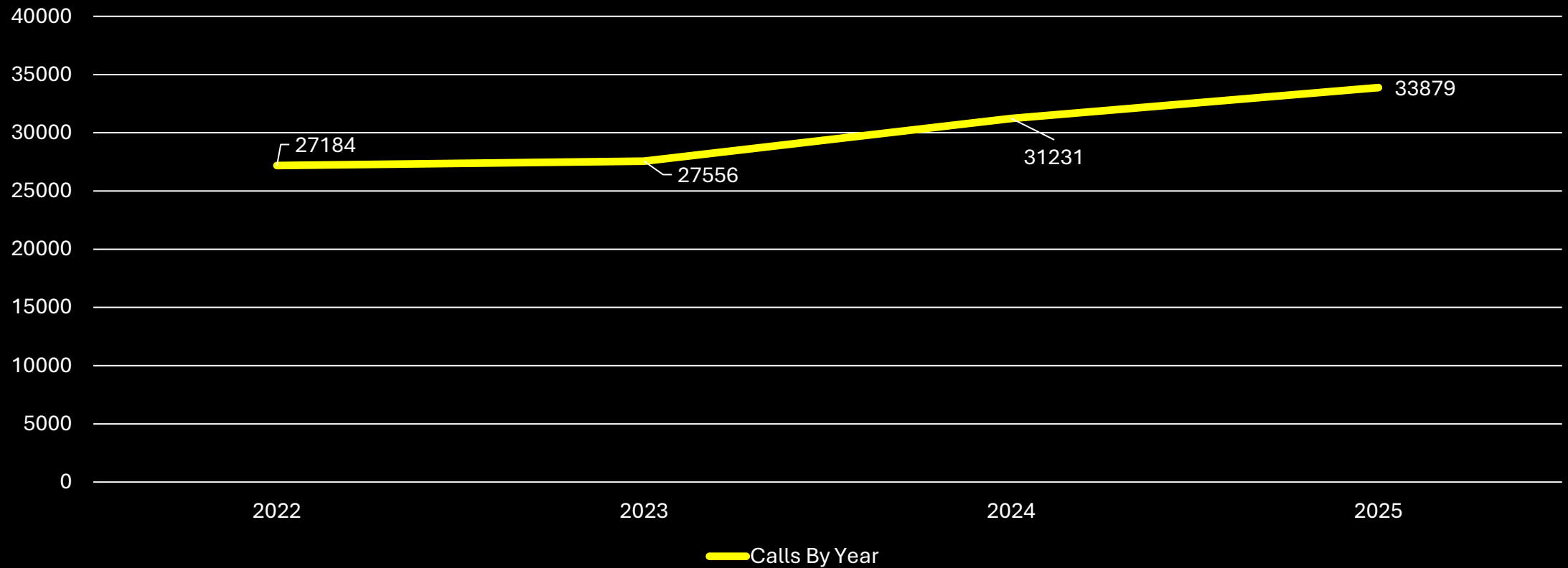

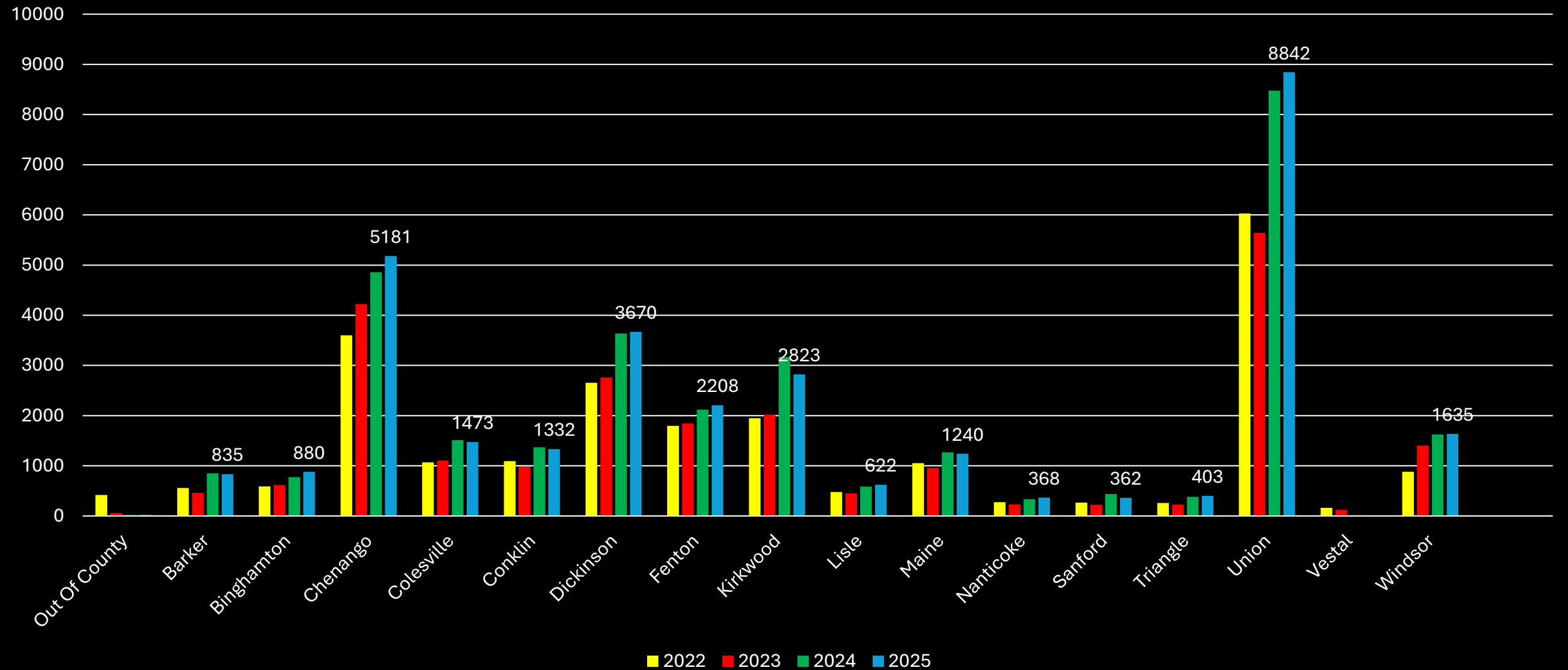

Calls By Jurisdiction By year

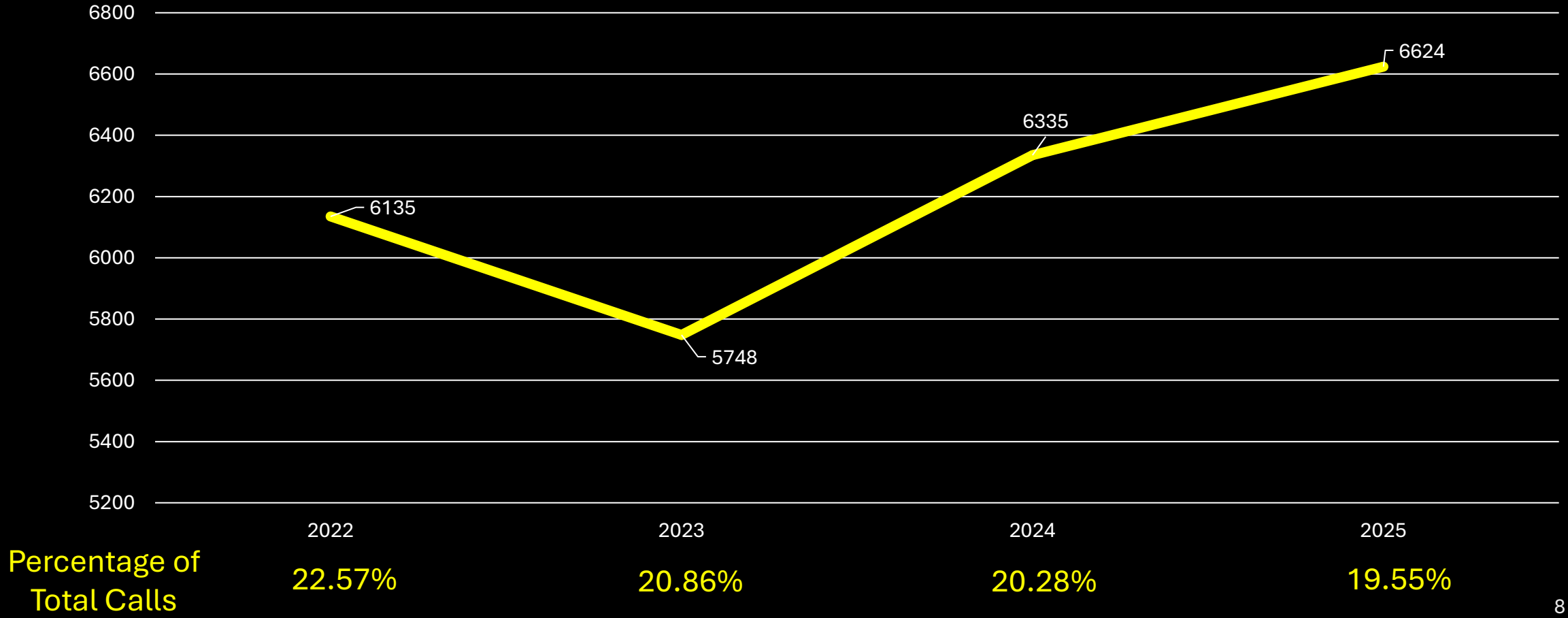

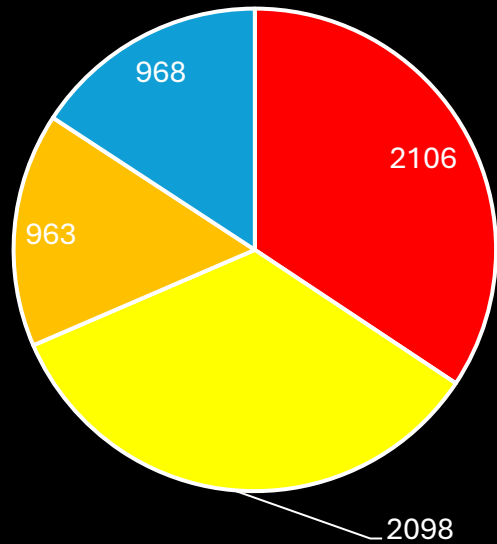

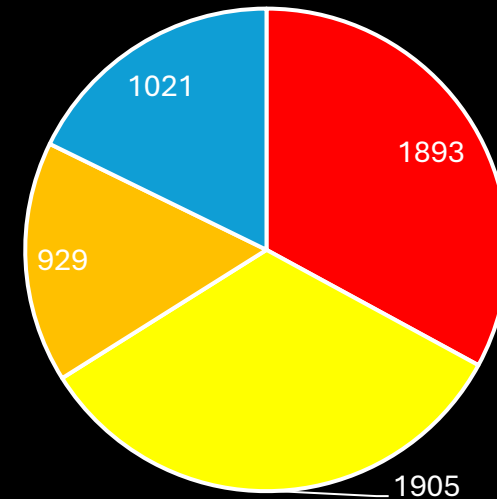

