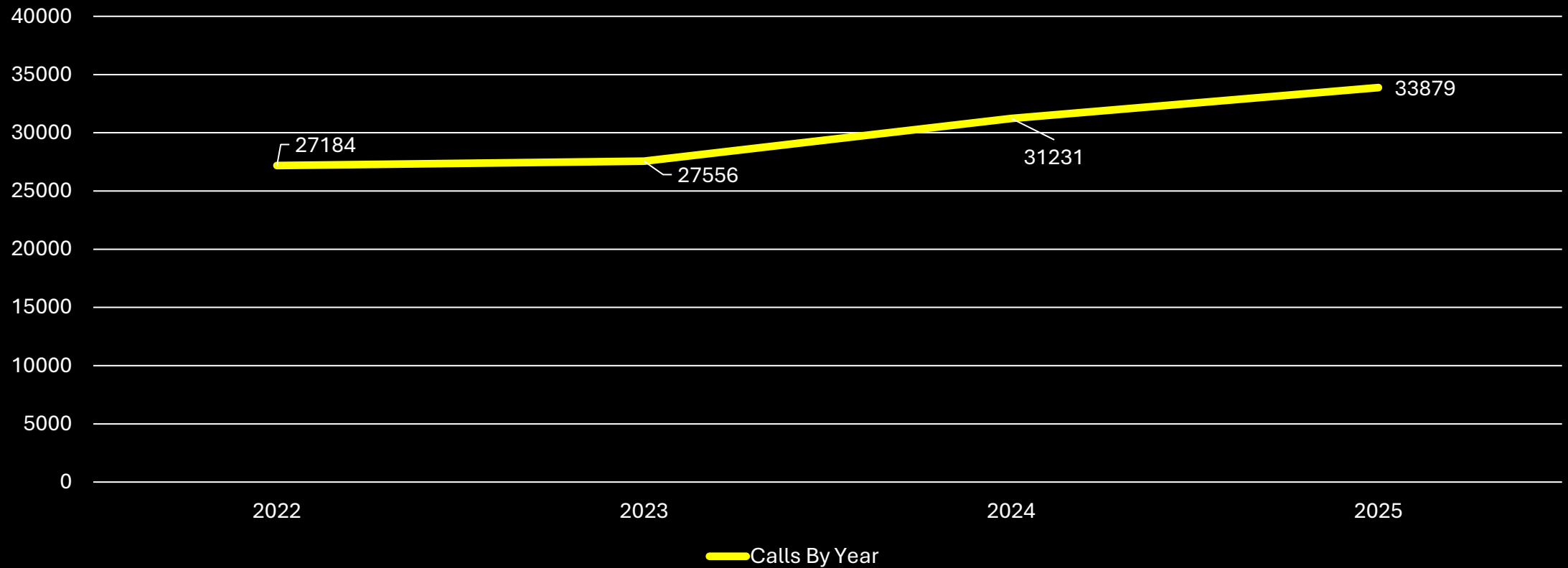

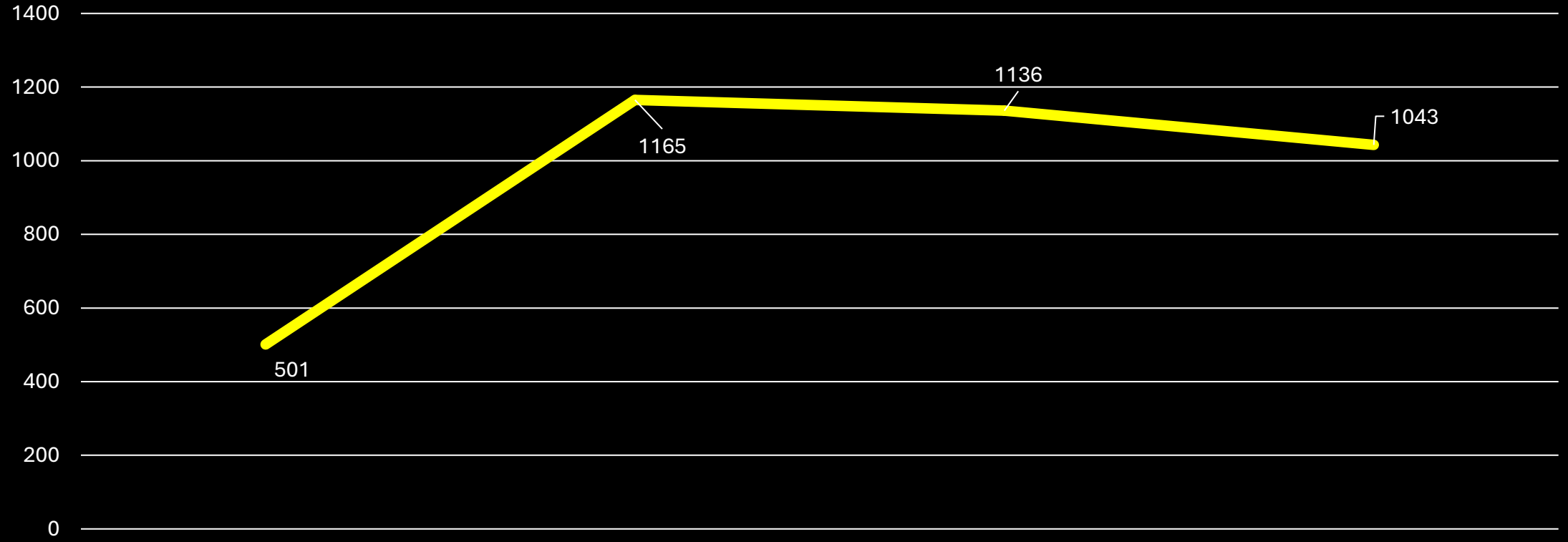
Countywide Calls For Service 2022-2025

