S

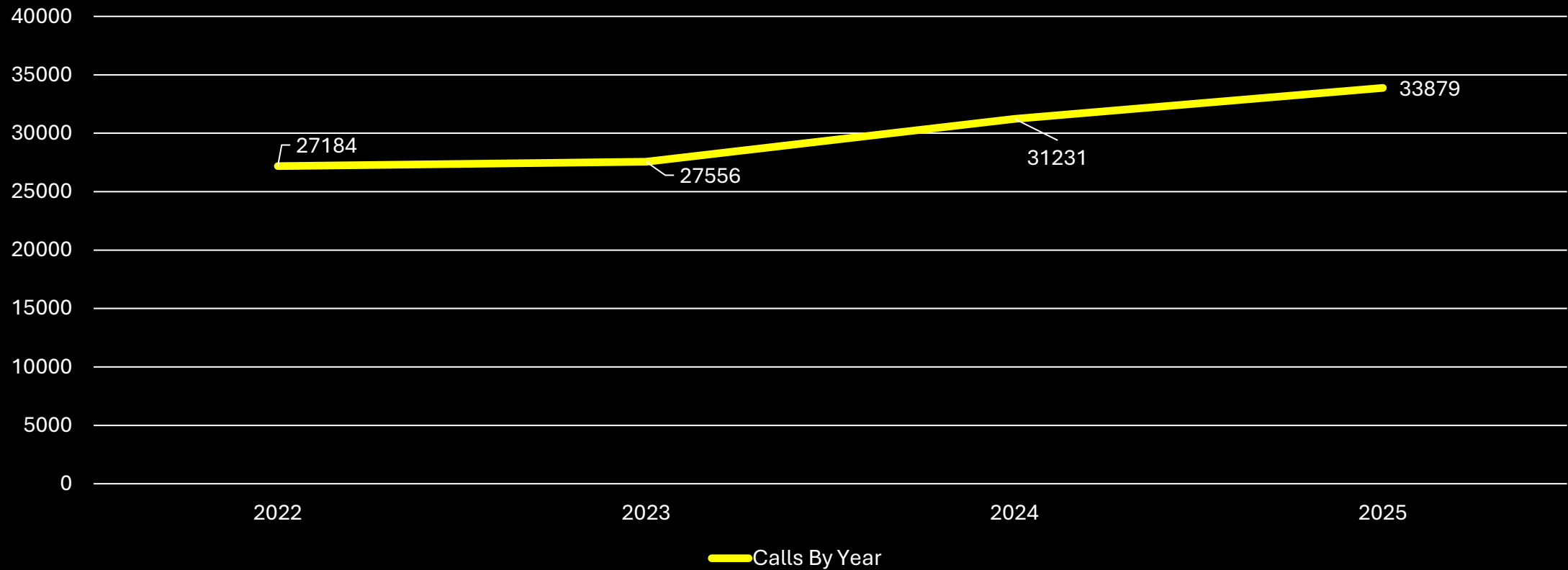

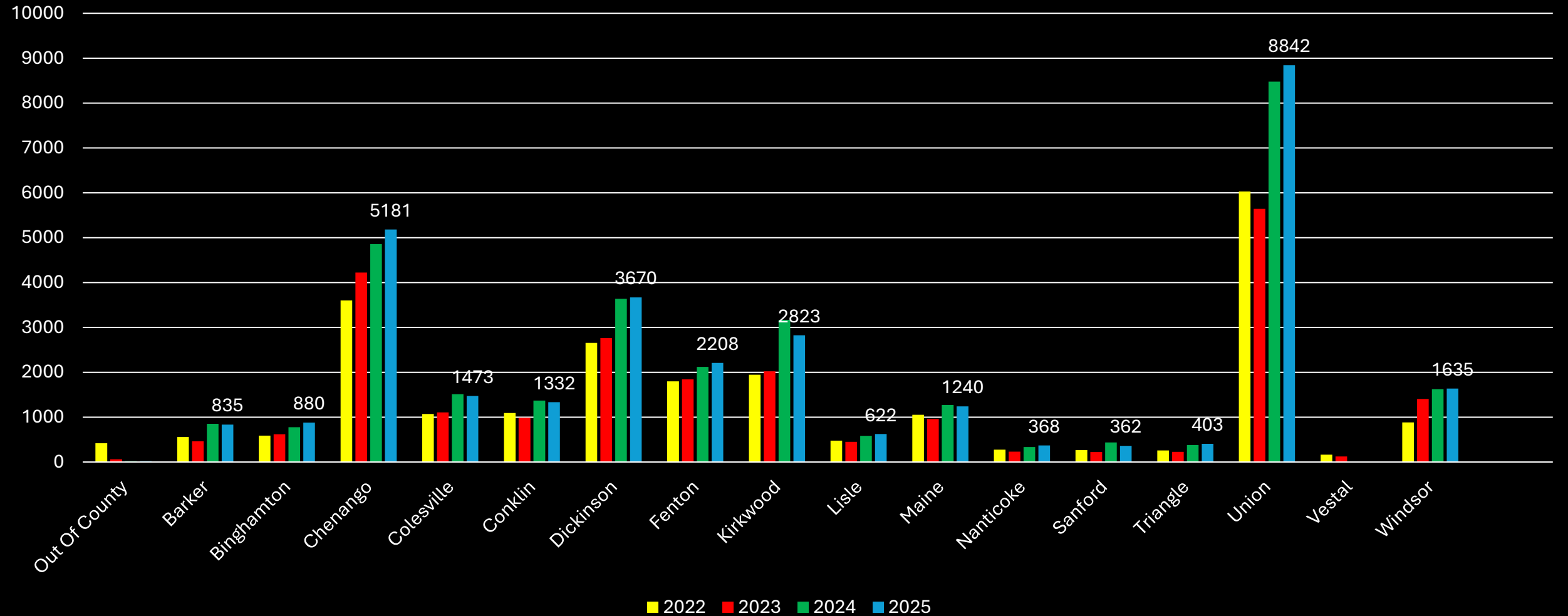
Countywide Calls For Service 2022-2025

Calls By Year



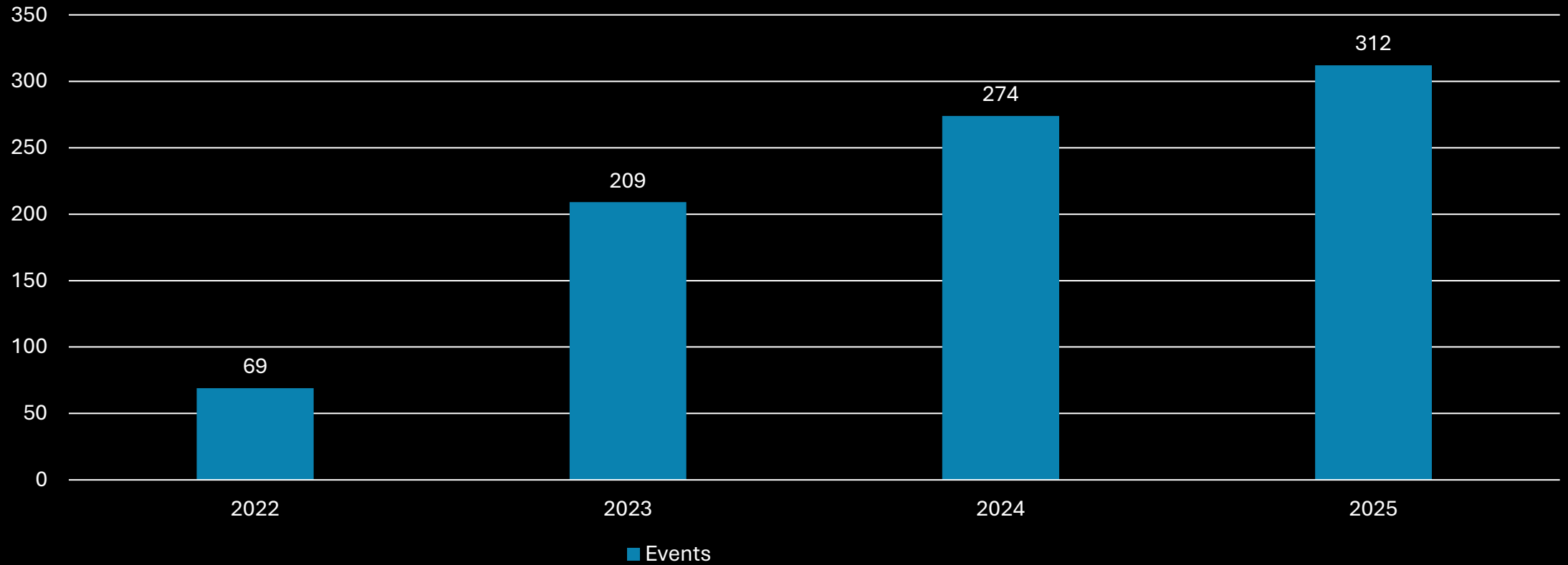