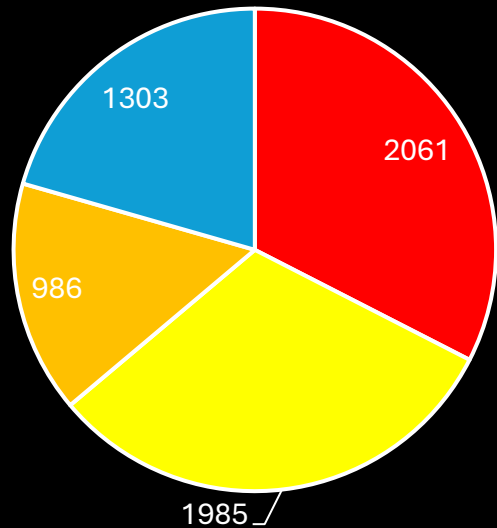

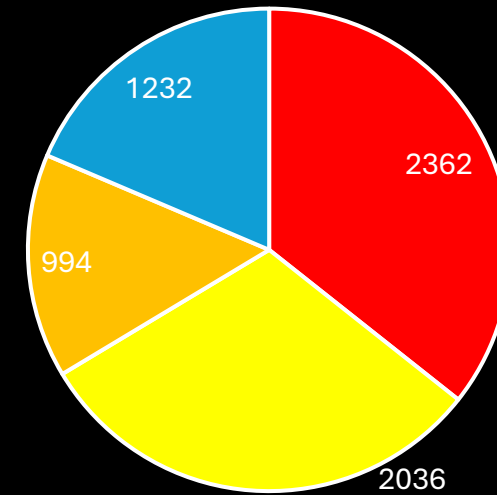

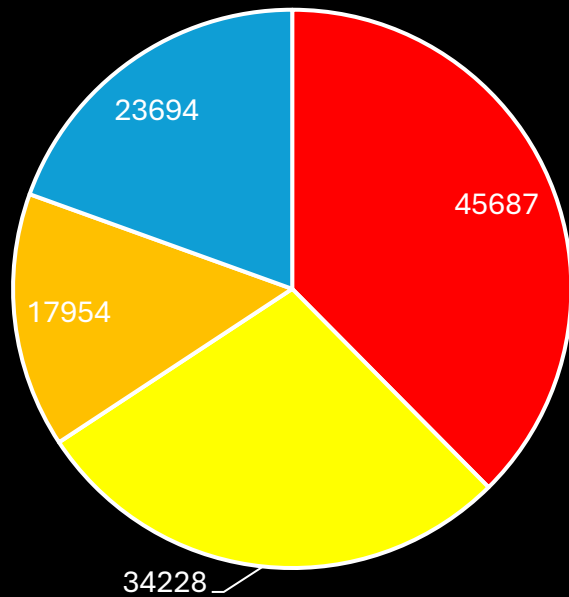

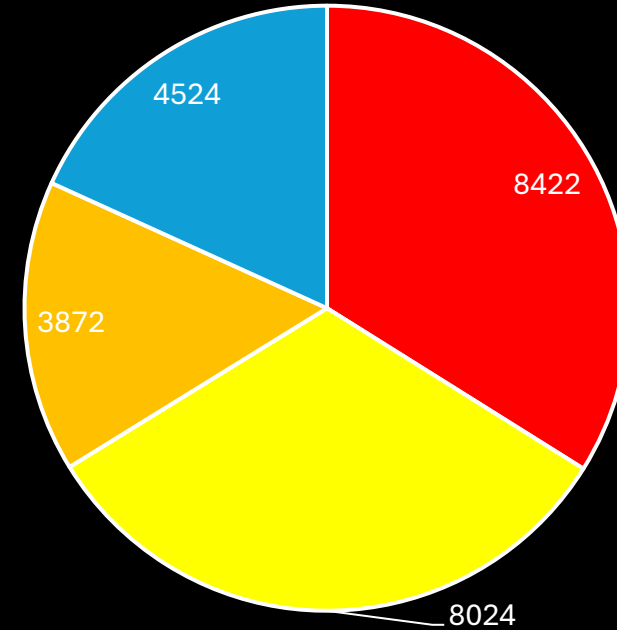
Total Calls By Priority Last 4 Years