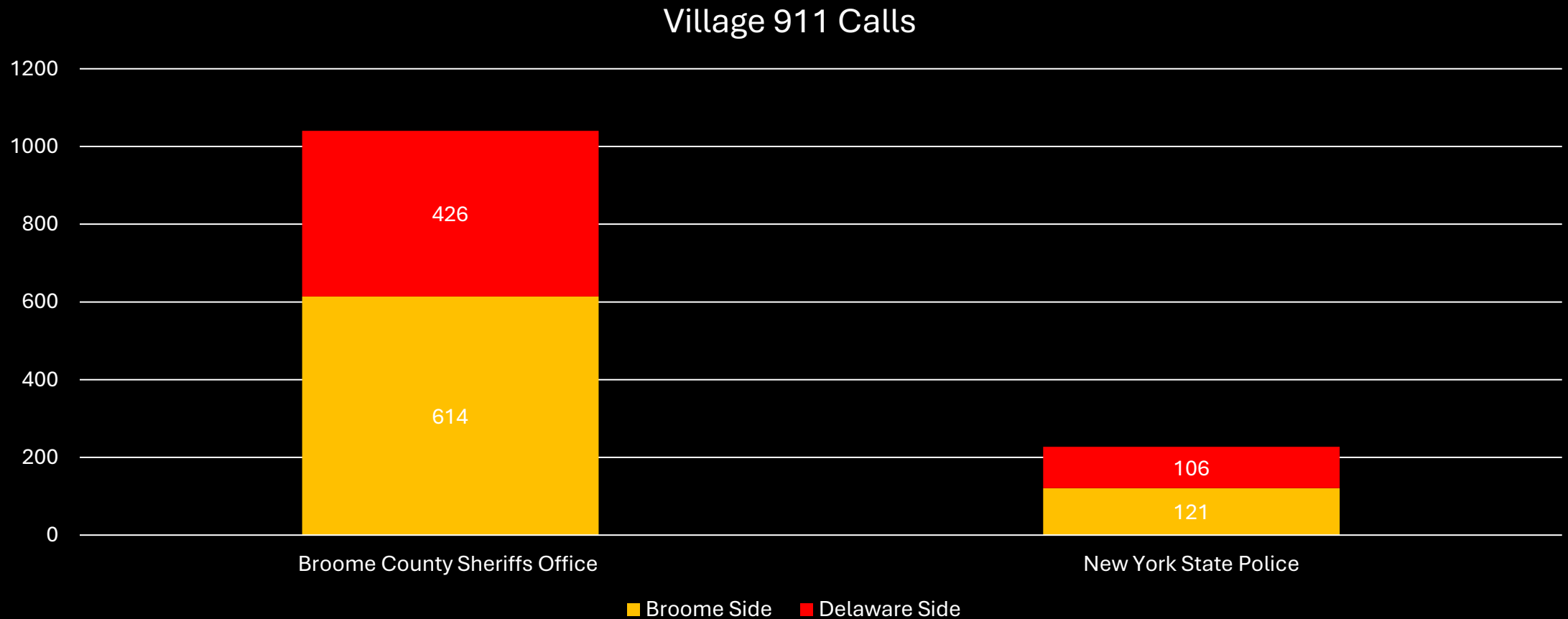

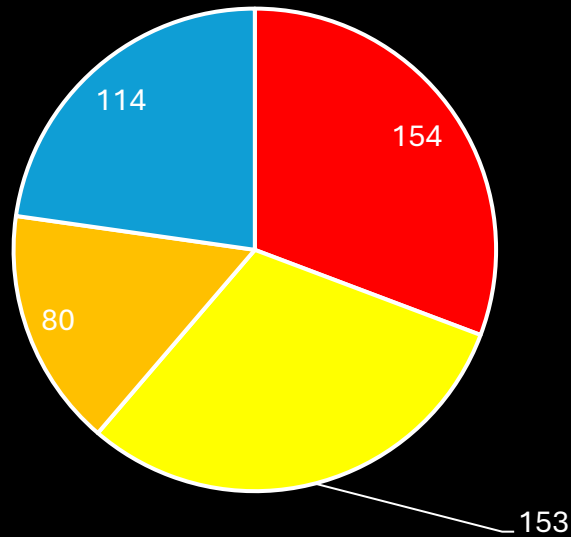

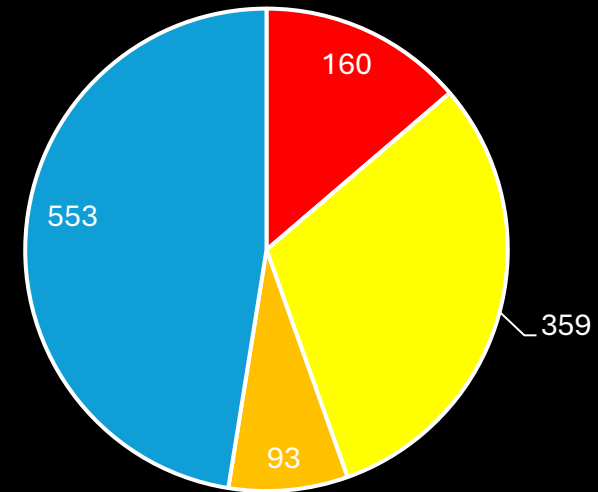

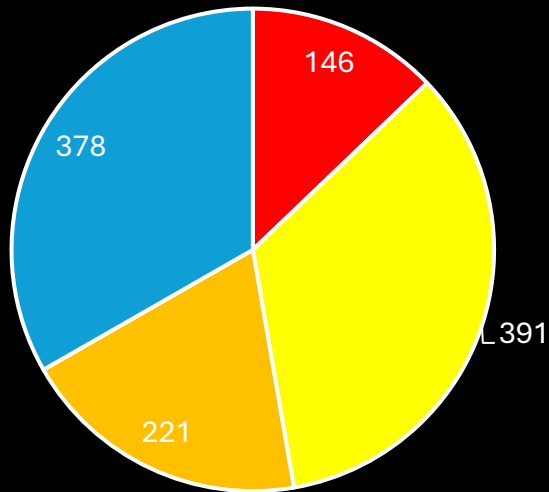