Calls By Jurisdiction By year

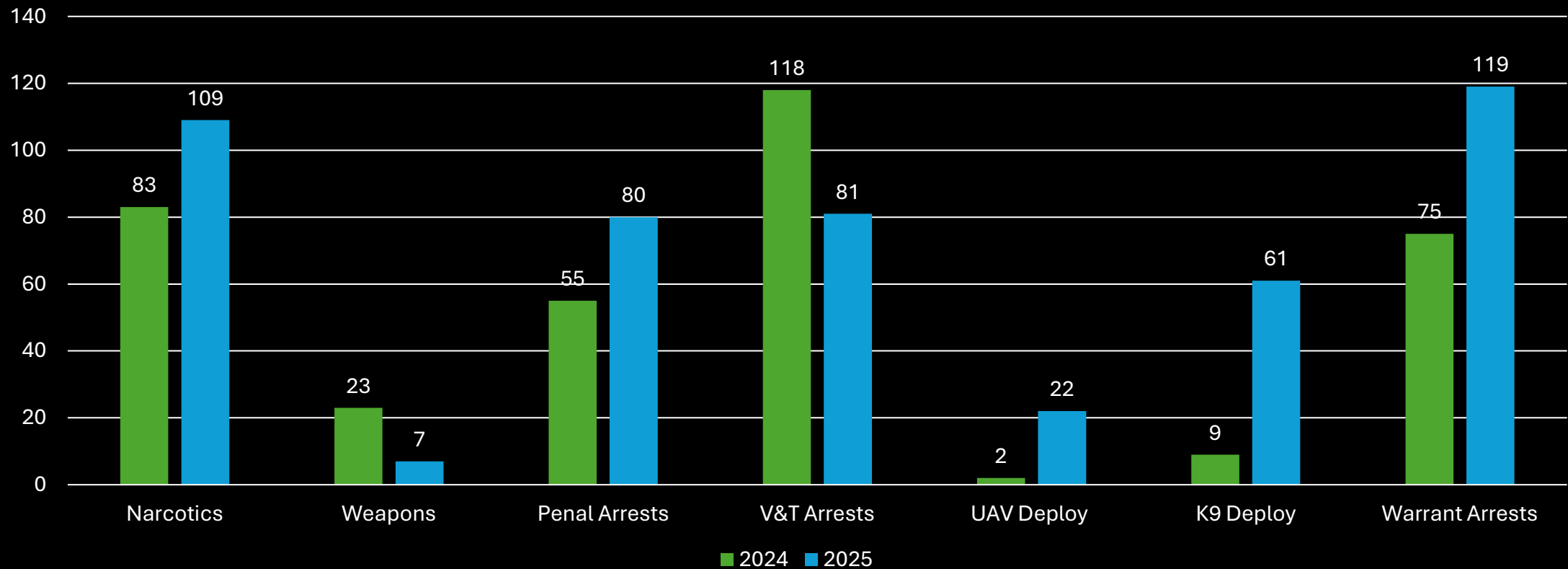
STRATEGIC RESPONSE GROUP (SRG)

- Targeting traffic complaints, gun violence, narcotics trafficking and recurring community problems that require critical analysis, time, and problem solving to effectively mitigate
- Utilizes “hot-spot” mapping, community feedback, and advanced tools and techniques.

