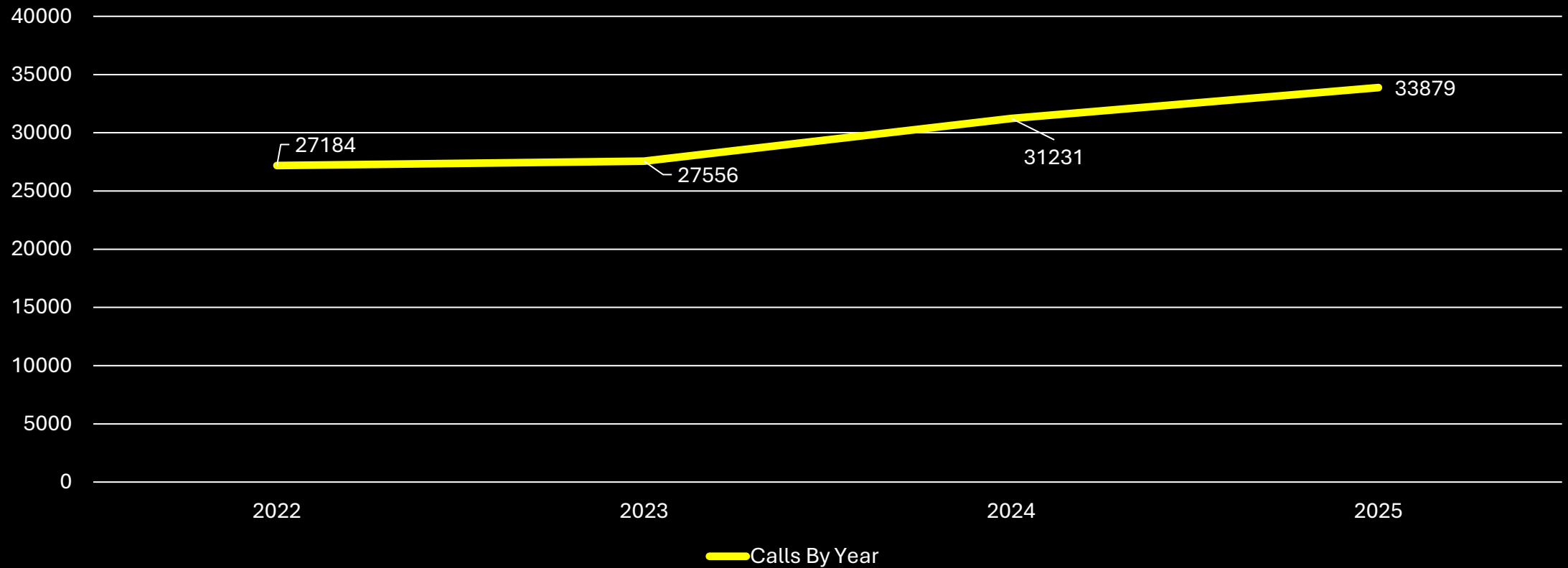

- Town Of Sanford makes up roughly **1.12%** of the total Population

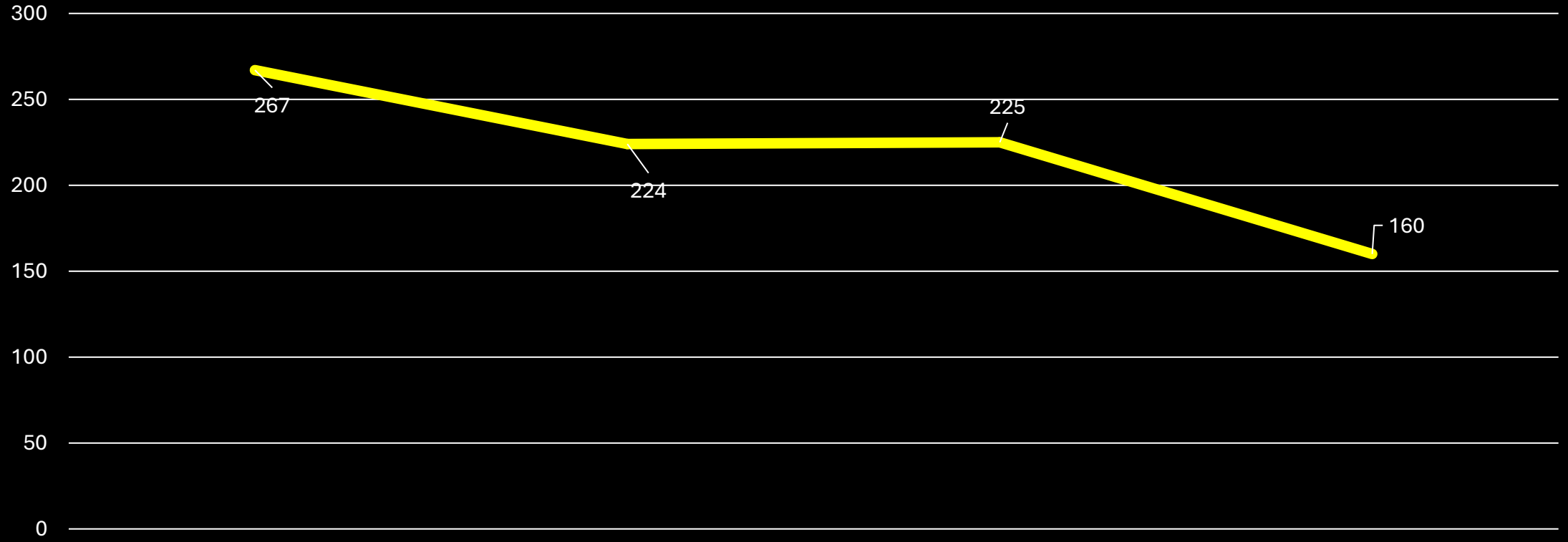
Countywide Calls For Service 2022-2025

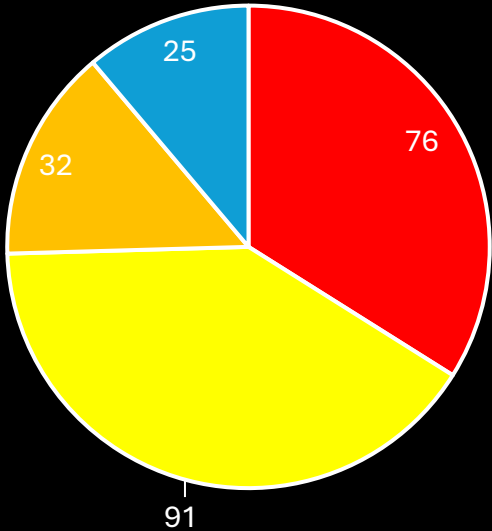

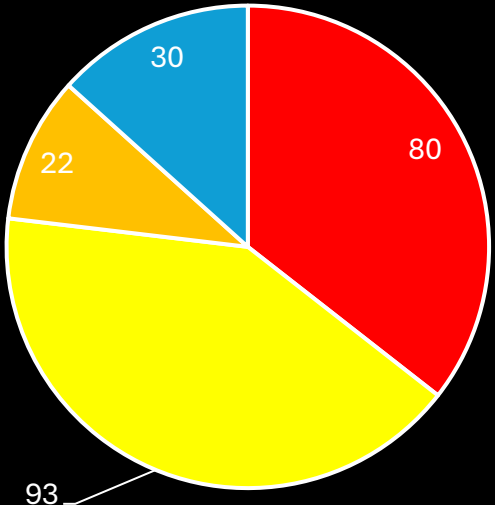

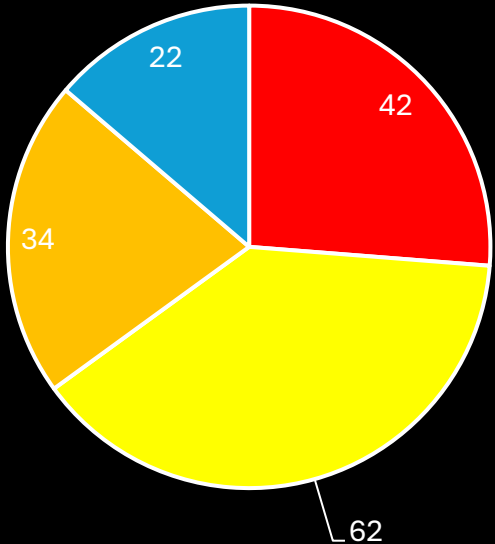