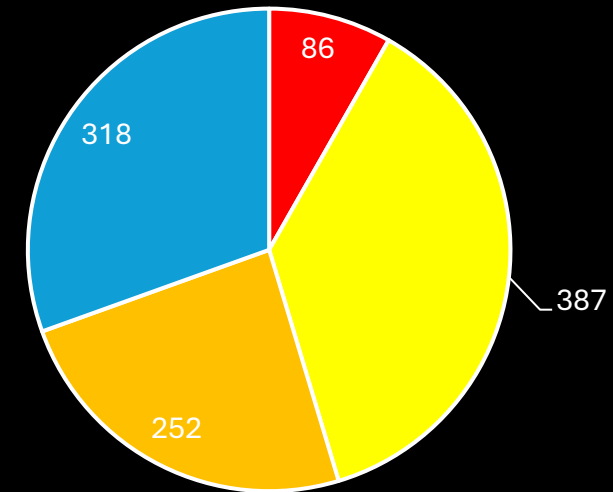

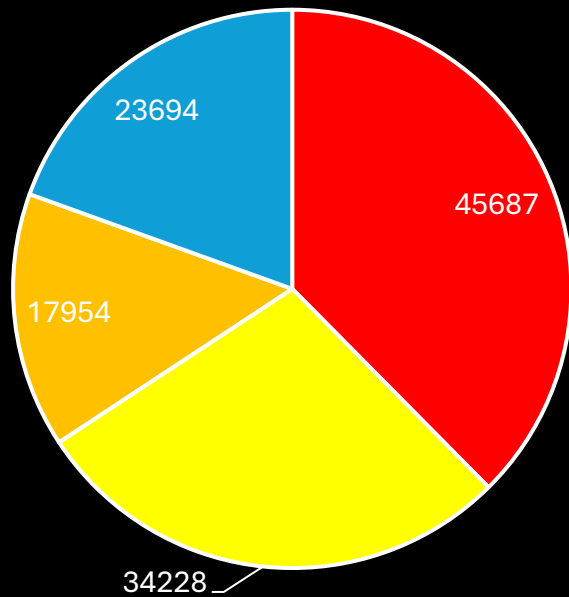

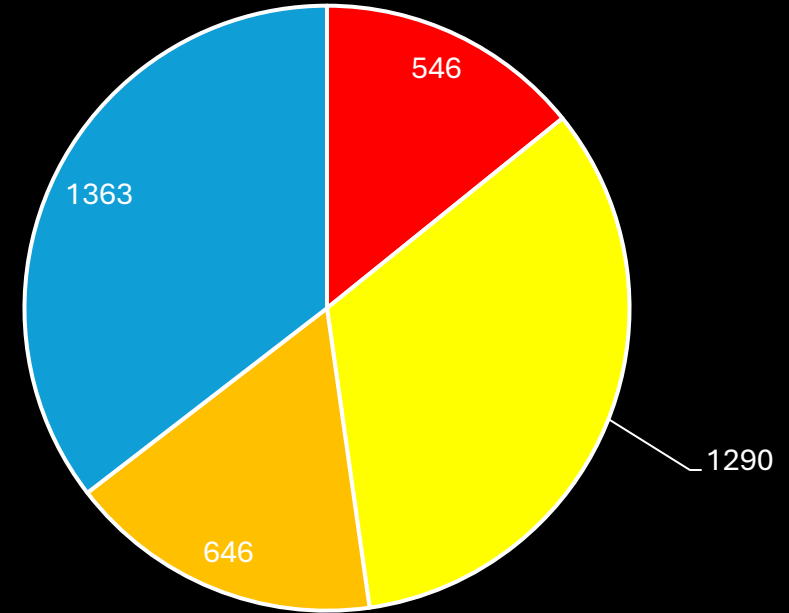