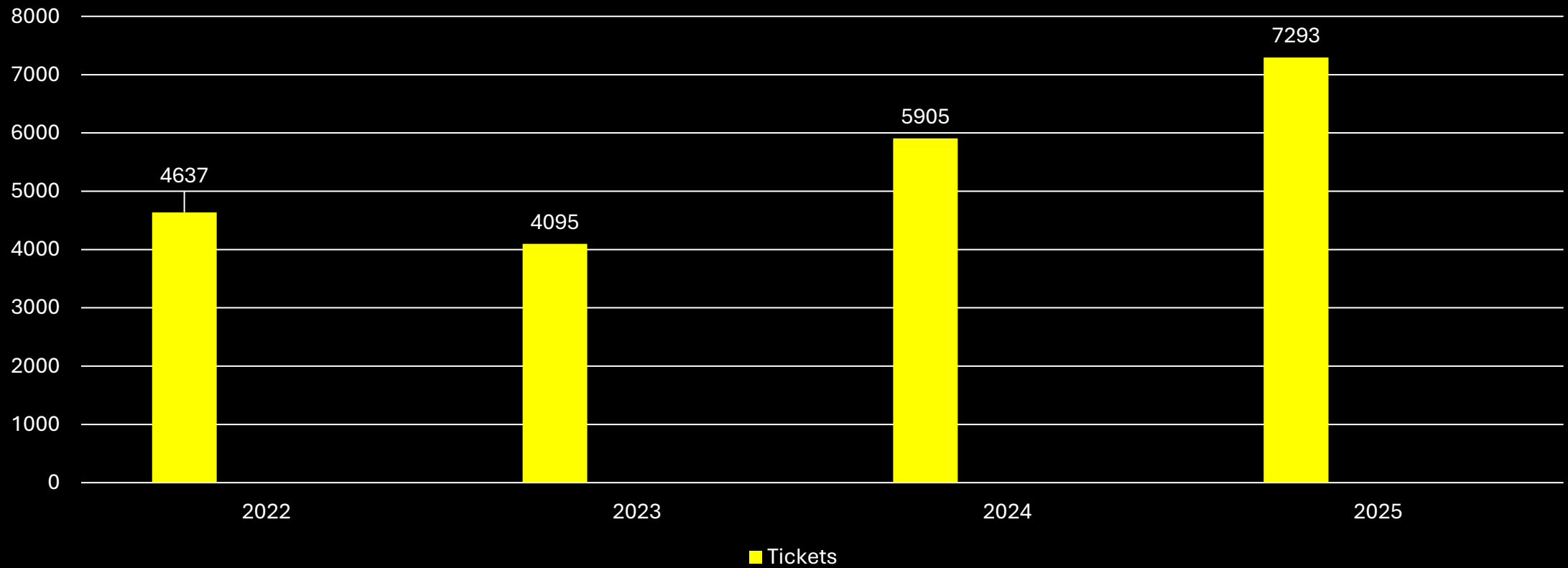

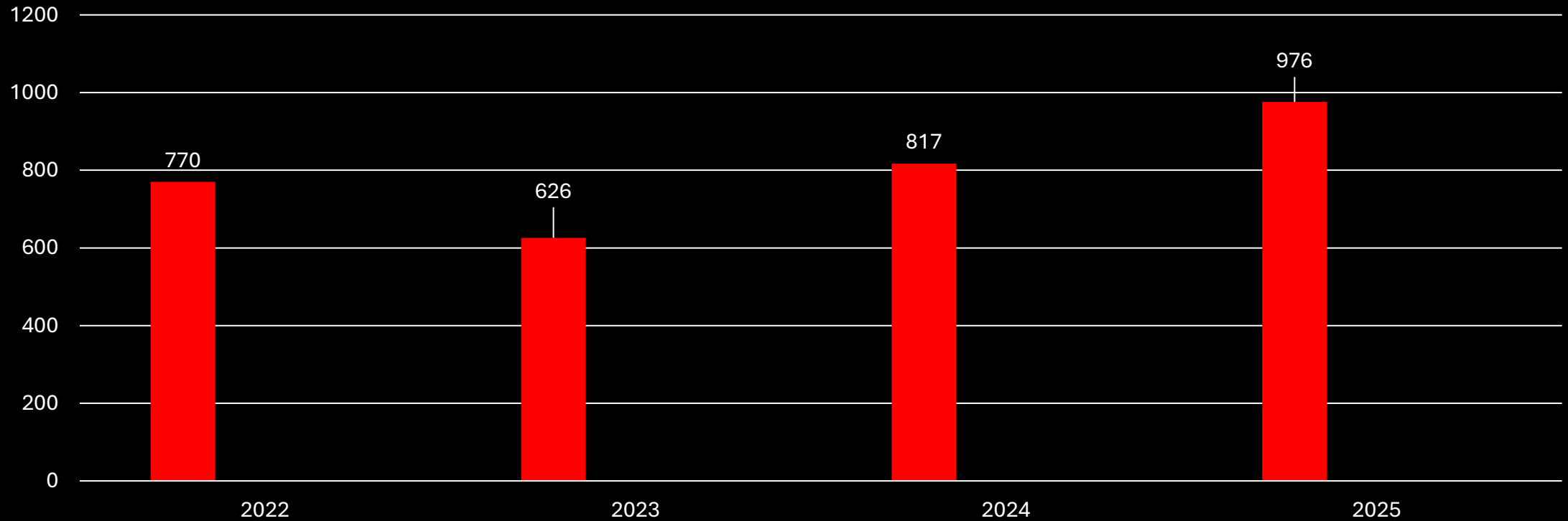
County Wide Tickets By Year

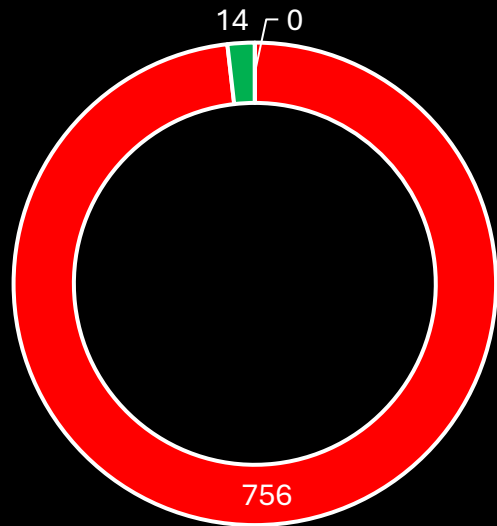

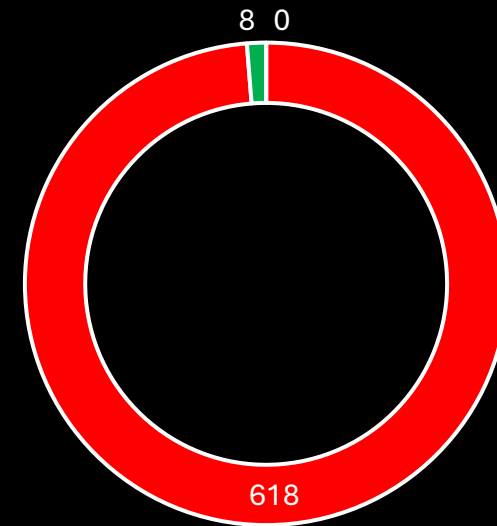