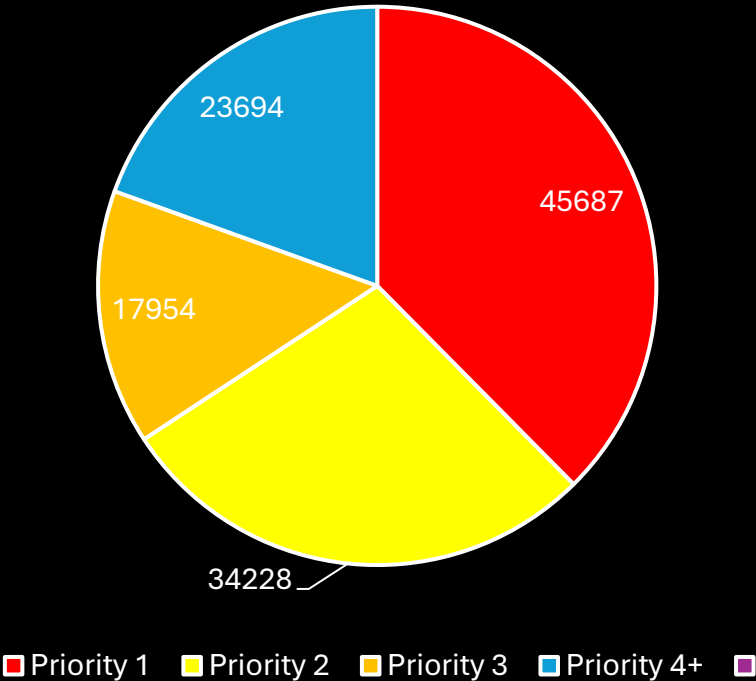

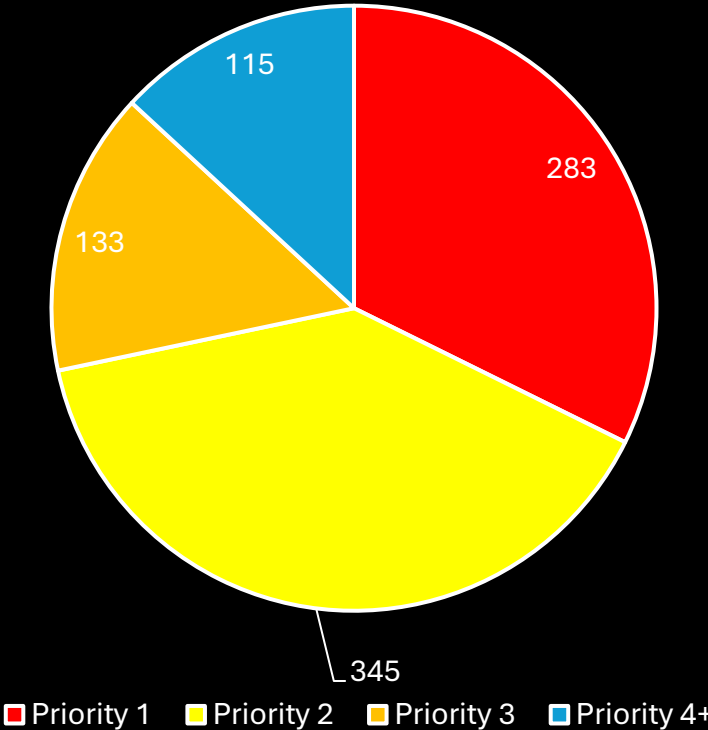

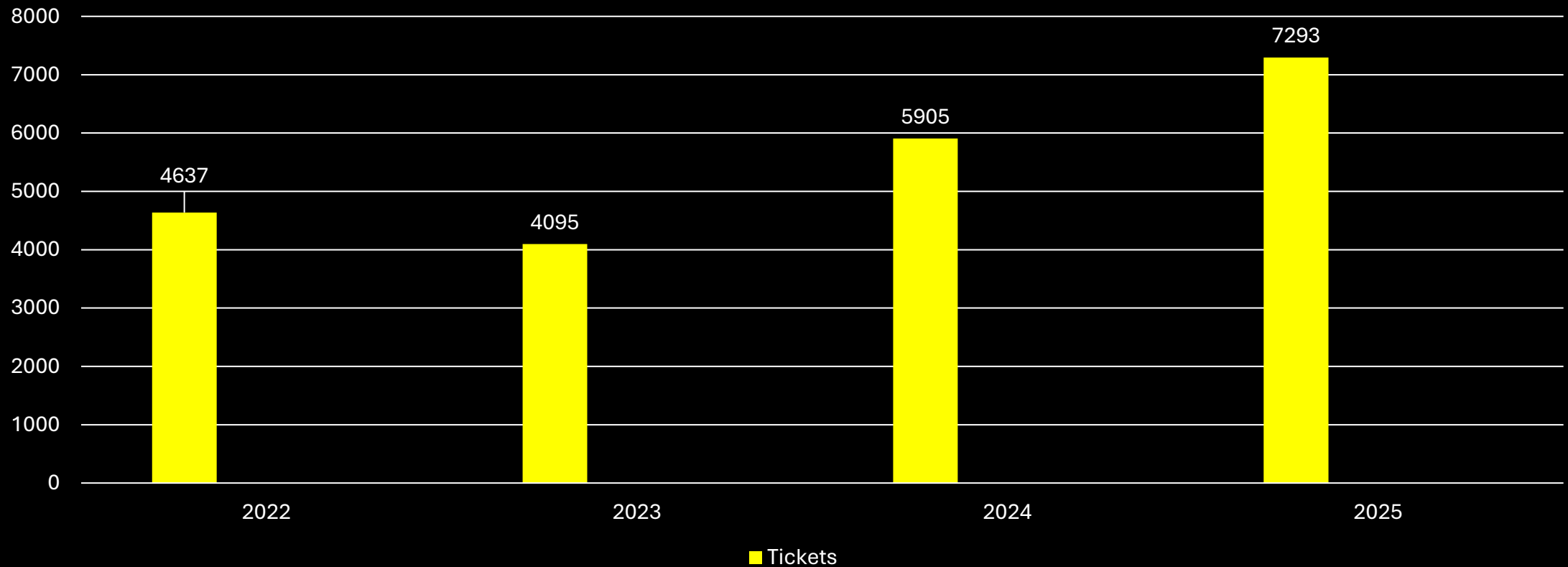

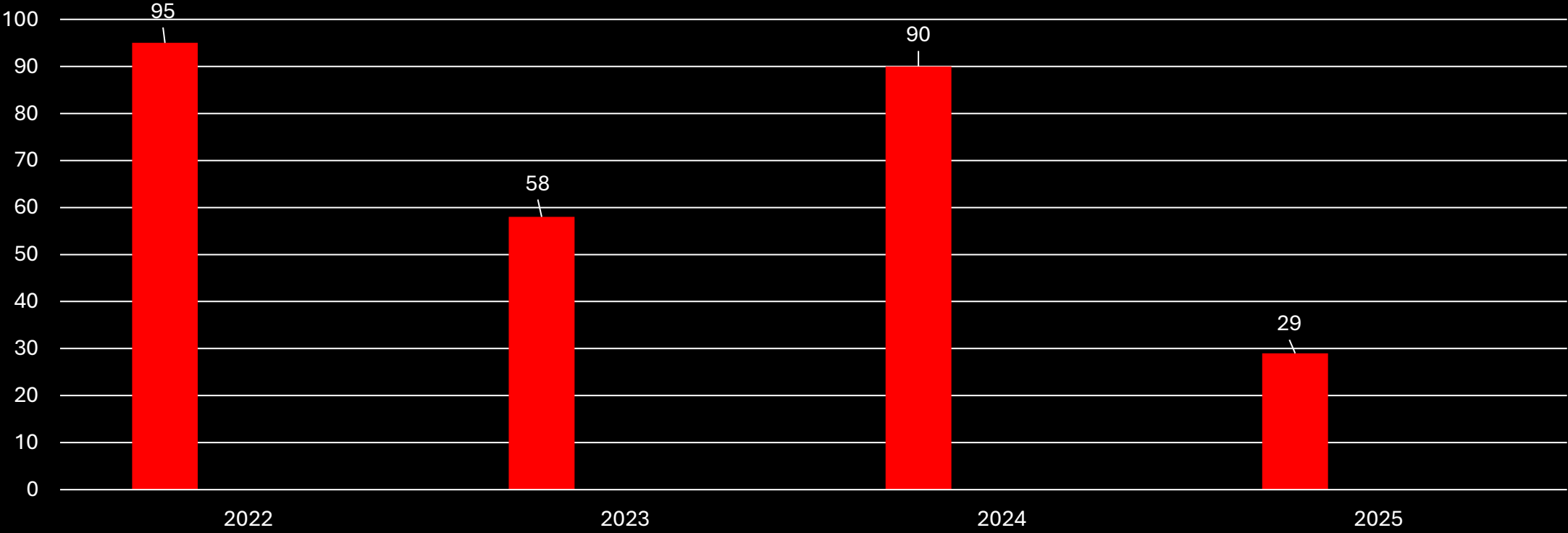
County Wide Tickets By Year

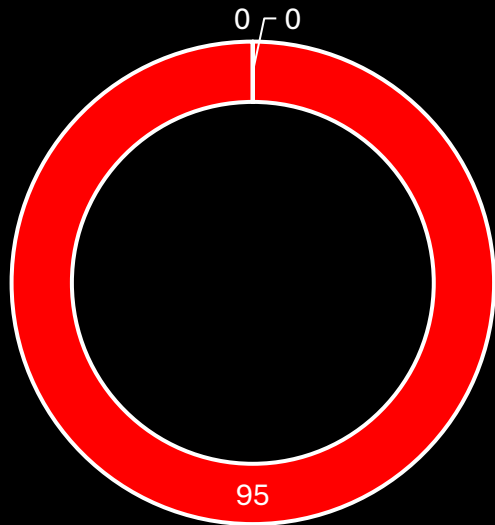

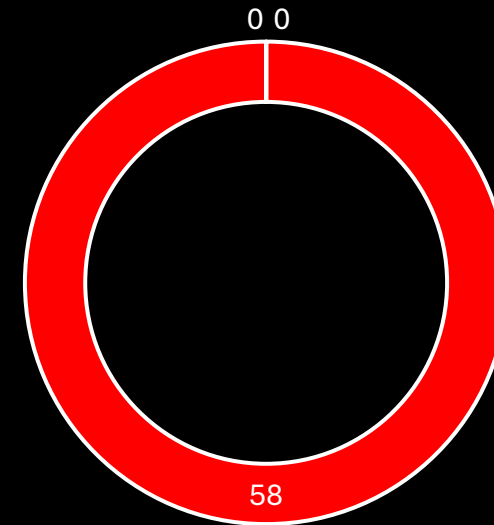

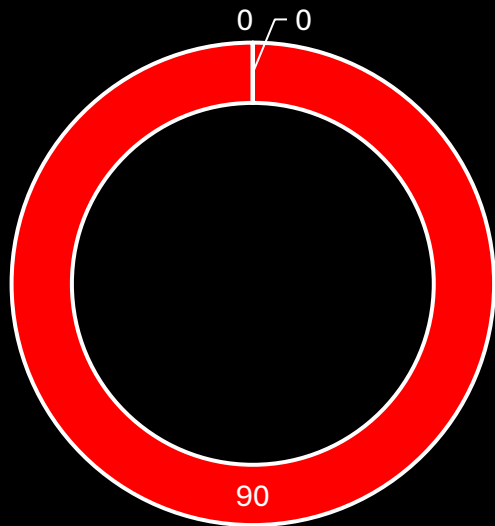