Total Calls By Priority Last 4 Years

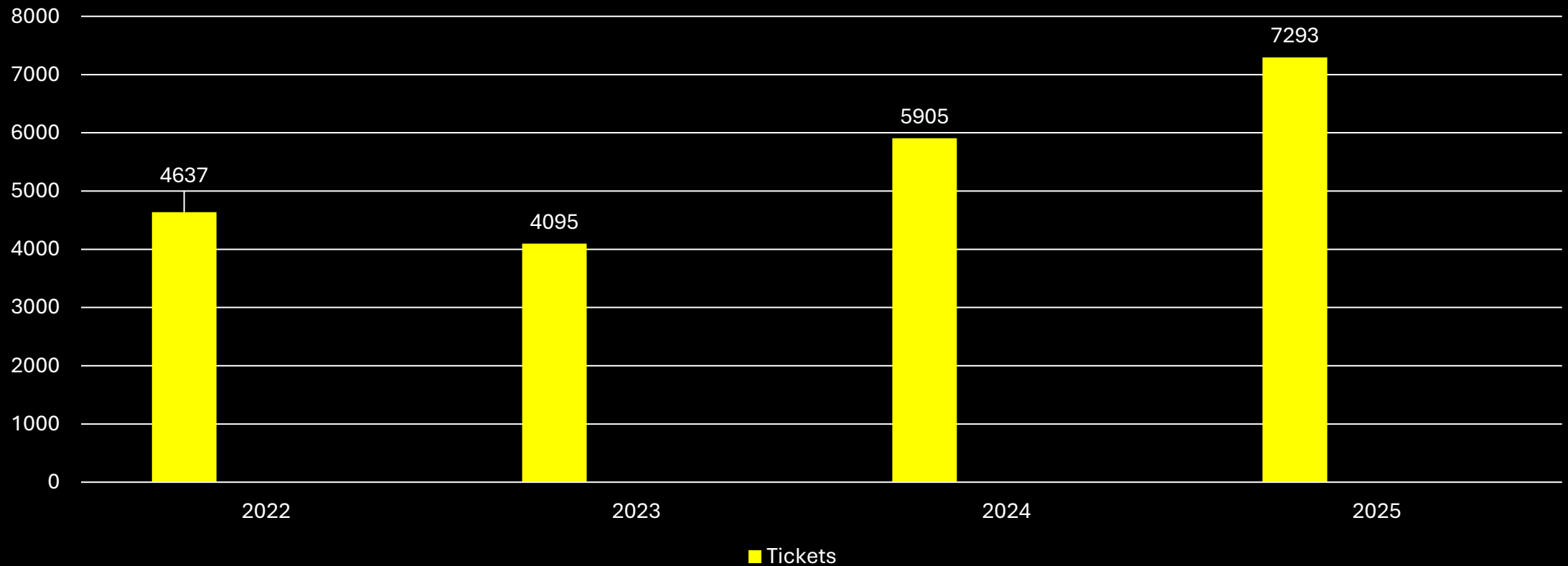

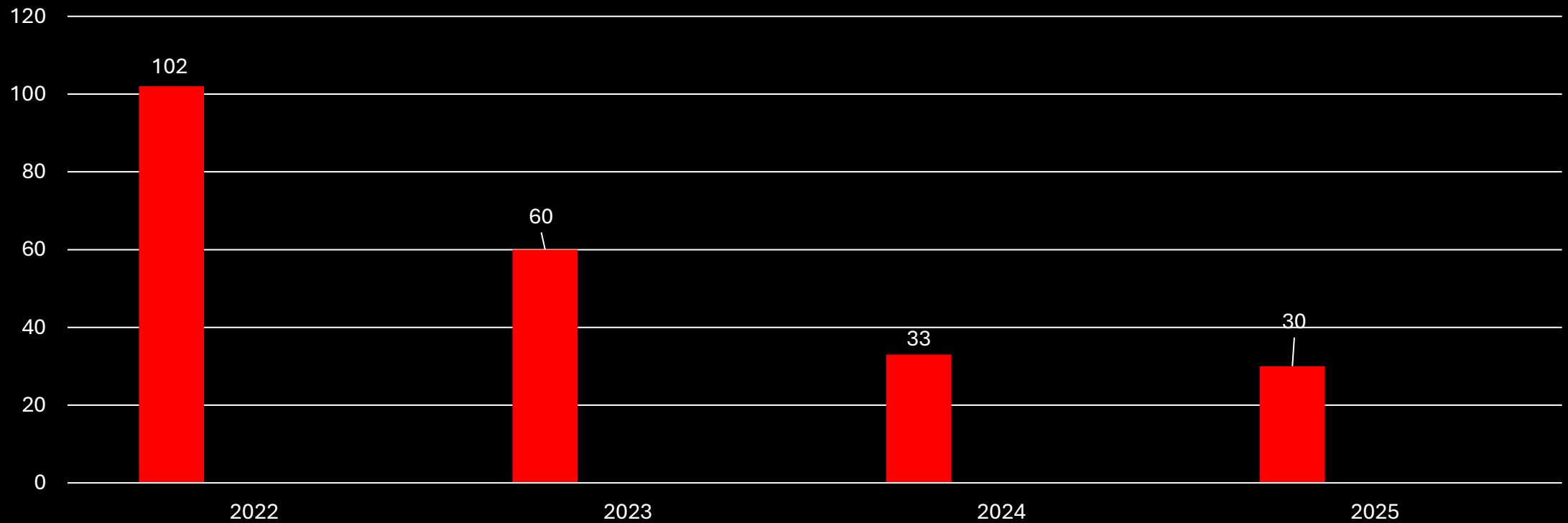
County Wide Tickets By Year