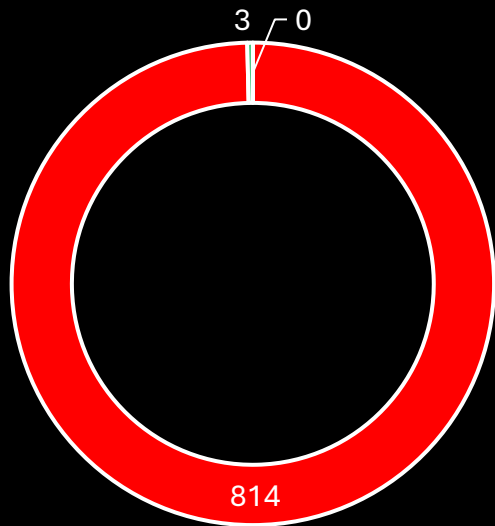

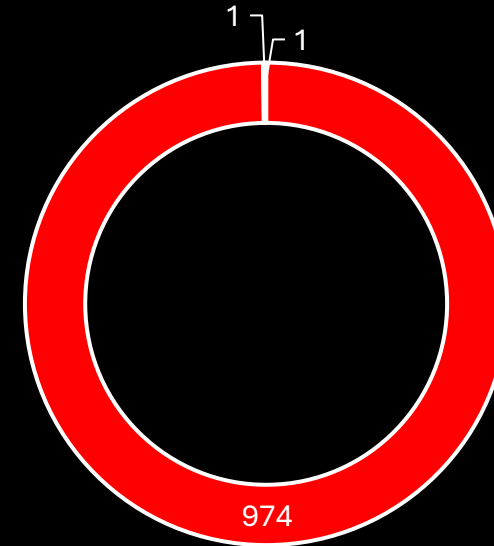

Traffic Infractions Parking Warning

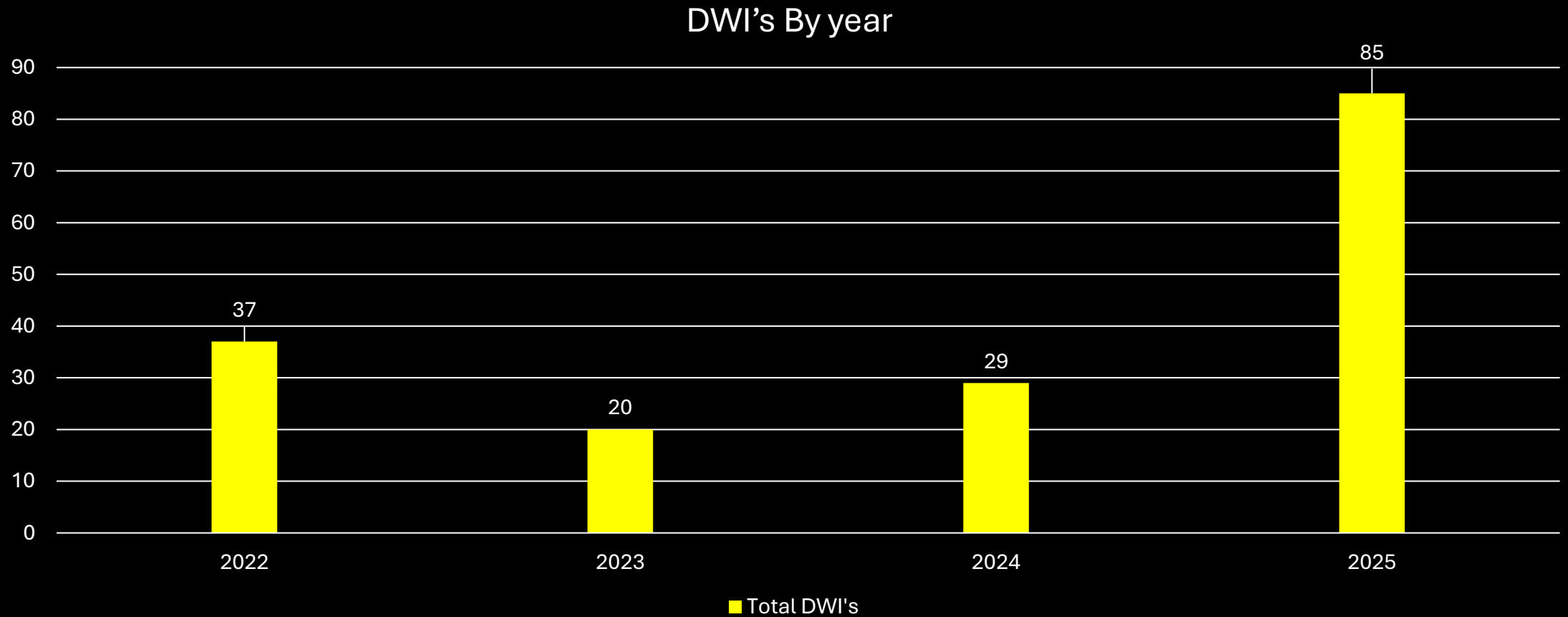

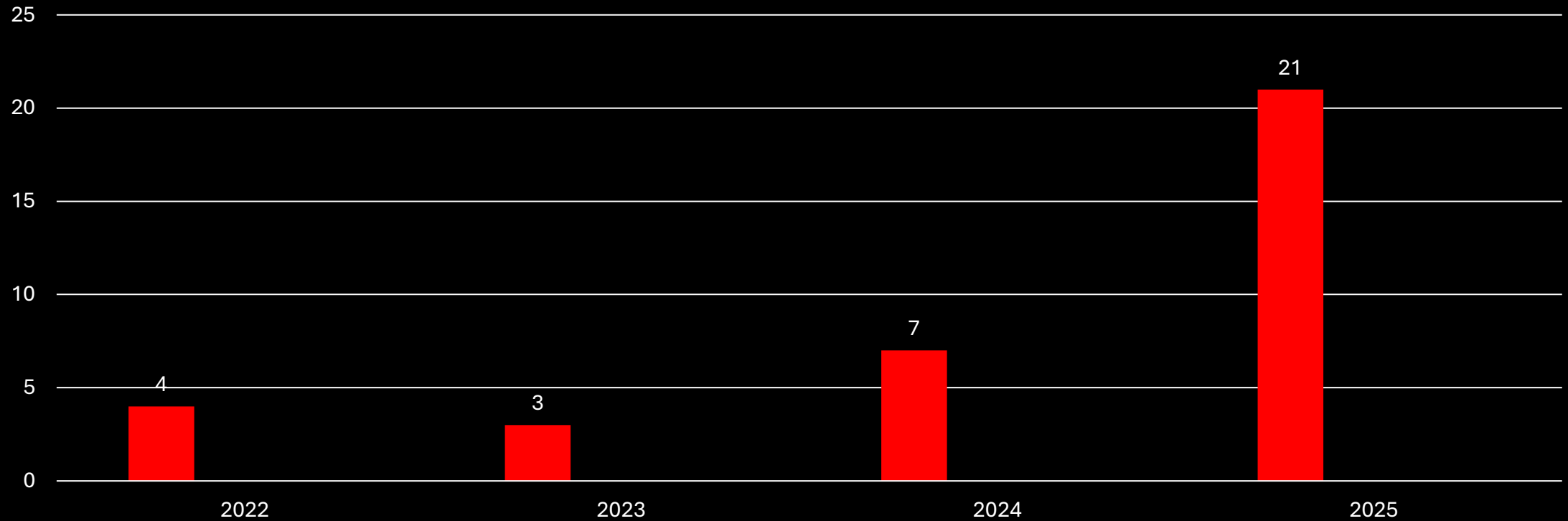

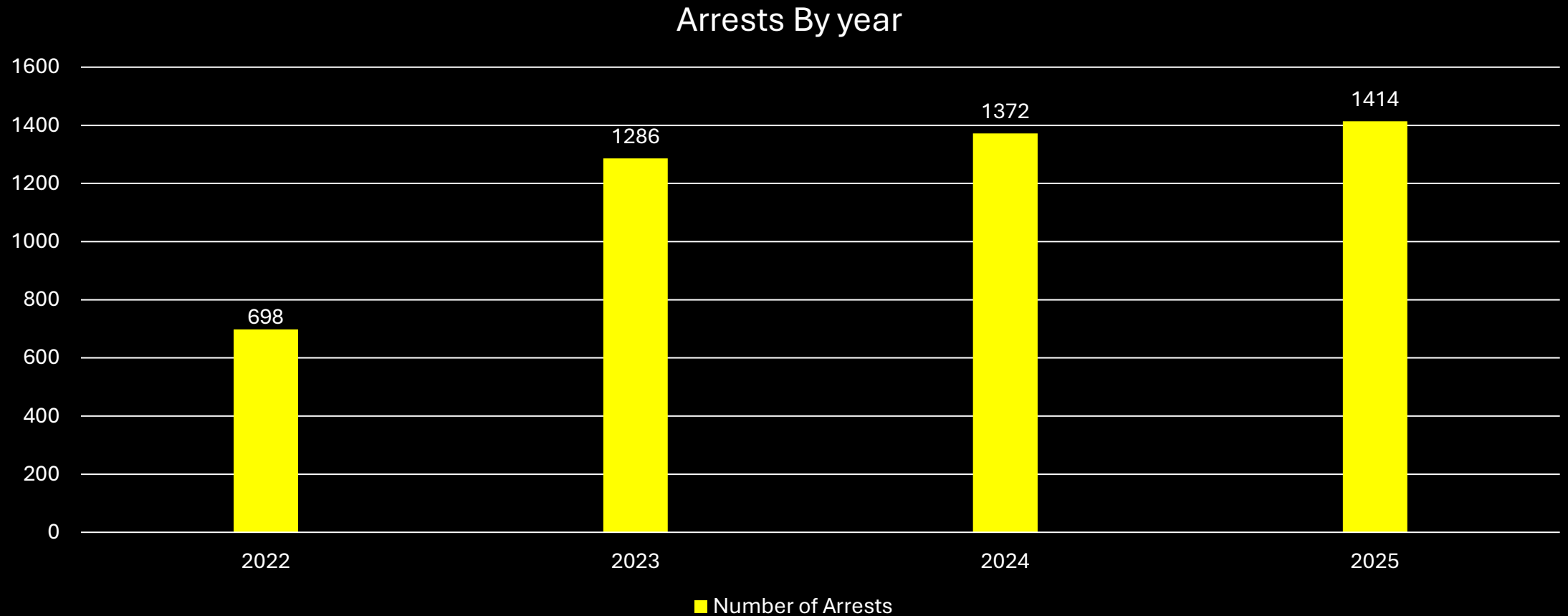