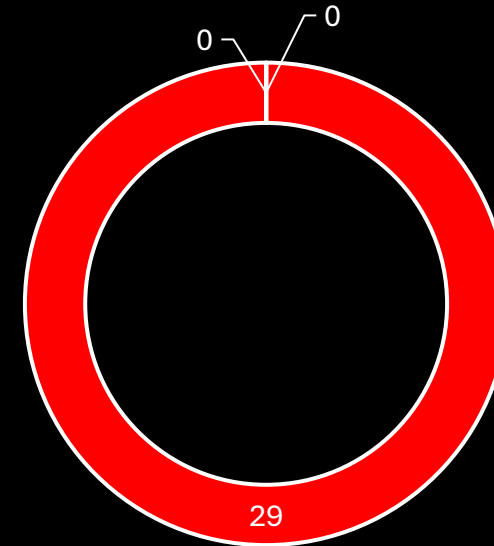

Traffic Infractions Parking Warning

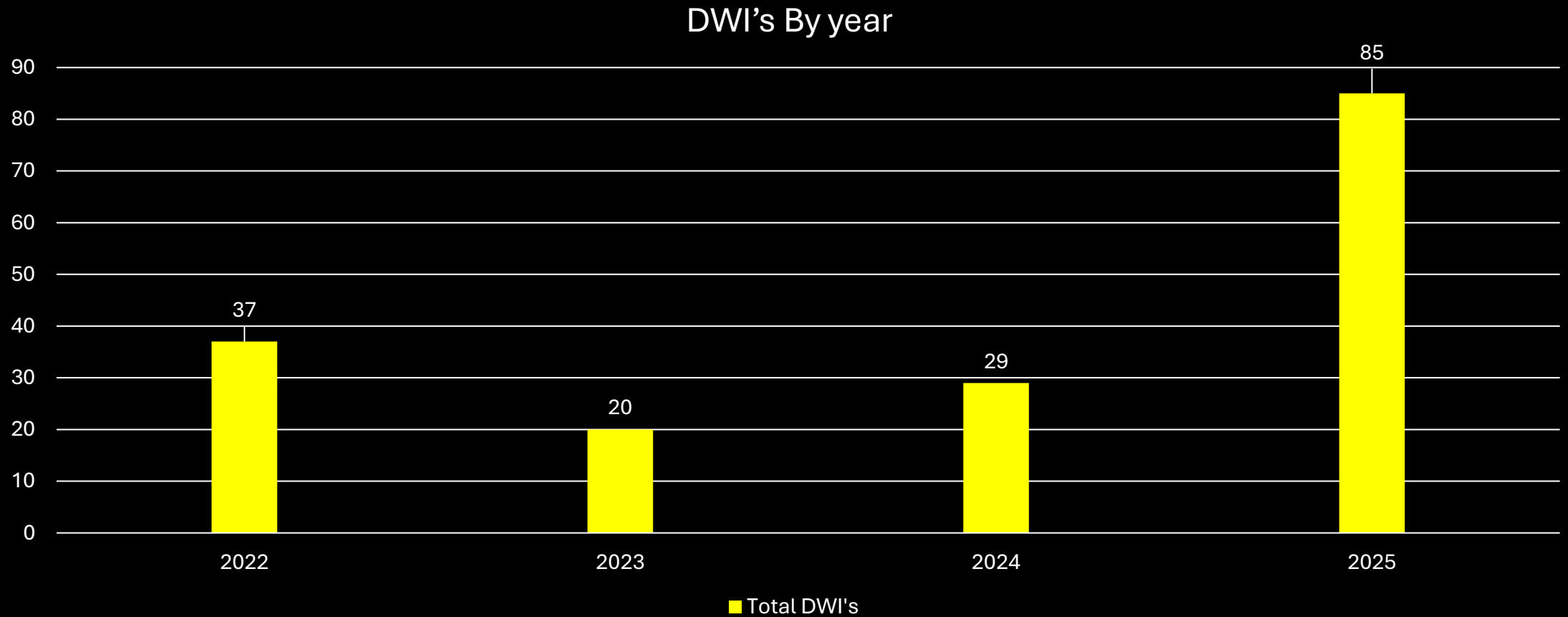

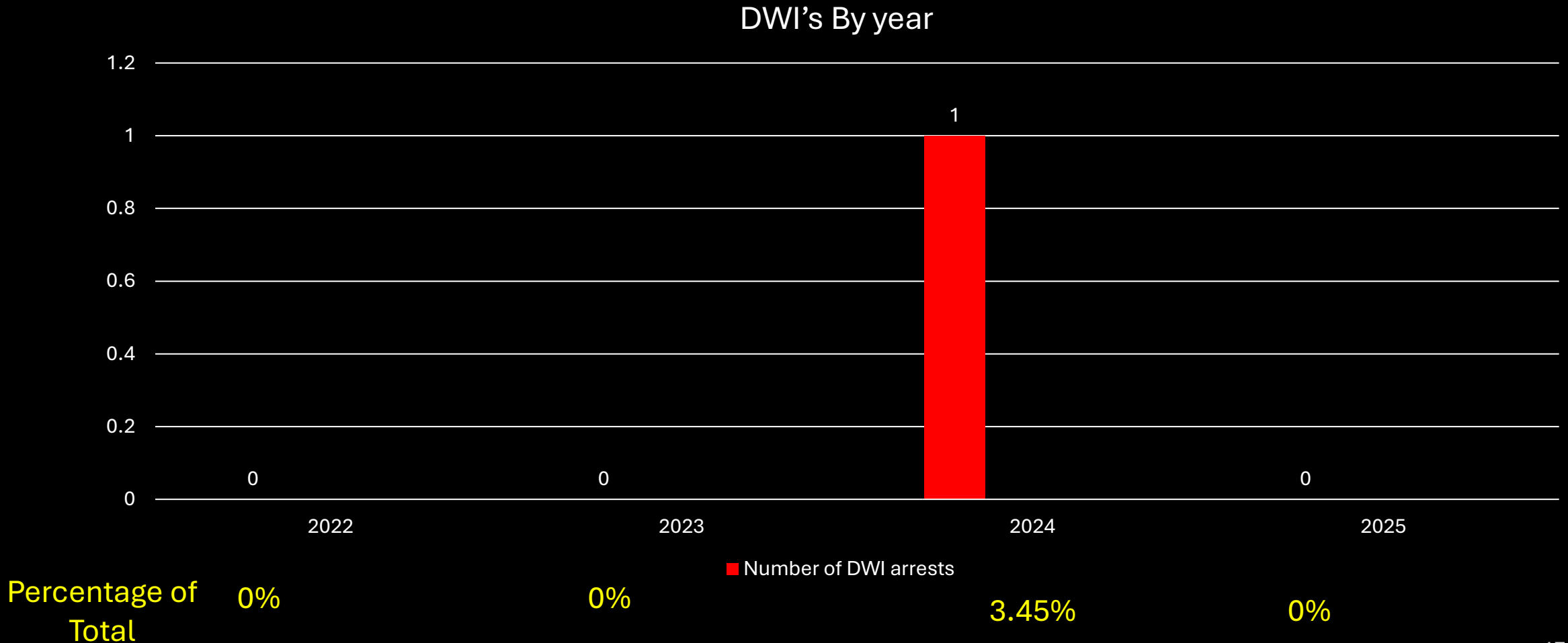

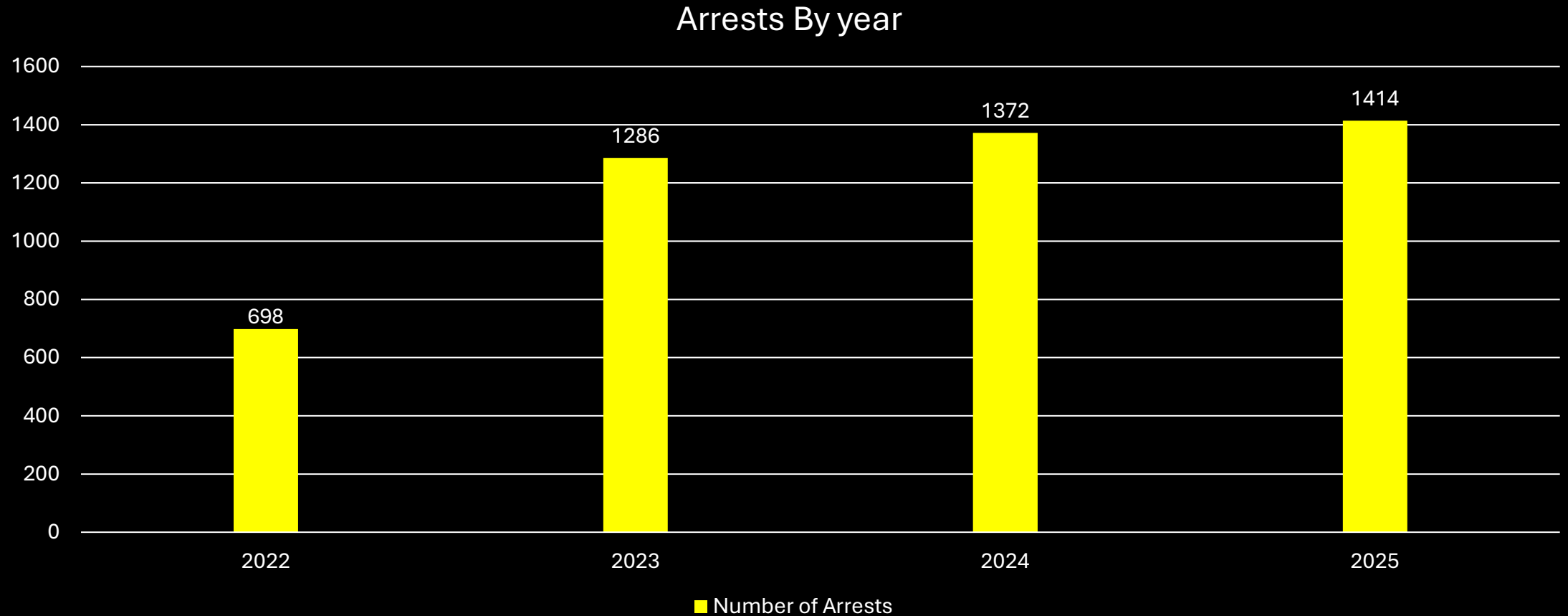
DWI's Countywide By Year



DWI Arrests By Year – Town Of Sanford