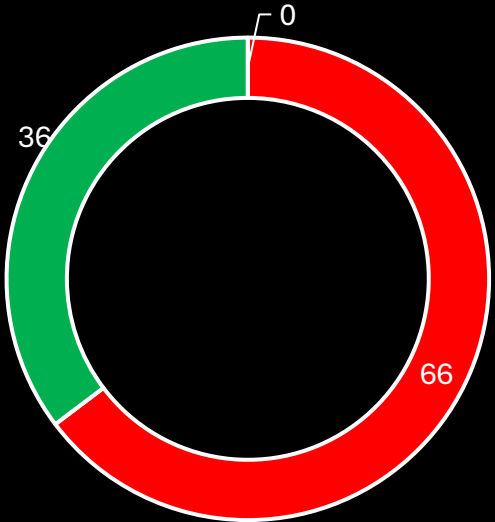

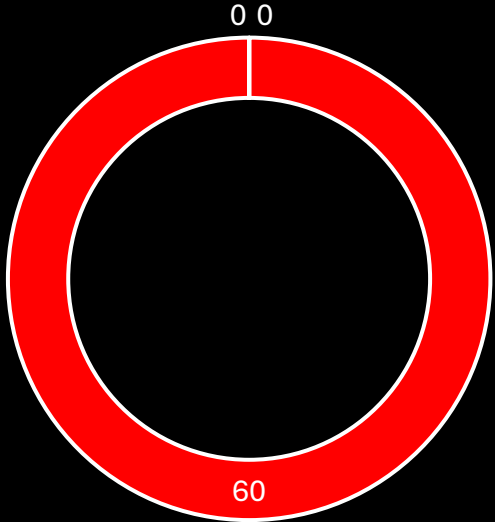

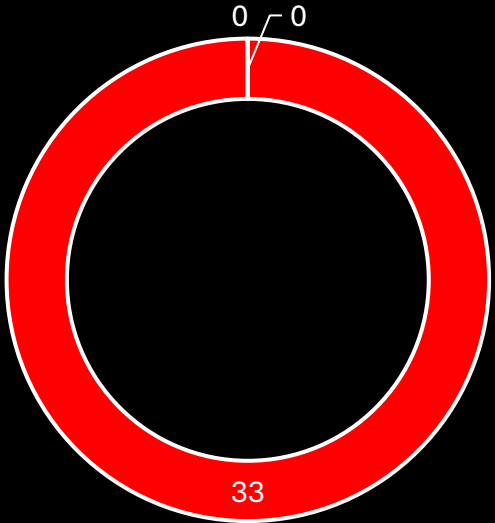