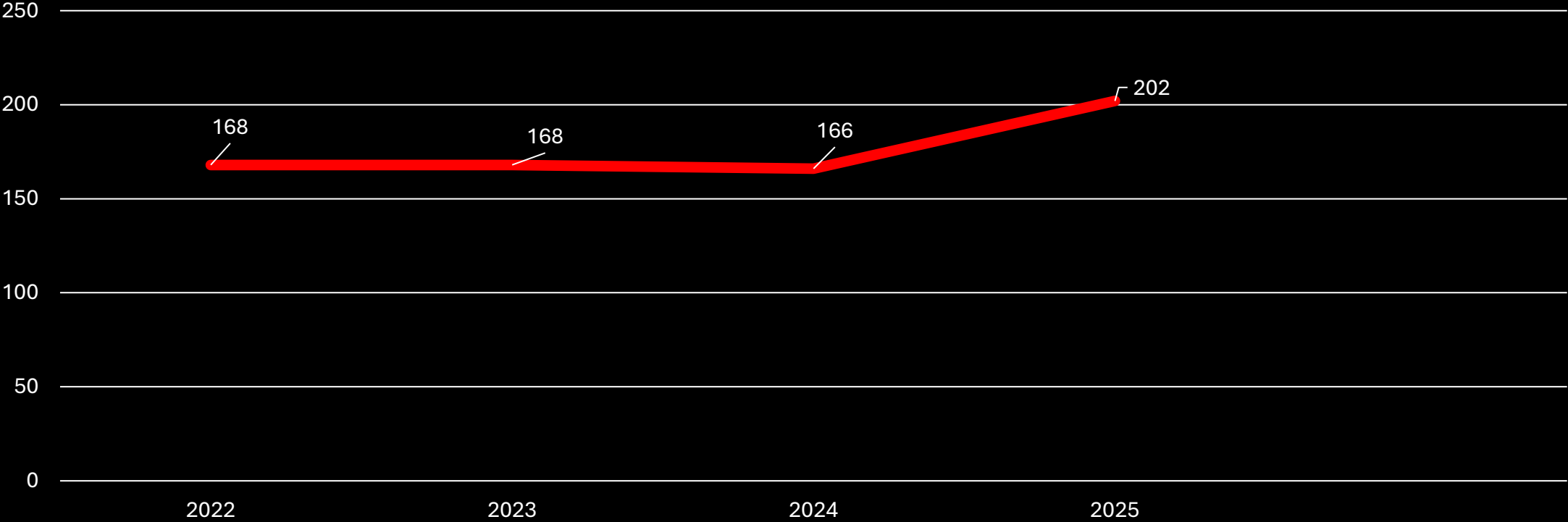

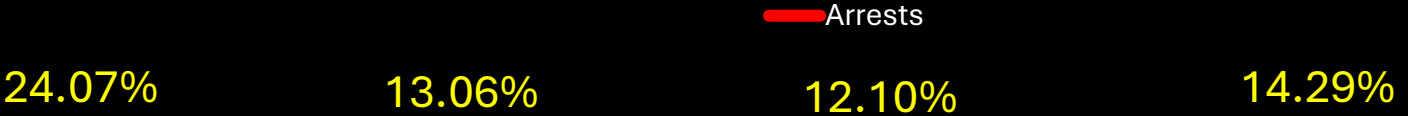

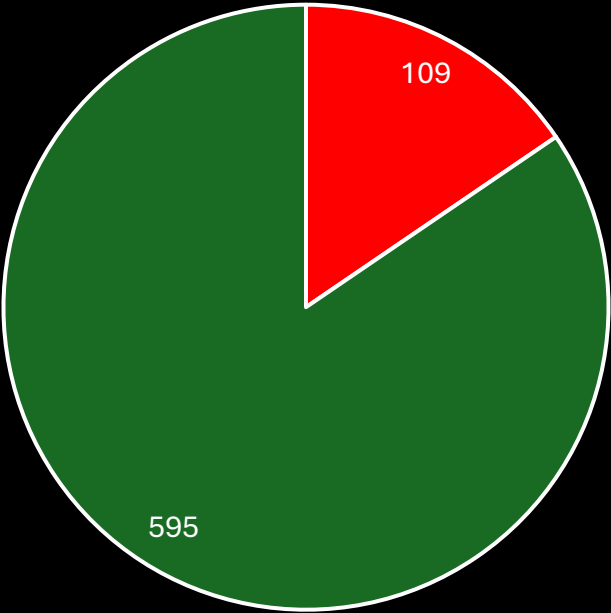

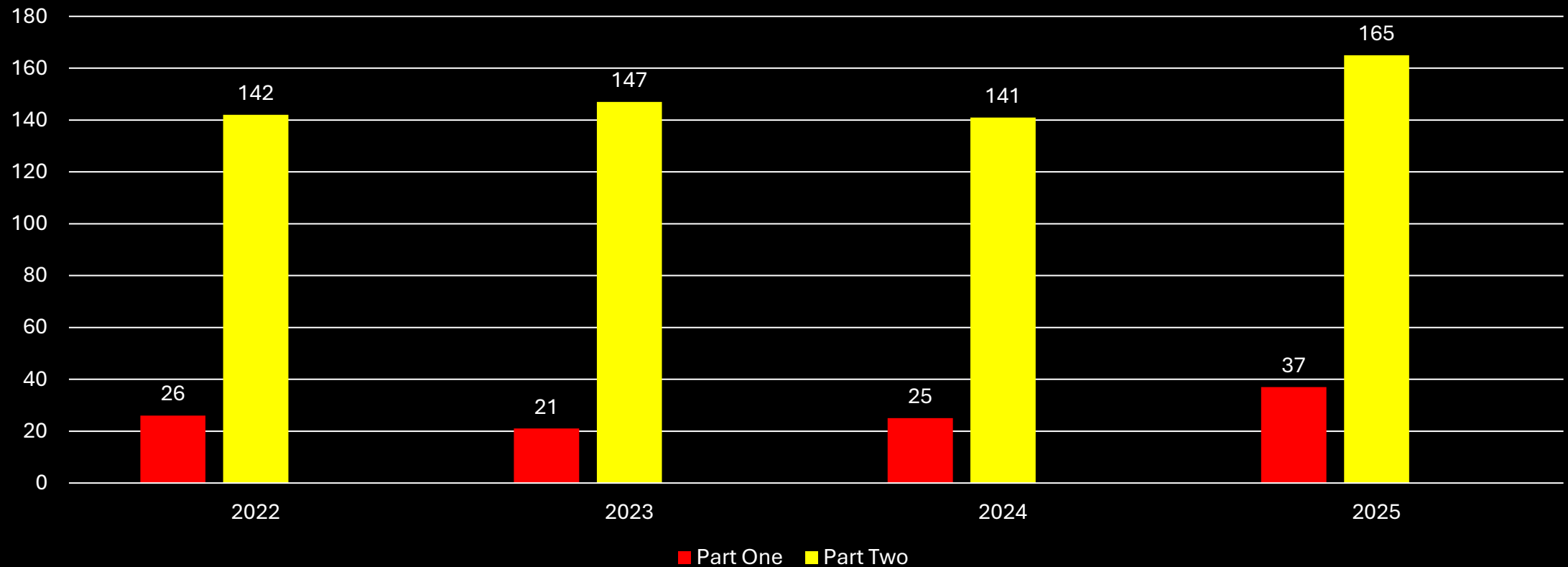

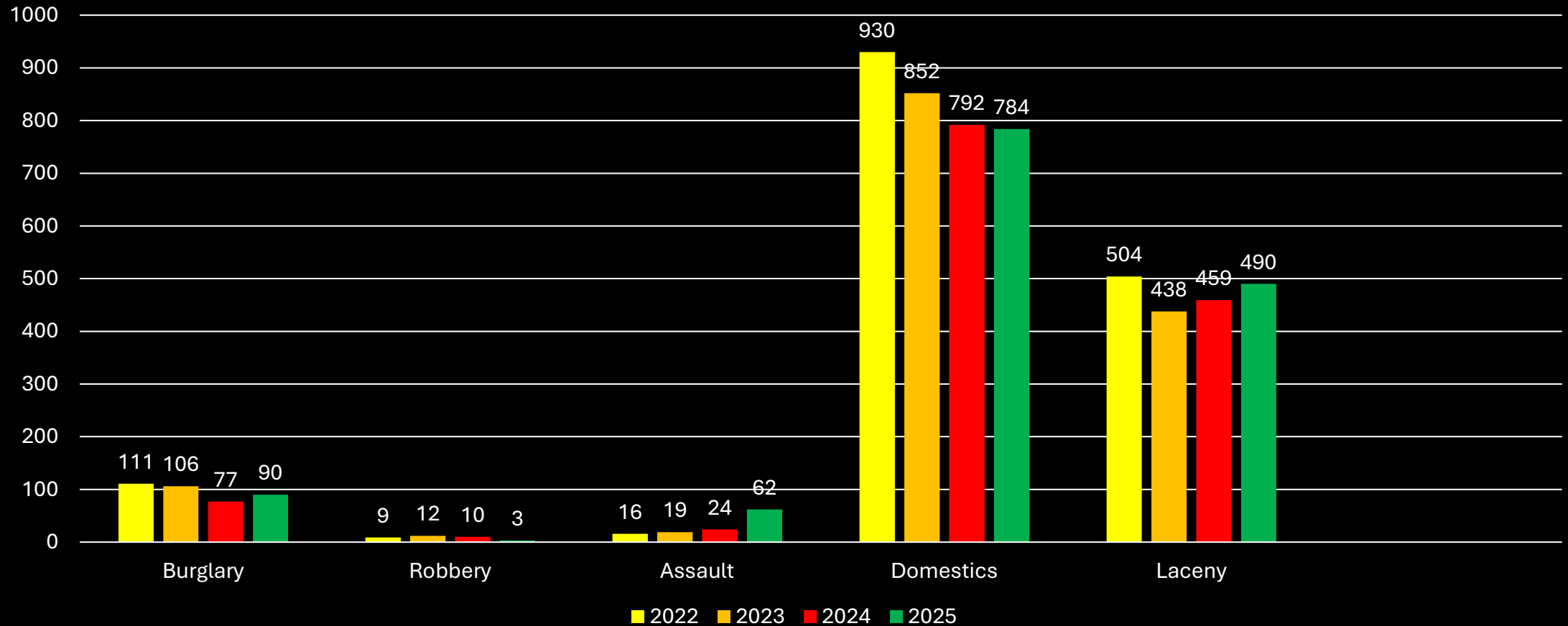

