

- Town Of Dickinson makes up roughly **2.56%** of the total Population


Countywide Calls For Service 2022-2025












Total Calls By Priority Last 4 Years




County Wide Tickets By Year





















Part One Vs Part Two Through The Years





Civil Evictions By Year – Town Of Dickinson

- Civil Evictions can be caused by several things and are not always crime related; However, Generally Speaking Evictions are a quality of life, and Standard of living issue for the residents, and property owners alike.



Notable Case 2024

On January 16, 2024, the Broome County Special Investigations Unit Task Force executed a search warrant at 373 Prospect St., 2nd floor apartment, in the Town of Dickinson. The target of the search warrant was Andrew M. Fuller, who was present during the execution of the warrant. Also present was Betty Hobbs. During the search, the following items of evidence were located:

- Various knotted wraps and packages containing Methamphetamine. A Total of approximately 7 Ounces of Methamphetamine.
- 118 Suboxone sublingual films
- Approximately 800 Alprazolam pills, a Schedule IV controlled substance
- Approximately 100 M/30 Oxycodone pills, a Schedule IV controlled Substance
- 21 Clonazepam pills, a Schedule IV controlled Substance
- 4 Buprenorphine pills, a Schedule III controlled substance
- 2 MDMA Ecstasy pills
- .7 grams of cocaine
- Scale and baggies used to package narcotics for distribution

Notable Case 2024

A fugitive wanted for murder in Georgia was arrested yesterday by the Broome County Sheriff's Office Warrants Division. Late last week, members of the Broome County Sheriff's received information that Dawensley Astrel, age 21 of Binghamton, had an active arrest warrant out of the state of Georgia for Murder.

Information obtained determined he was in the Binghamton area and attending Broome Community College, where he was enrolled as a student.

The BCSO team coordinated with SUNY Broome Campus Safety to take Astrel into custody

without incident while he was on campus on Monday, September 16, 2024.

Astrel will be extradited by law enforcement from Georgia to answer for his charges.

Notable Case 2025

On September 9, 2025, the CIU, acting on intelligence regarding possible contraband, entered one of the male housing units and conducted a search within the living quarters of Robert J. Swartz, age 48 of Binghamton, NY, who was recently arrested by City of Binghamton Police in and charged with Burglary in the 1st Degree. During the search, multiple dangerous items and instruments were recovered, and following the investigation, Robert J. Swartz was charged with:

- Six (6) Counts of Promoting Prison Contraband in the 1st Degree, a Class D Felony
- Five (5) Counts of Criminal Possession of a Weapon in the 3rd Degree, a Class D Felony
- Two (2) Counts of Tampering with Physical Evidence, a Class E Felony
- Criminal Mischief in the 3rd Degree, a Class E Felony
- Two (2) Counts of Promoting Prison Contraband in the 2nd Degree, a Class A Misdemeanor
- Obstruction of Governmental Administration in the 2nd Degree, a Class A Misdemeanor

Earl Went Home.

- Thanks to a group effort from the Broome County Sheriff's Office and the Broome County Department of Social Services, a homeless man living in a bus stop for months has finally returned home to his family in Ohio.
- Over the past several months, Earl Sutton has been living at the bus stop shelter near the intersection of Upper Front Street and Old Front Street in the Town of Dickinson.