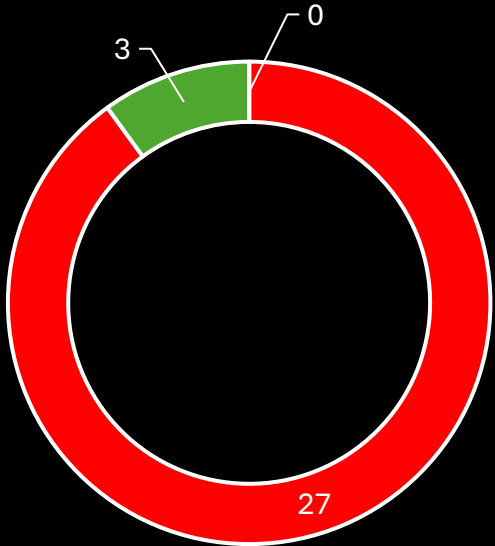

Traffic Infractions Parking Warning

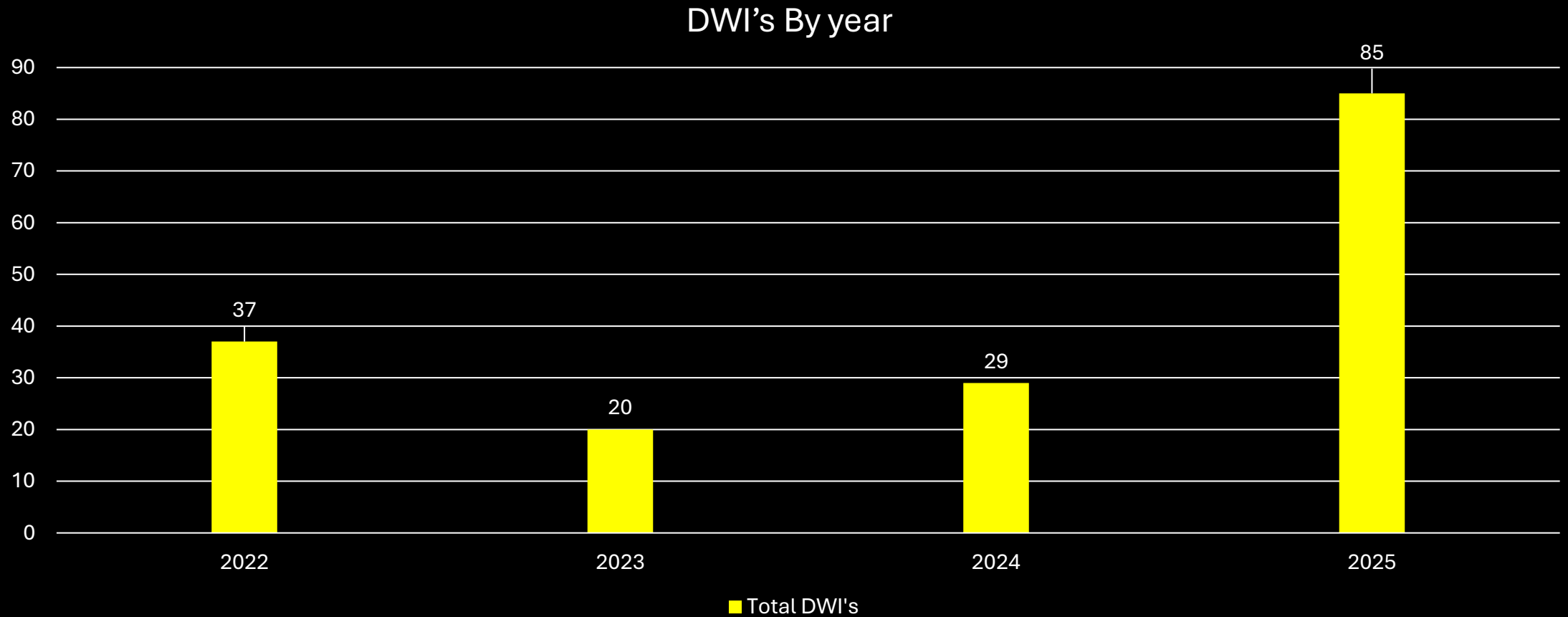

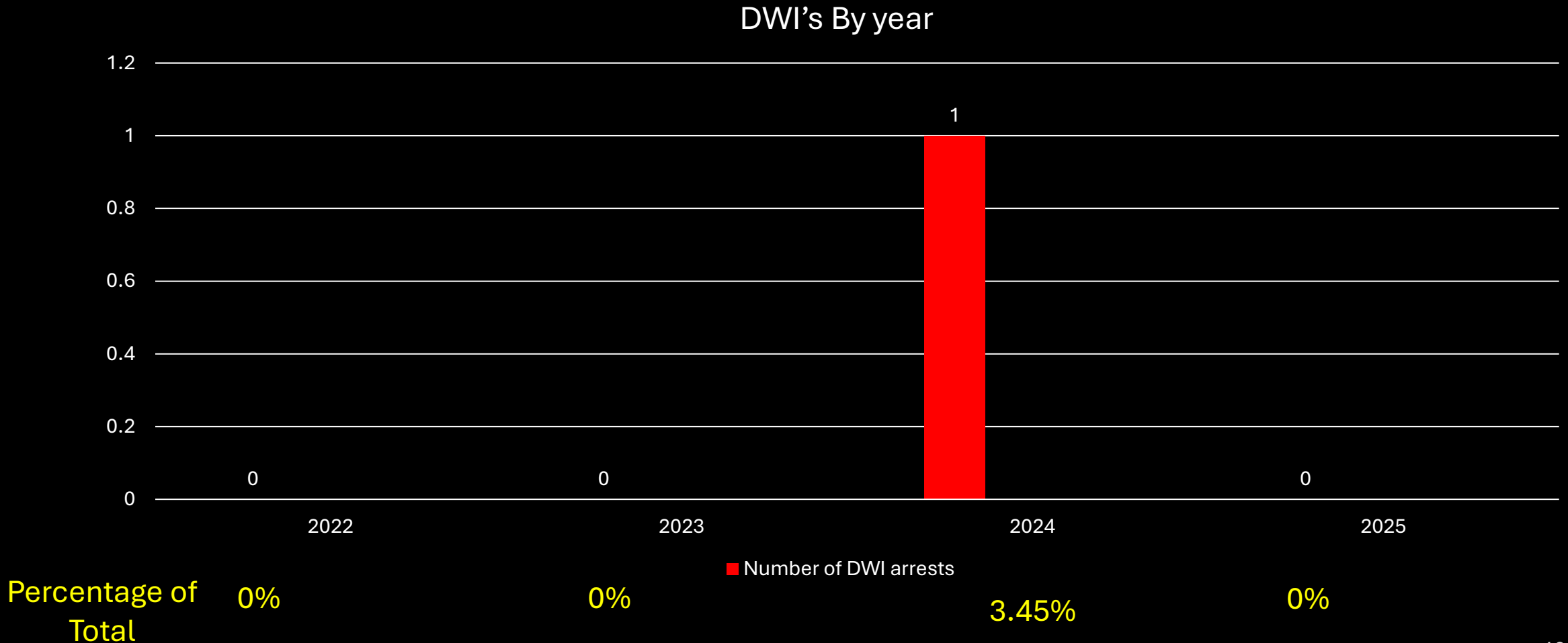