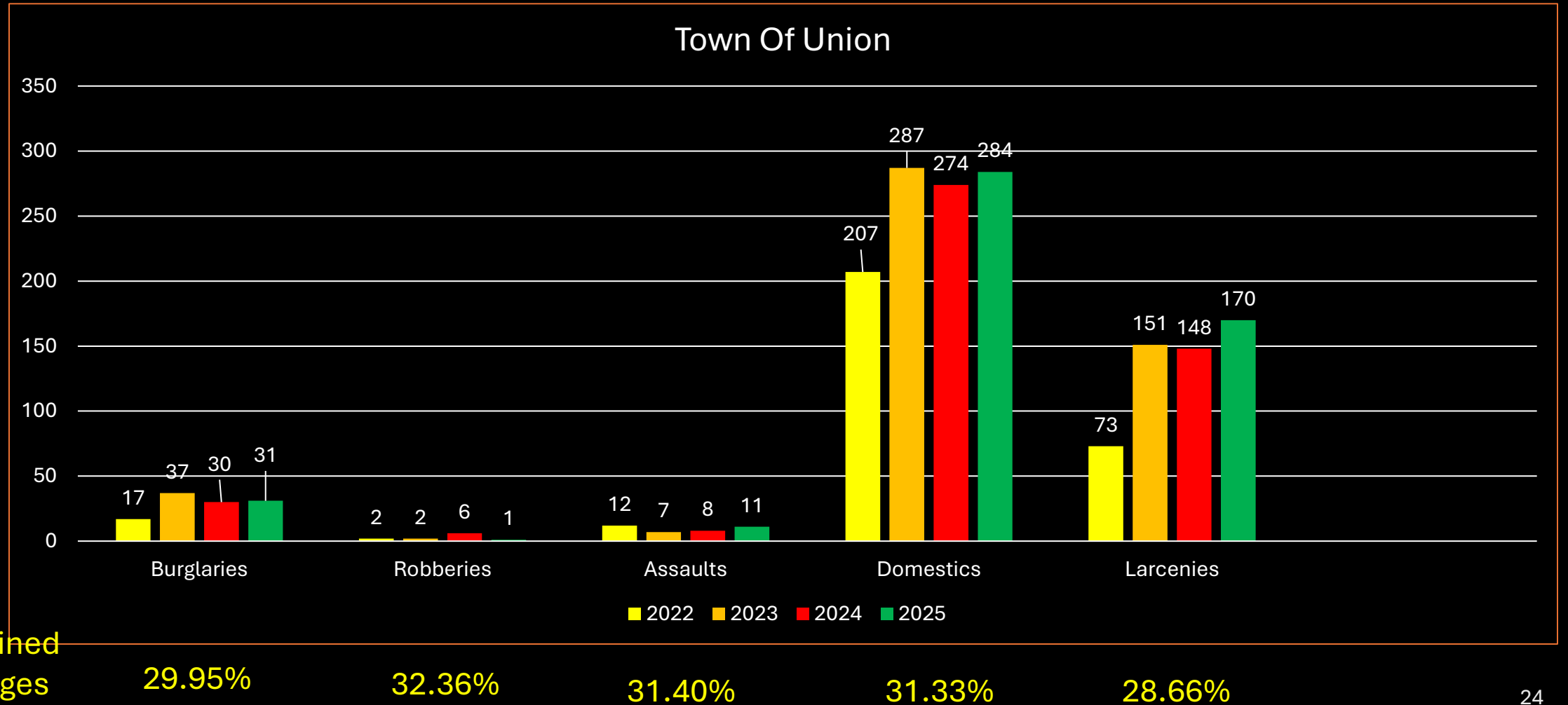

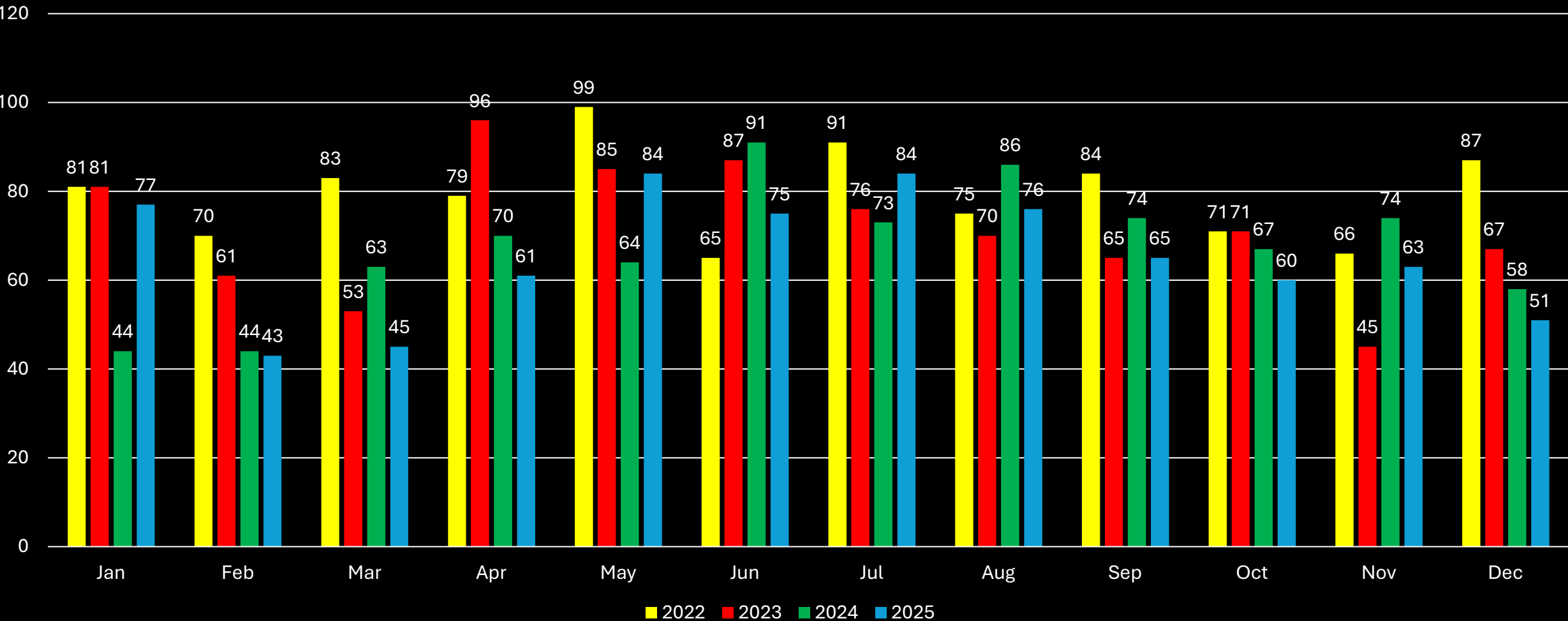

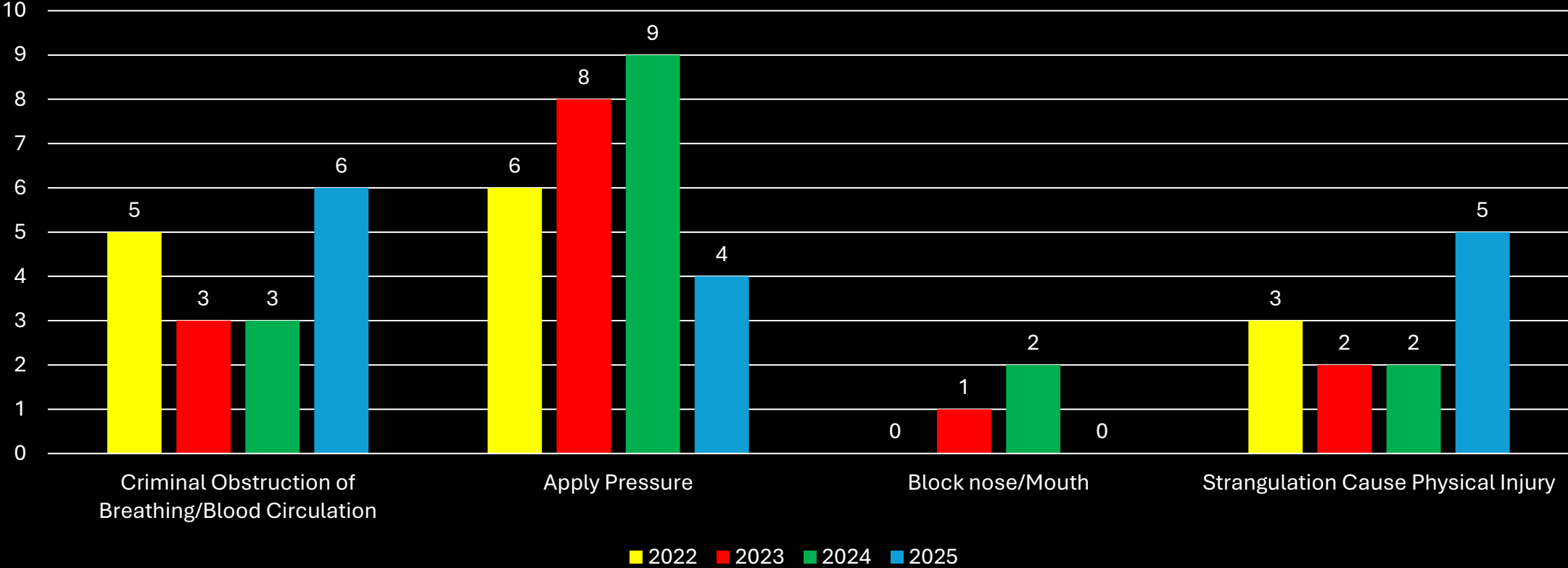
Domestic Related Incidents

4 Year Comparison Of Incidents By Month



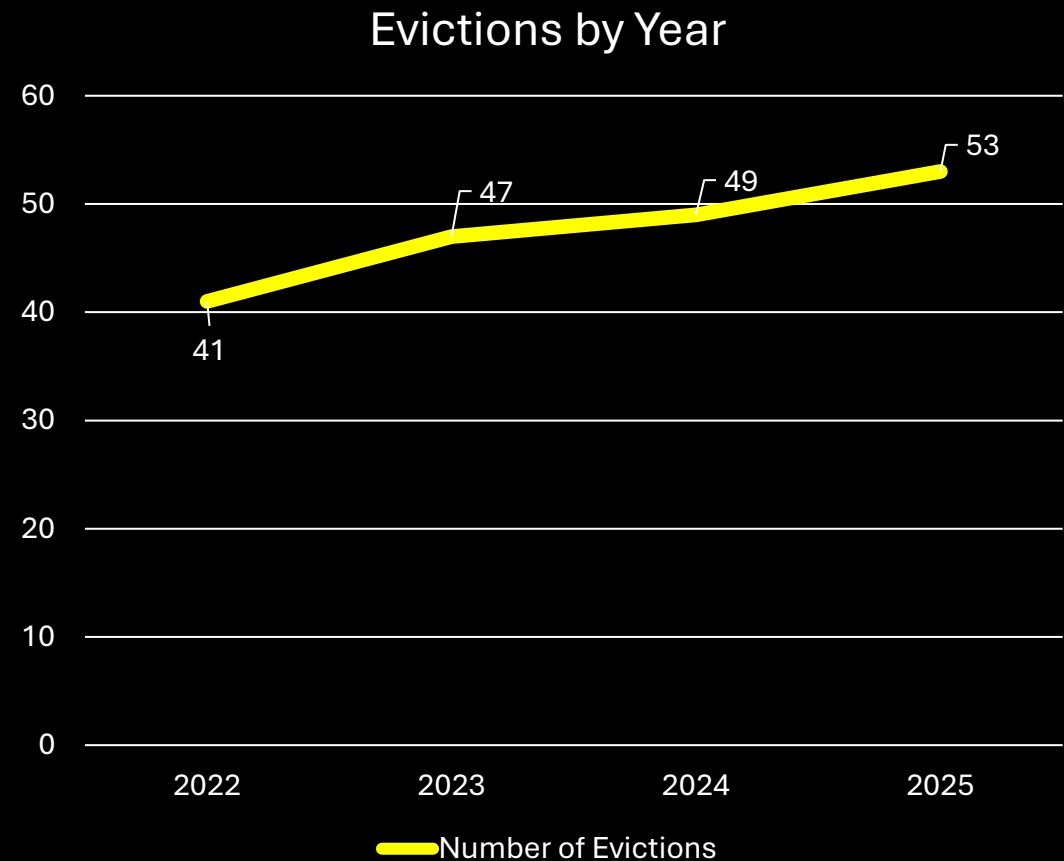