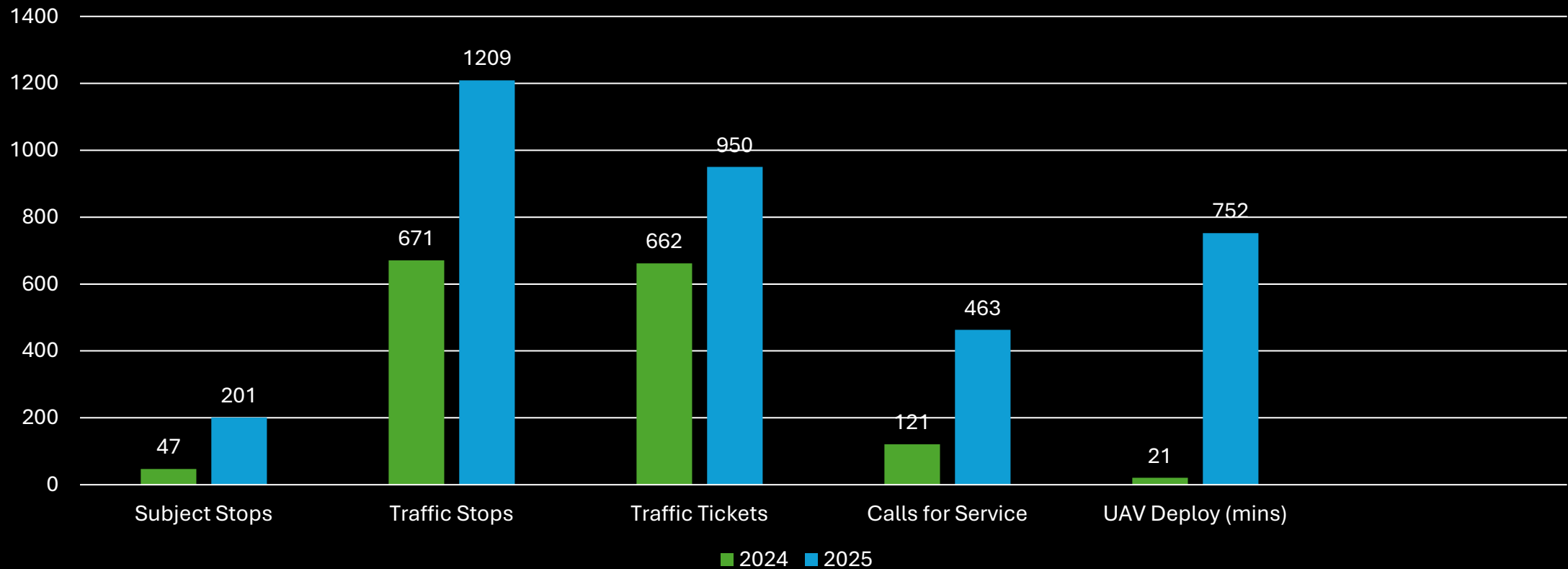

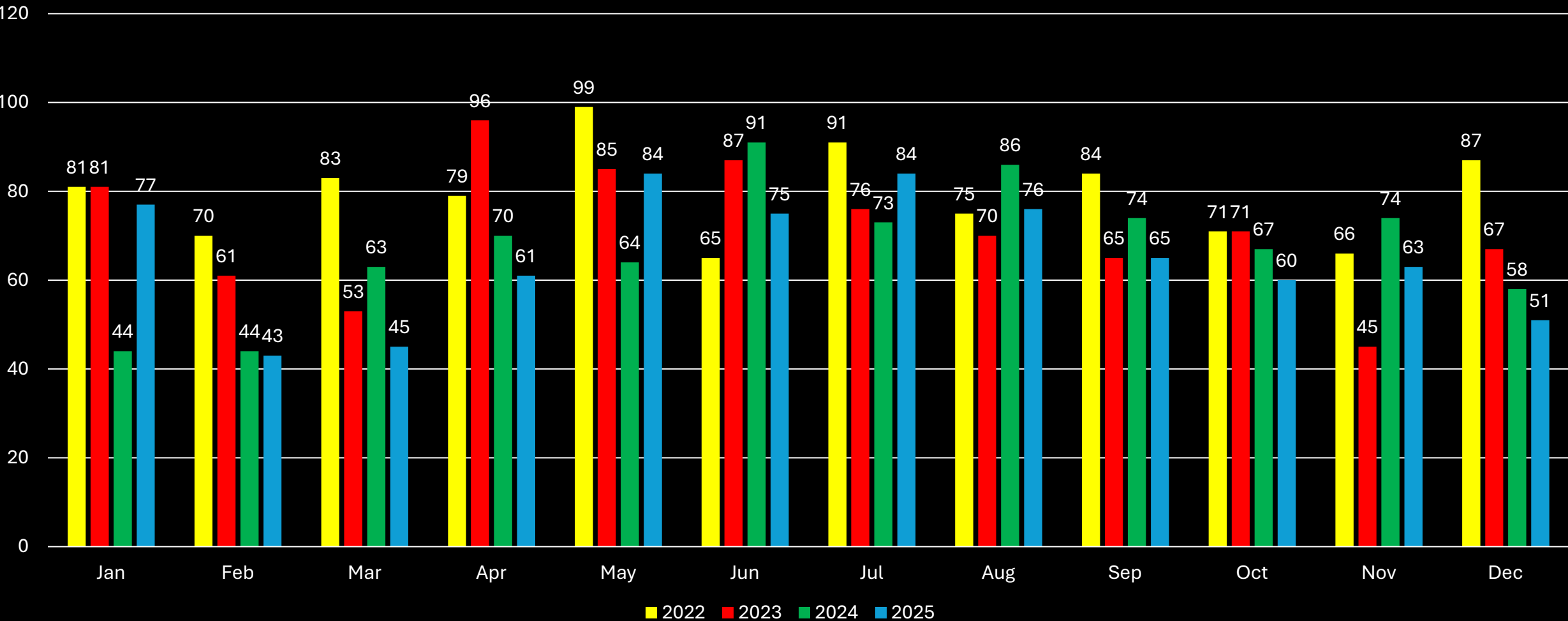

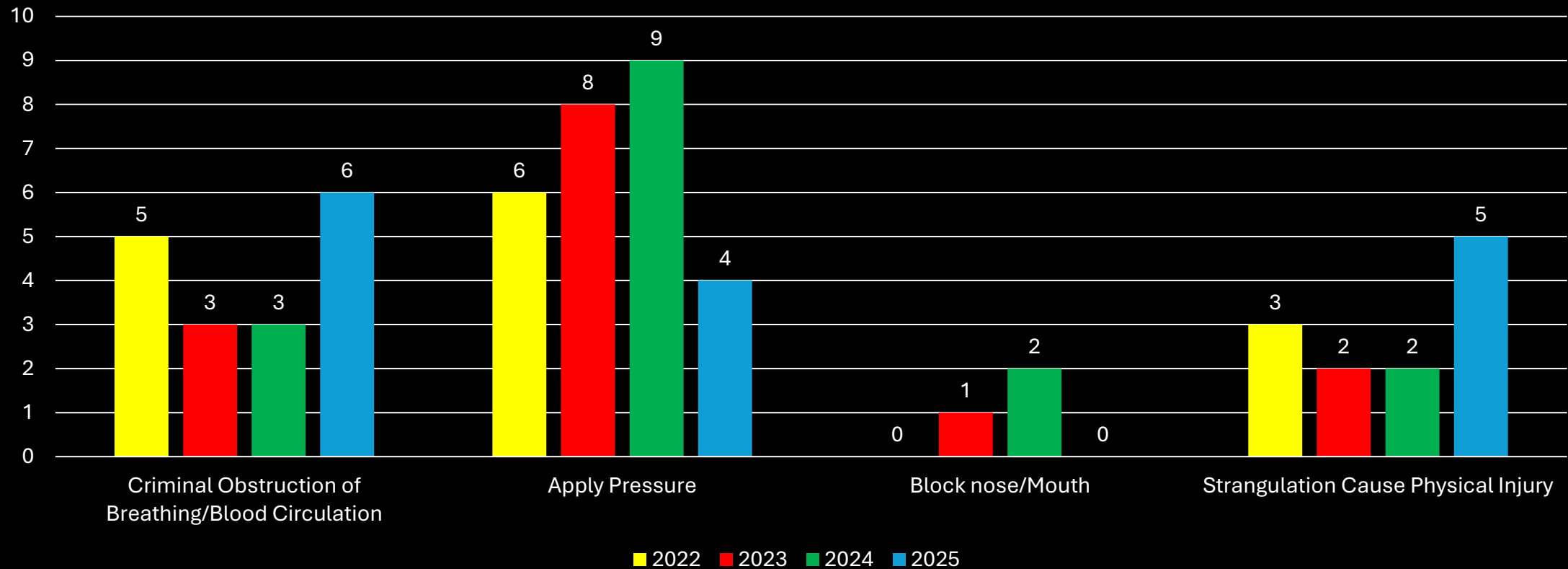