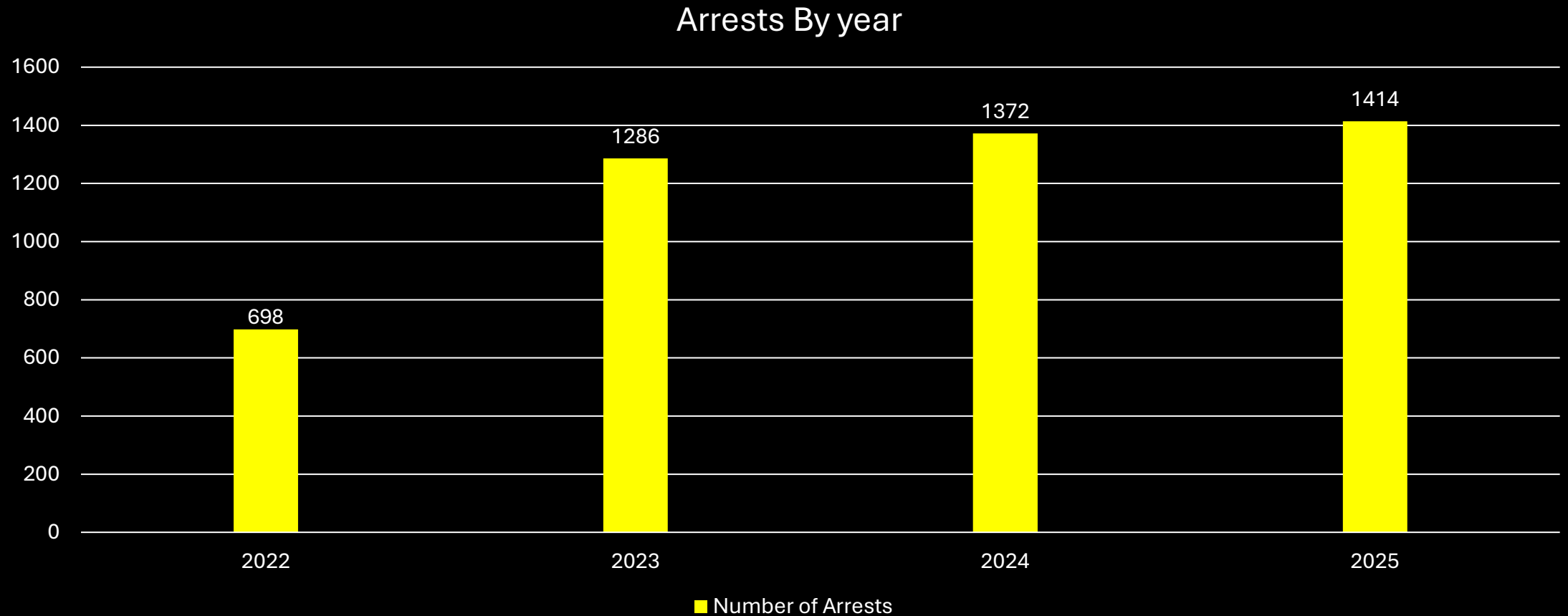
DWI's Countywide By Year



DWI Arrests By Year – Village Of Deposit