Criminal Obstruction Of Breathing & Strangulation



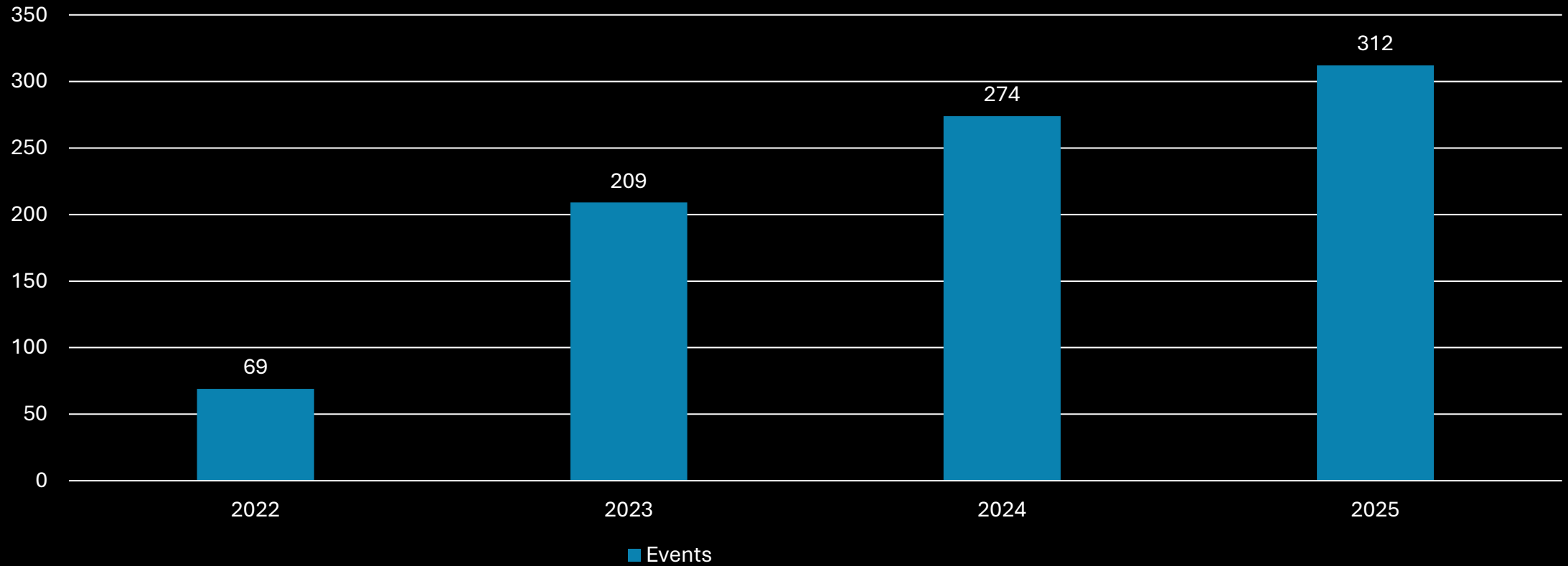
Civil Evictions By Year – Town Of Union

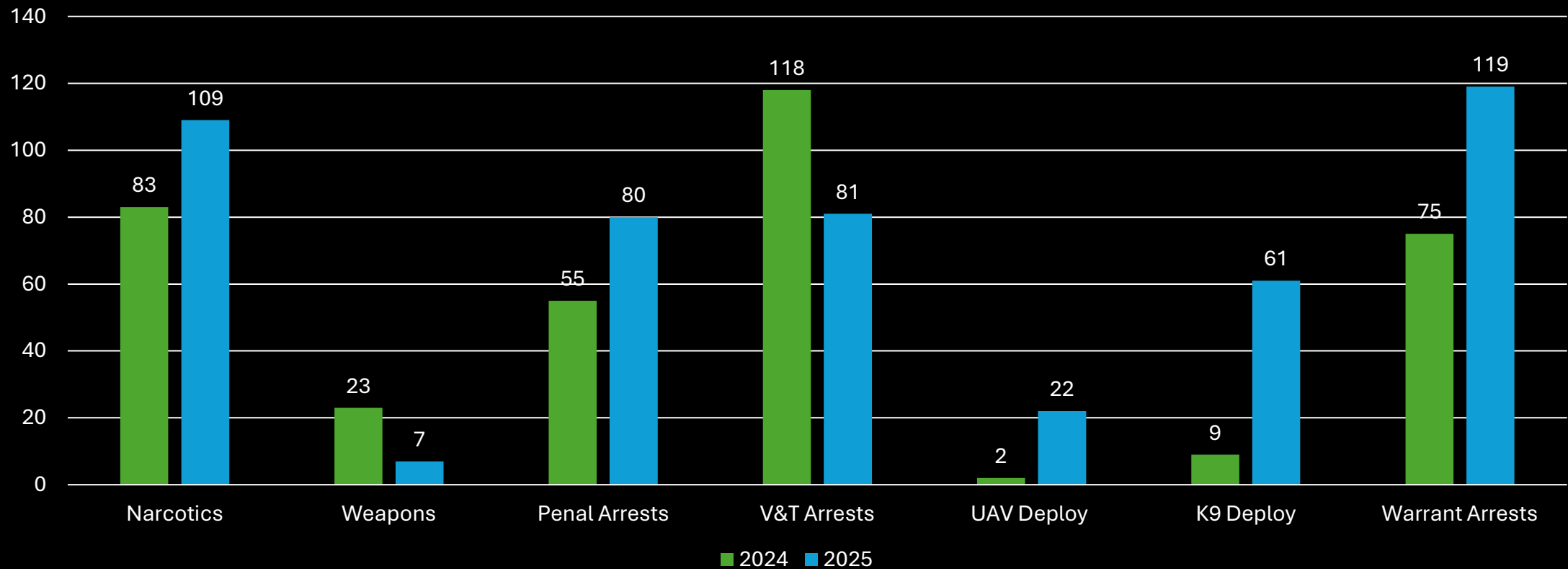
STRATEGIC RESPONSE GROUP (SRG)