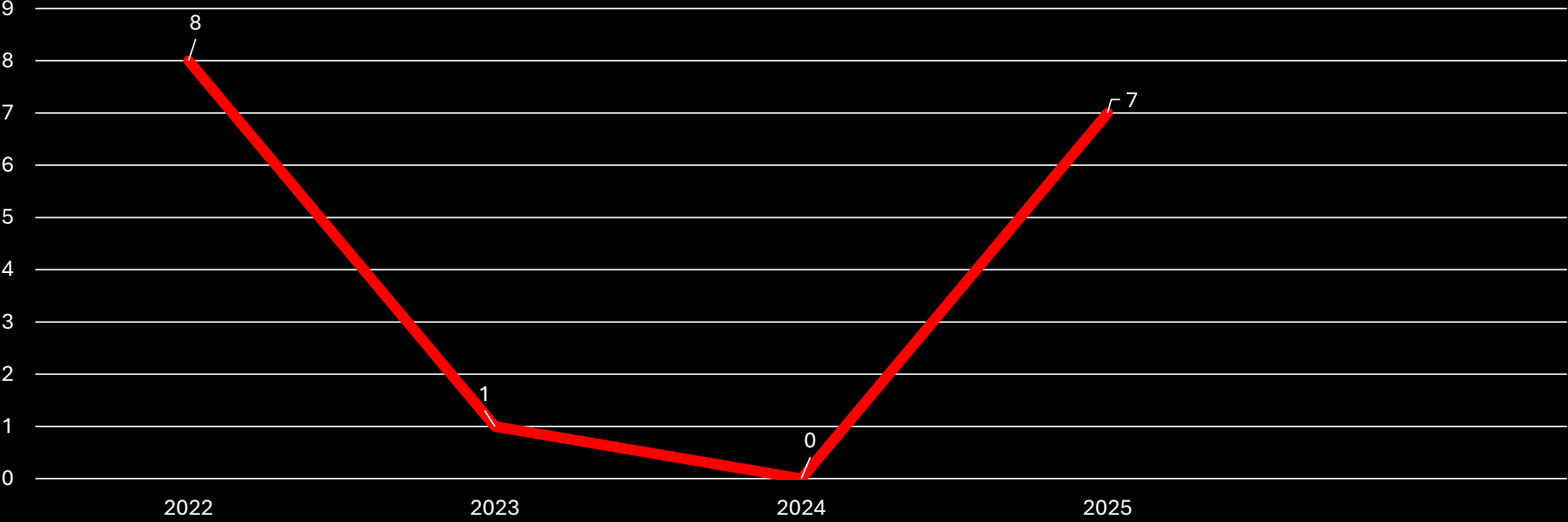


Total Arrests By Year

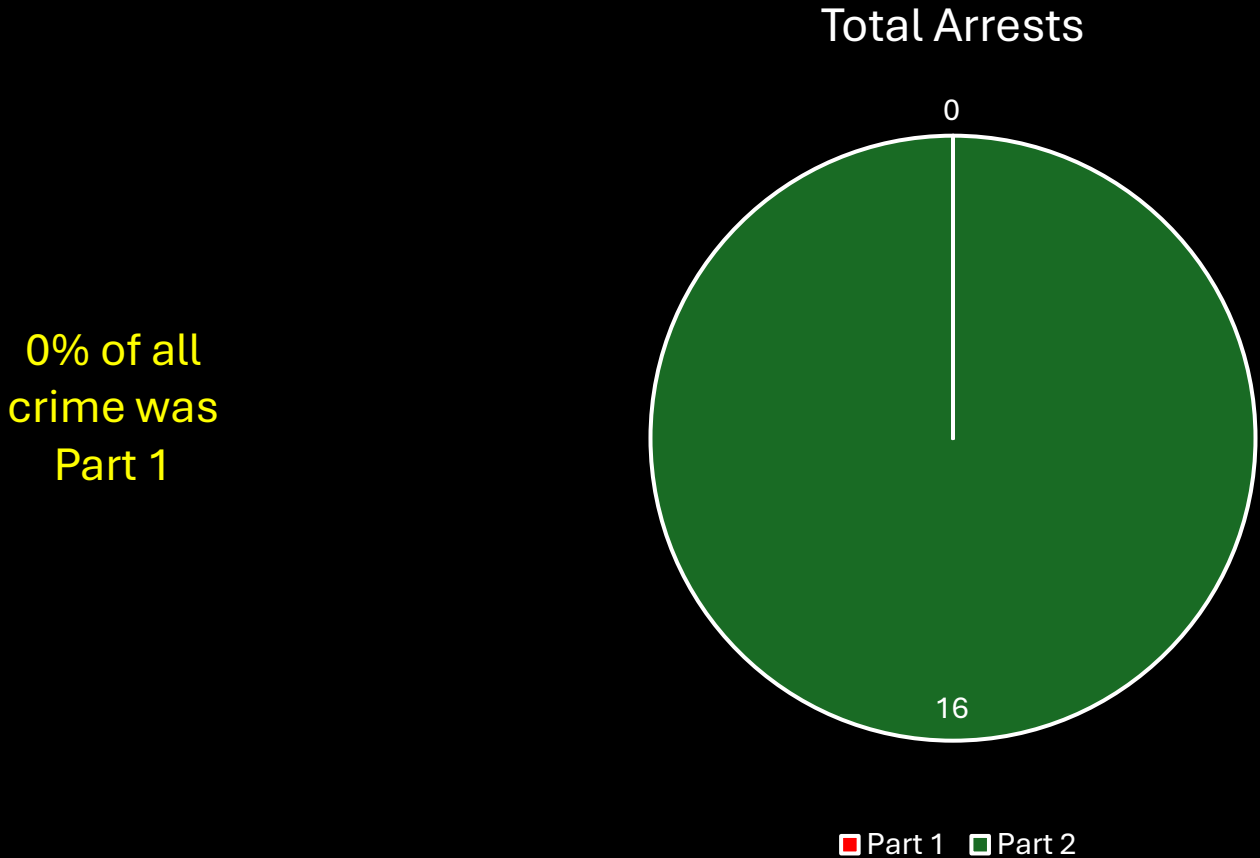

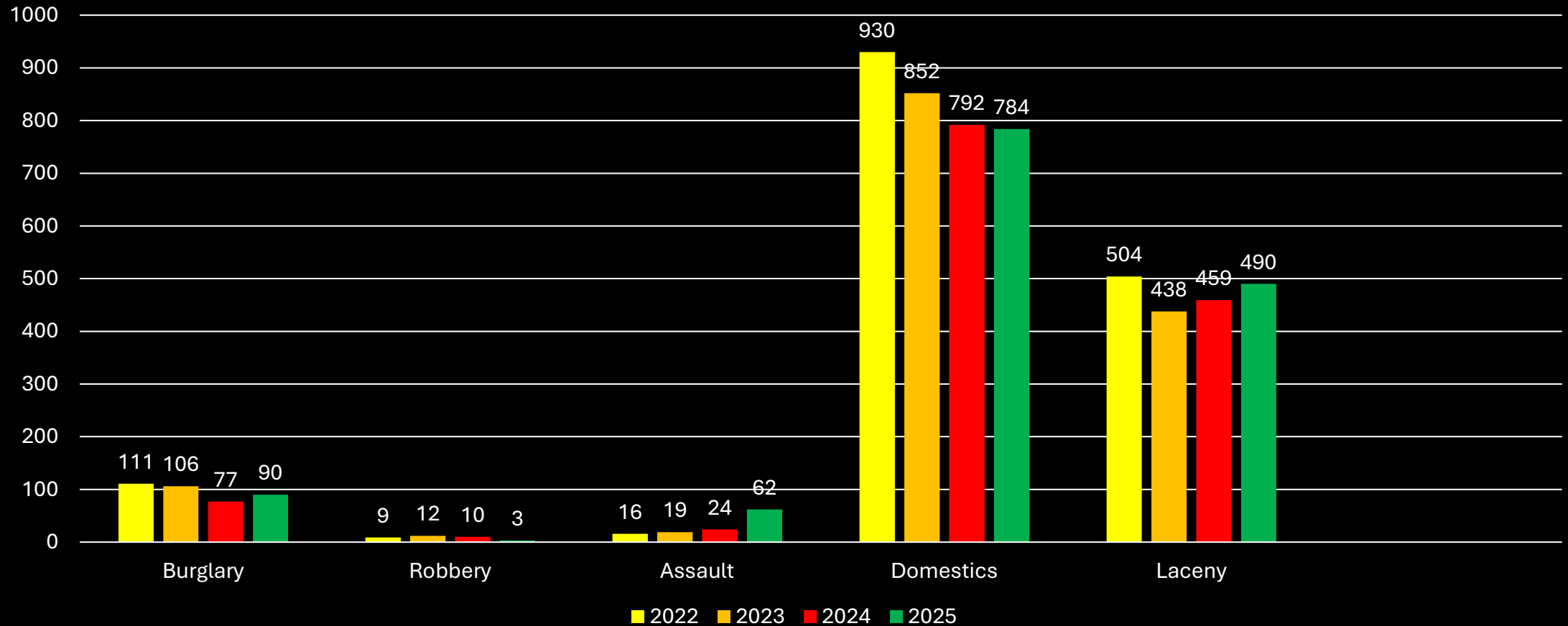

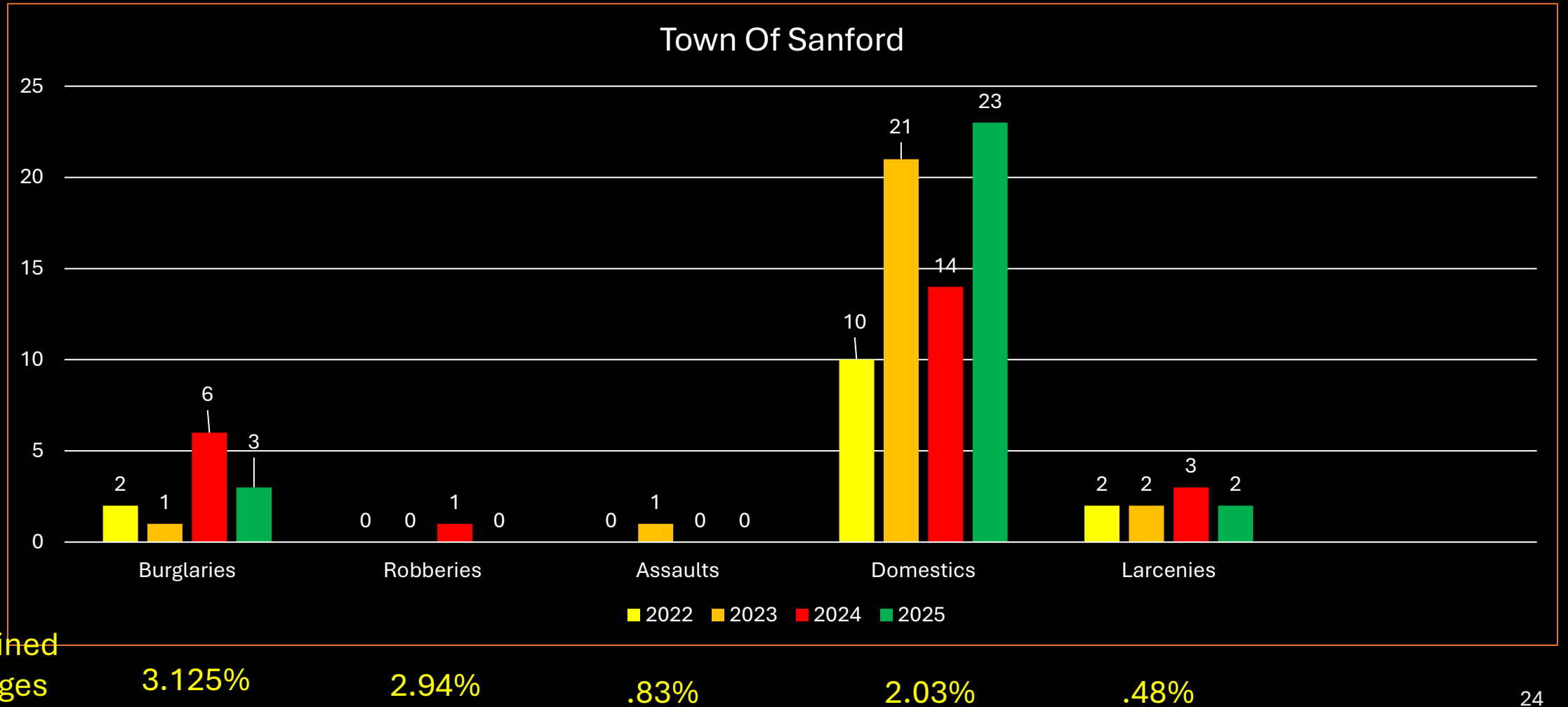

County Calls By year

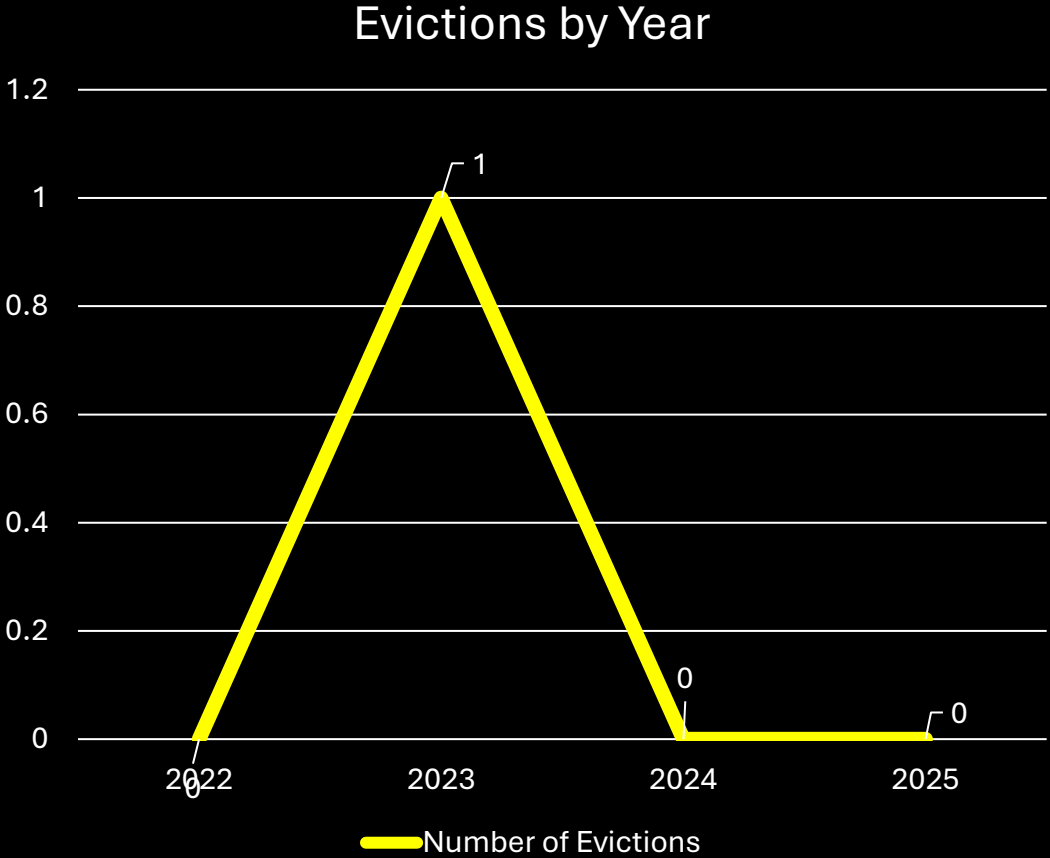


Types Of Calls For Service 2022-2025

Notable Case 2024

On Tuesday, October 1, 2024 at approximately 5:40 PM, members of the Broome County Special Investigations Unit Task Force attempted to execute a narcotics search warrant at a residence and a related vehicle on Big Hollow Rd. in Deposit, Town of Sanford. Upon the arrival of detectives and investigators, the target of the search warrant, Scott G. Lord, age 39 of Deposit, NY, fled the scene in a vehicle, leading law enforcement on a lengthy pursuit. After fleeing deputies through the towns of Sanford and Windsor, Lord attempted to escape through Susquehanna and Wayne counties in Pennsylvania. As the pursuit reached Vinegar Hill Road in Windsor, Lord appeared to be complying and stopping his vehicle before accelerating and ramming a BCSO vehicle, forcing it off the roadway and continuing to flee. The pursuit was then terminated in Wayne County, PA.

Attempted Aggravated Assault on a Police Officer, a Class C Felony

- Reckless Endangerment in the 1st Degree, a Class D Felony
- Unlawful Fleeing a Police Officer in a Motor Vehicle in the 3rd Degree, a Class A Misdemeanor

- Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance in the 7th Degree, a Class A Misdemeanor
- Criminal Use of Drug Paraphernalia in the 2nd Degree, a Class A Misdemeanor