Domestic Related Incidents

4 Year Comparison Of Incidents By Month

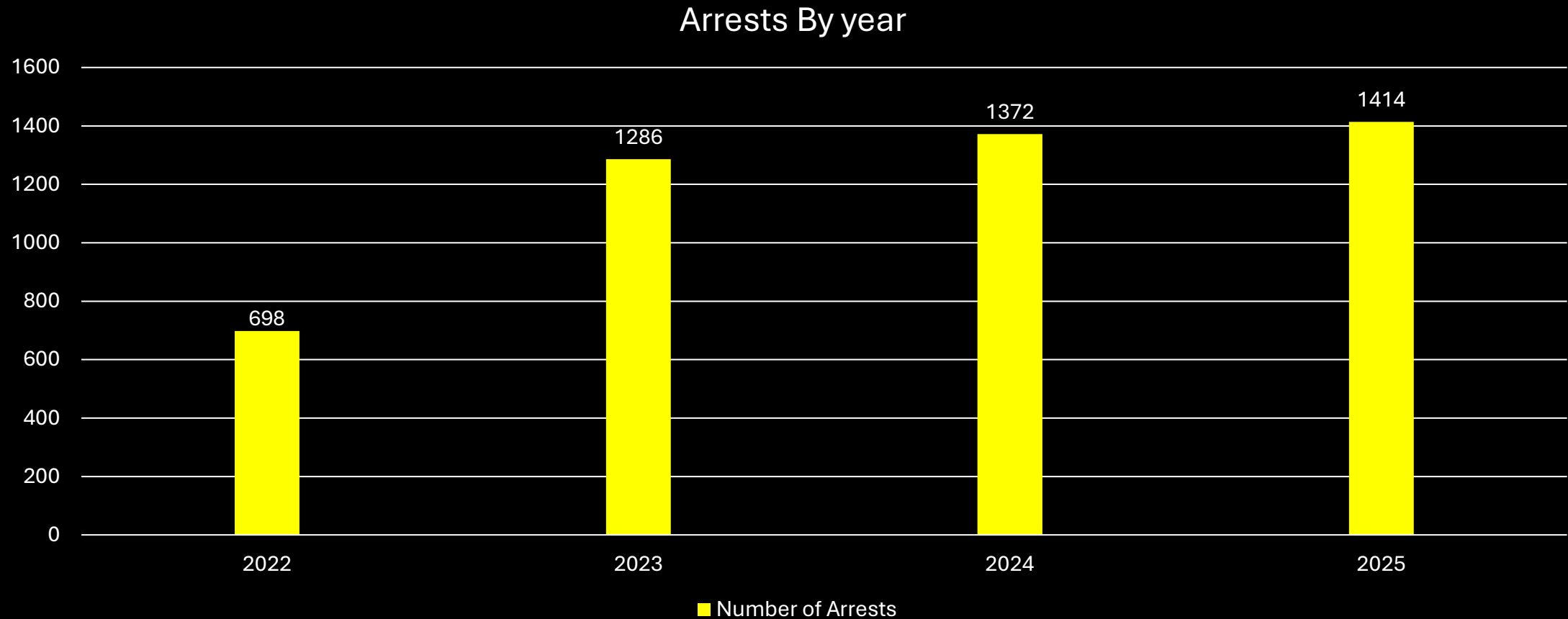