- Utilizes “hot-spot” mapping, community feedback, and advanced tools and techniques.

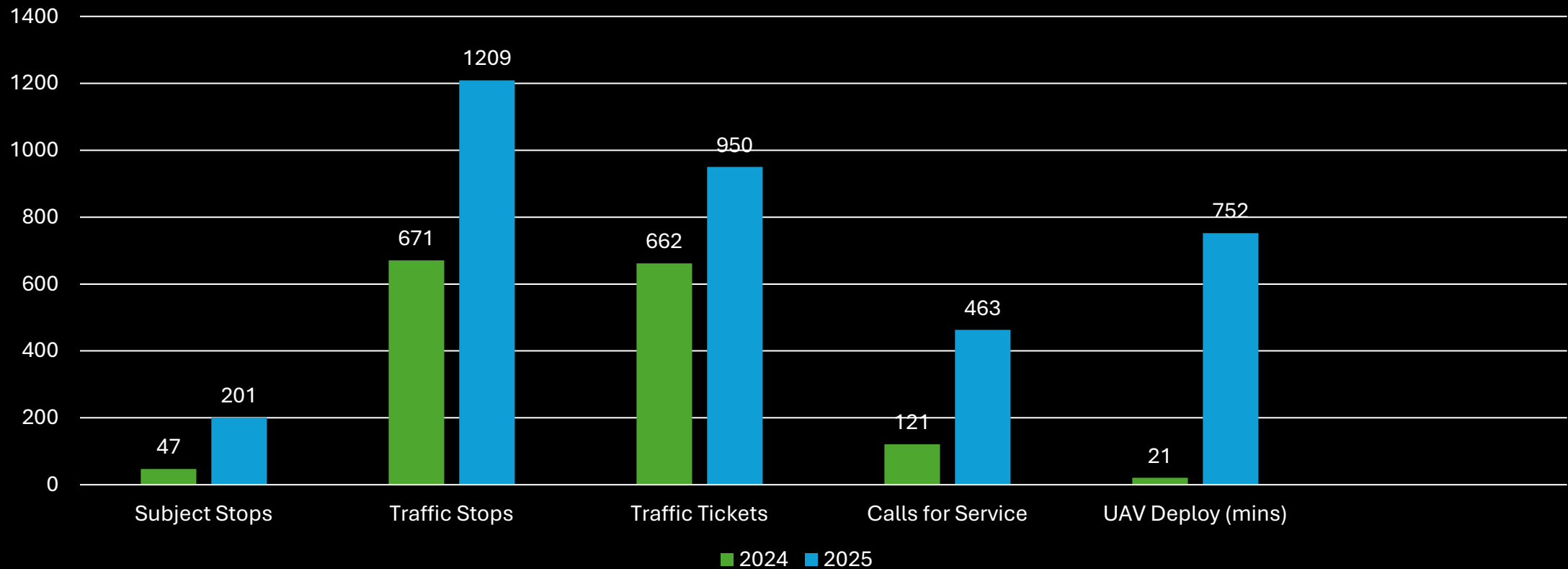

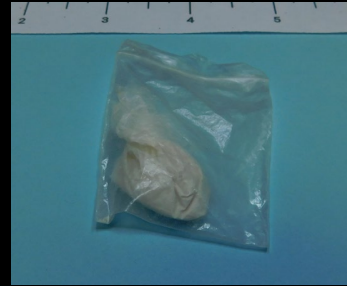

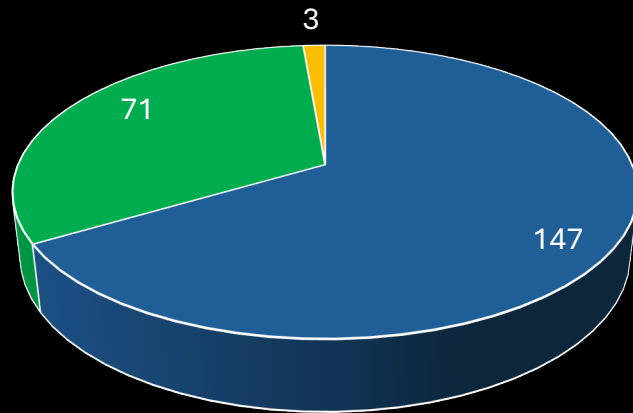


K-9 Marley alerted to the presence of narcotics while conducting a search of a housing unit which resulted in the discovery of Heroin



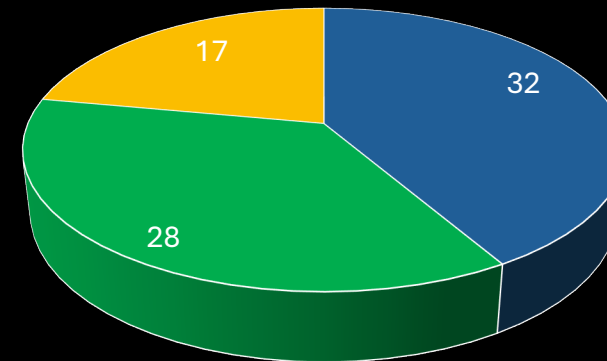
K-9 Marley alerted to the presence of narcotics while conducting a search which resulted in the discovery of Synthetic Cannabinoids

Broome County Correctional Facility Programs

- Forensic Services Program Coordinator position
 - IDT – Interdisciplinary Team established February 2025
- 2 Discharge Specialist positions
 - Tracking since July 2025 – 640 releases (149 scheduled, 491 unscheduled)
 - *95 received clothing
 - *368 received a Sheriff's ID at no cost to them
 - *392 were assisted with DSS applications
 - *372 were provided with bus passes or set up with direct transportation from a community partner agency
 - *88 were set up with insurance
 - *114 were scheduled for outpatient substance use appointments
 - *145 were scheduled for outpatient mental health appointments
 - *126 were scheduled for primary care appointments

Broome County Correctional Facility Programs

- Inmate Worker Program Supervisor and Inmate Worker program
- Garden Program with Cornell Cooperative Extension and Local Carpenters Union
- Monthly Meetings with UHS, Prime Care and Broome County Mental Health to discuss MAT program.

Notable Case 2024

An undocumented man who crossed the southern border seeking asylum is in custody on a felony burglary charge after breaking into a second-floor apartment in the Town of Union. On Friday, March 22, 2024 at approximately 8:18 PM, Broome County Sheriff's Office patrols responded to reports of suspicious activity in and around an apartment building on JFK Blvd. in the Town of Union.

The investigation revealed that Miguel A. Martinez, age 31, had broken into a second-floor apartment through a bedroom window. The noises alerted a downstairs neighbor, who called 911.

Notable Case 2025

On January 2, 2025, the SIU executed a search warrant at 3104 Buckingham Road in the Town of Union. The target of the search warrant was Allen L. Hurt, age 58 of Endicott, NY, who was present during the execution of the warrant. During the search, the following items of evidence were located:

- 252 grams of Crack Cocaine
- Psilocybin Mushrooms
- Scale, packaging and cutting agent used for the distribution of narcotics
- Approximately \$1,100 of US currency

According to detectives familiar with the investigation, the crack cocaine recovered had an estimated street value of as much as \$15,000.

Notable Case 2025

On May 9, 2025 SIU executed a search warrant at 2 Donald St. Apt.2 in the Town of Union. As a result of the search warrant, the following items of evidence were located in the apartment.

- Approximately 3.4 grams of Cocaine
- Digital Scales
- Packaging Material
- Cutting Agent
- A Ruger .45 Caliber Revolver
- A Kel-Tec 9mm Handgun
