghamton, New York for review and dissemination, and (4) adding language to federal program brochures to insure all potential program beneficiaries are aware of Broome County's adopted grievance procedures. **BACKGROUND**: Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (the "Act") as amended prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability in programs and activities conducted by HUD or that receive financial assistance from HUD. This includes the New York State Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) Program funded by HUD, administered by the Governor's Office of Storm Recovery (GOSR), and under which Broome County has received financial assistance. The Act specifically provides that no qualified individual shall, solely by reason of his or her handicap, be excluded from program participation, including employment, be denied program benefits, or be subjected to discrimination. The Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA) established provisions for assuring equality of opportunity, full participation, independent living, and self-sufficiency of disabled persons relative to employment, benefits and services, accommodations, commercial facilities, and multi-family housing.

SECTION 504 POLICY/COMPLIANCE: Part 8 of Title 24 of the Code of Federal Regulations (24 CFR) requires the adoption and notice/publication of ADA grievance procedures for municipalities with 15 or more employees, Sections 8.53 and 8.54, respectively. Therefore, be it known that it is the policy of Broome County not to discriminate on the basis of disability. Towards that end, Broome County has adopted by resolution an internal grievance procedure providing for prompt and equitable resolution of complaints alleging any action prohibited by Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. 794) of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services regulations implementing the Act. The subject law and implementing regulations may be examined in the Personnel Department, 3rd Floor, Broome County Office Building, 60 Hawley Street, Binghamton, New York. The Personnel Officer for Broome County has been designated to coordinate the efforts of Broome County with respect to Section 504 compliance. This information can also be accessed on the Internet at the following address: http://portal.hud.gov/hudportal/HUD?src=/program_offices/fair_housing_equal_opp/dis abilities/sect504. The Personnel Department is located at 60 Hawley St, Binghamton, New York. The Section 504 Coordinator can be reached at 607-778-3887.

GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE: Any person who believes he or she has been subjected to discrimination on the basis of disability may file a grievance under the procedure adopted by Broome County as outlined below.

- Grievances must be submitted to the Section 504 Coordinator within 60 days of the date the person filing the grievance becomes aware of the alleged discriminatory action.
- A complaint must be in writing, containing the name and address of the person filing it. The complaint must state the problem or action alleged to be discriminatory and the remedy or relief sought.
- The Section 504 Coordinator (or her/his designee) shall conduct an investigation of the complaint. This investigation may be informal, but it must be thorough, affording all interested persons an opportunity to submit evidence relevant to the complaint. The Section 504 Coordinator will maintain the files and records of the Broome County relating to such grievances.
- The Section 504 Coordinator will issue a written decision on the grievance no later than 30 days after its filing.
- The person filing the grievance may appeal the decision of the Section 504 Coordinator by writing to Broome County's Legislature within 15 days of receiving the Section 504 Coordinator's decision. The County Legislature shall issue a written decision in response to the appeal no later than 30 days after its filing.

• The availability and use of this grievance procedure does not prevent a person from filing a complaint of discrimination on the basis of disability with the U. S. Department of Health and Human Services, Office for Civil Rights.

Broome County will make appropriate arrangements to ensure that disabled persons are provided accommodations, if needed, to participate in this grievance process. Such arrangements may include, but are not limited to, providing interpreters for the deaf, providing taped cassettes of material for the blind, or assuring a barrier-free location for the proceedings. The Section 504 Coordinator will be responsible for such arrangements.

It is against the law for Broome County to retaliate against anyone who files a grievance or cooperates in the investigation of a grievance.

The design change of lowering Cell 4 by 15 feet will bring its base to a similar level as Cells 1 - 3, while still allowing the gravitational flow of leachate past the existing Cells. Increasing air space in this manner extends the life of the landfill and generates additional revenue, which supports the goals and mission of the Division of Solid Waste Management.

A LOCAL LAW AMENDING CHAPTER 89 OF THE BROOME COUNTY CHARTER AND CODE REGARDING THE SALE OF COUNTY PROPERTY TO A MUNICIPALITY OR QUASI-GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY LOCATED WITHIN BROOME COUNTY

BE IT ENACTED, by the County Legislature of the County of Broome as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 89 of the Broome County Charter and Code is amended to add a new Section 89-6 to read as follows:

§89-6 Sale of County Property to a municipality or quasi-governmental entity located within Broome County.

a) Definitions.

1) Municipality – A Town, Village, City or School District.

2) Quasi-governmental entity – An Industrial Development Agency governed by the provisions of Article 18 of the General Municipal Law, a Local Development Corporation under Article 14 of the Not for Profit Corporation Law or a Land Bank governed by Article 16 of the Not for Profit Corporation Law.

b) 1) Any property acquired by the County pursuant to Article 11 of the Real Property Tax Law, which is being sold to a municipality or quasi-governmental entity located within Broome County for demolition by the municipality or quasi-governmental entity, shall be sold for a price not to exceed one year's unpaid taxes or one year's administrative fees.

2) Any property purchased pursuant to (b)(1) by a municipality or quasigovernmental entity for demolition shall not be liable for tipping fees at the Broome County Landfill for disposal of demolition debris.

SECTION 2. This Local Law shall take effect upon filing with the Secretary of State.