Domestic Related Arrests

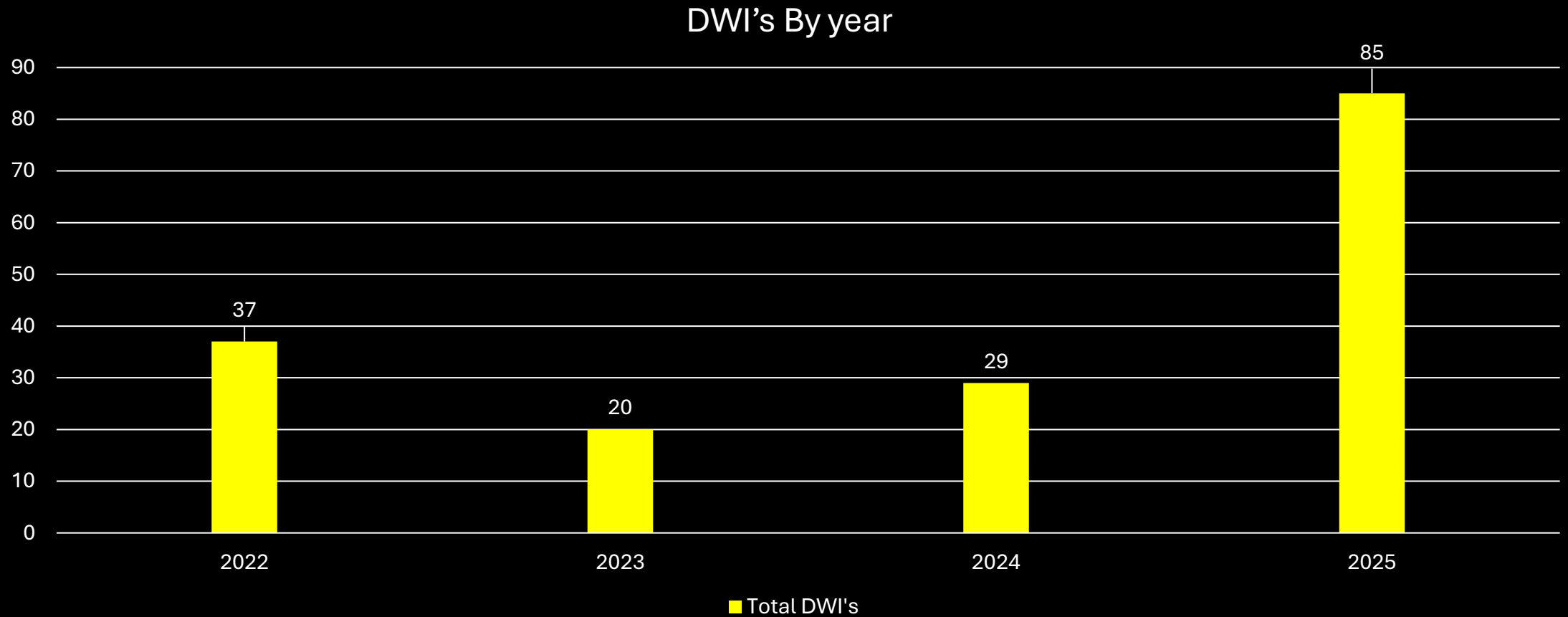
Criminal Obstruction Of Breathing & Strangulation



Total Arrests By Year

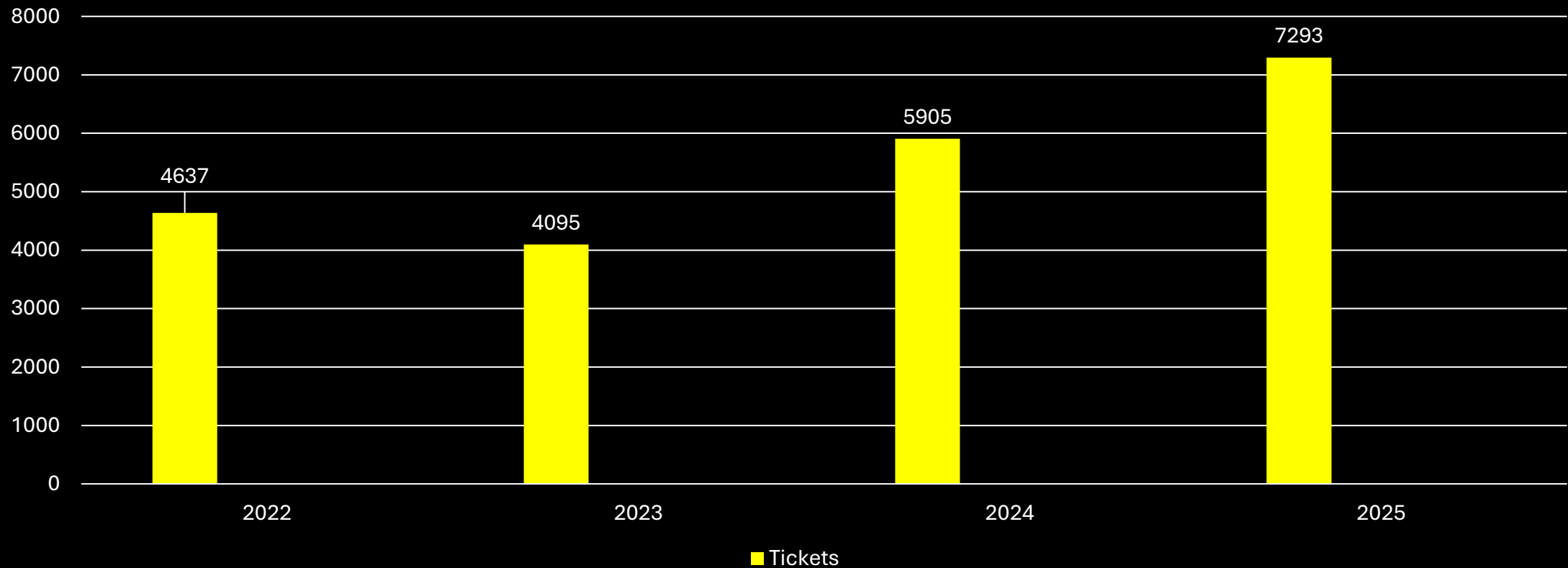


DWI's Countywide By Year

Total Tickets Written

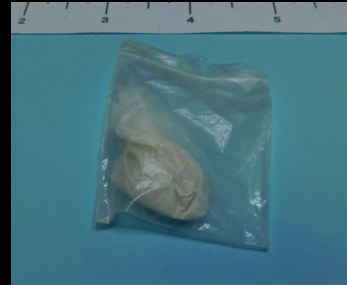

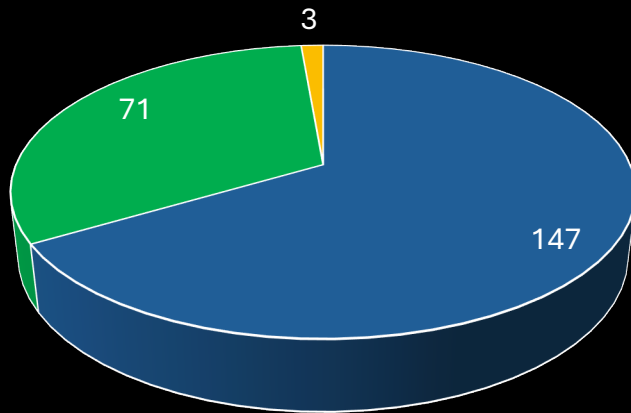


K-9 Marley alerted to the presence of narcotics while conducting a search of a housing unit which resulted in the discovery of Heroin



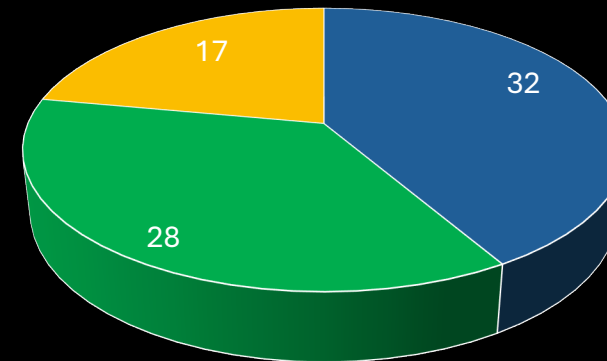
K-9 Marley alerted to the presence of narcotics while conducting a search which resulted in the discovery of Synthetic Cannabinoids

Broome County Correctional Facility Programs

- Forensic Services Program Coordinator position
 - IDT – Interdisciplinary Team established February 2025
- 2 Discharge Specialist positions
 - Tracking since July 2025 – 640 releases (149 scheduled, 491 unscheduled)
 - *95 received clothing
 - *368 received a Sheriff's ID at no cost to them
 - *392 were assisted with DSS applications
 - *372 were provided with bus passes or set up with direct transportation from a community partner agency
 - *88 were set up with insurance
 - *114 were scheduled for outpatient substance use appointments
 - *145 were scheduled for outpatient mental health appointments
 - *126 were scheduled for primary care appointments

Broome County Correctional Facility Programs

- Inmate Worker Program Supervisor and Inmate Worker program
- Garden Program with Cornell Cooperative Extension and Local Carpenters Union
- Monthly Meetings with UHS, Prime Care and Broome County Mental Health to discuss MAT program.
- New Voluntary programs added:

 - Visions Financial Literacy Group
 - Breakthrough

2025:

- **140** Were accepted and started the Interactive Journaling Program
 - **90** of the **140** were linked to care either with MAT or Mental Health
 - **107** Completed Journaling Program
 - **7** Cycles of Interactive Journaling were completed
- **81** Completed Participant were released and given Phones, 31-day Bus Pass, \$40 Clothing Voucher, T-shirts, underwear, socks, towel, washcloth, Backpack with Hygiene Kits
- **69** Participants were engaged in Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT)
- **36** Participated in Intensive Outpatient Treatment
- **21** Participated in Mental Health Treatment
- **24** referrals to care management
- **23** Found part/full time Jobs
- **31** Winter Jackets given out
- **54** were helped getting Identity Documents Birth Cert, SS card, ID
- **24** Found safe stable housing beyond emergency housing



Discharge planners gave out sheriff's ID's to ALL scheduled releases and some unscheduled releases upon request before discharge.

2026 :

- Between ATI & PATH programs, they are assisting 12 – 18 clients on average per month prior to release with an additional 10 – 20 former incarcerated who report for services after release.
- These reentry programs are a VITAL part of STAP's multi pronged approach to addressing some of the most challenging health and social problems our community is facing.