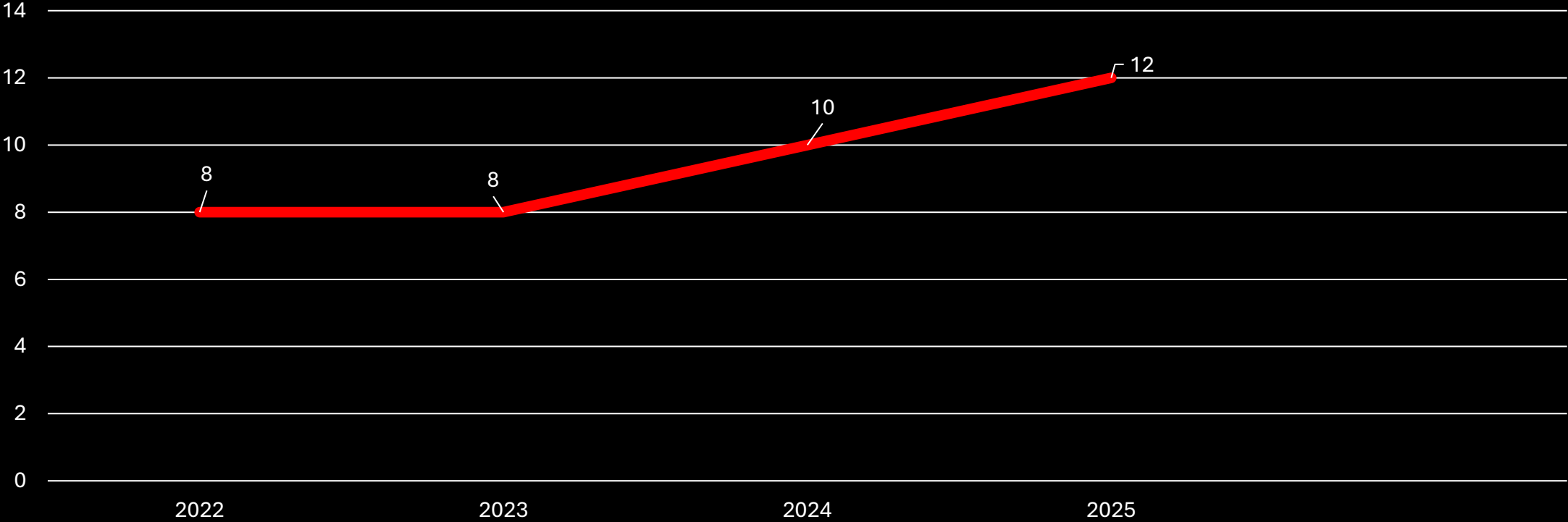


Total Arrests By Year

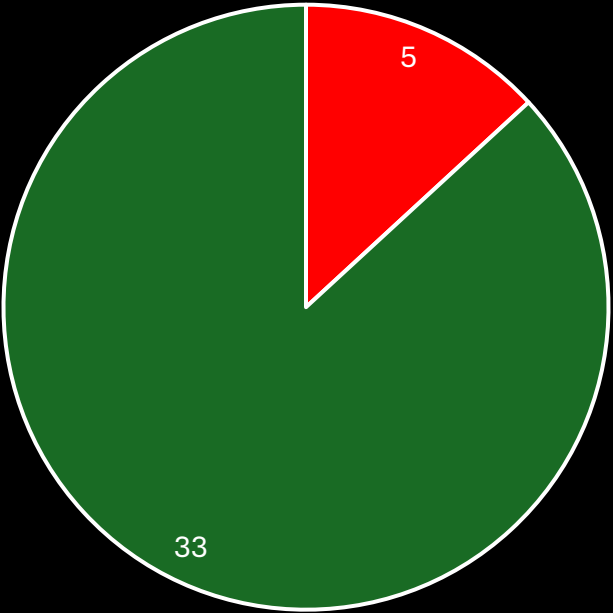

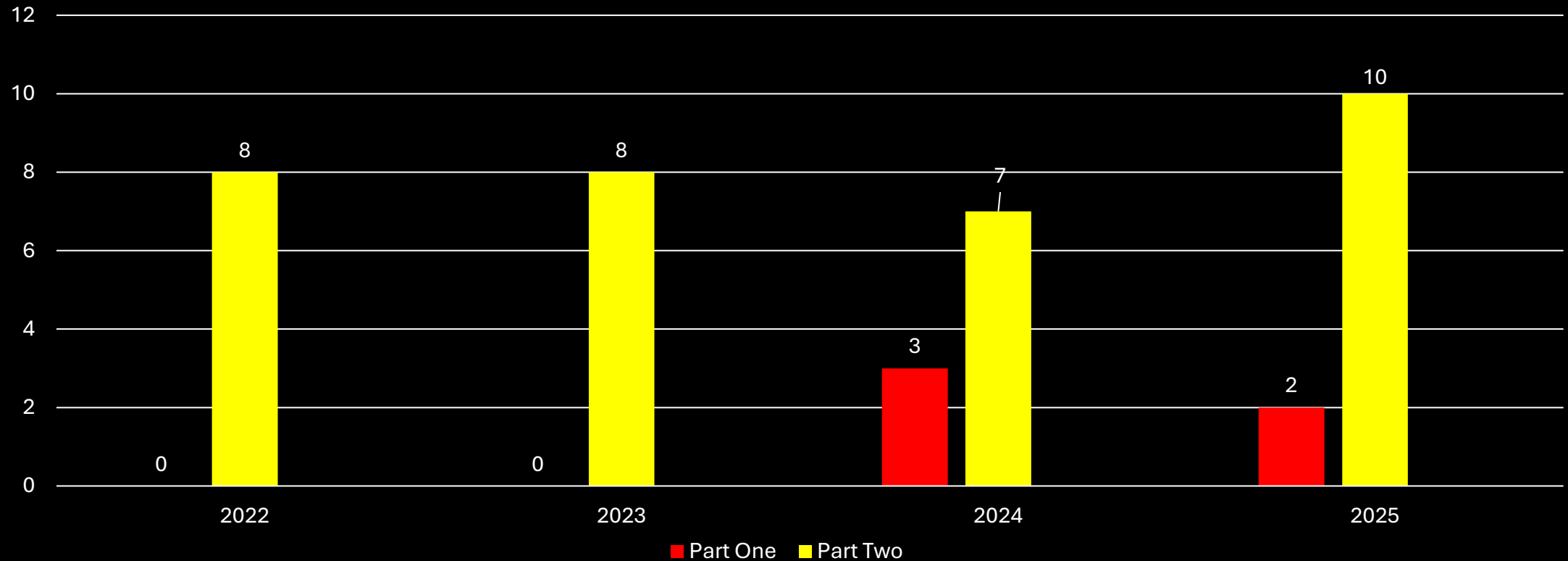

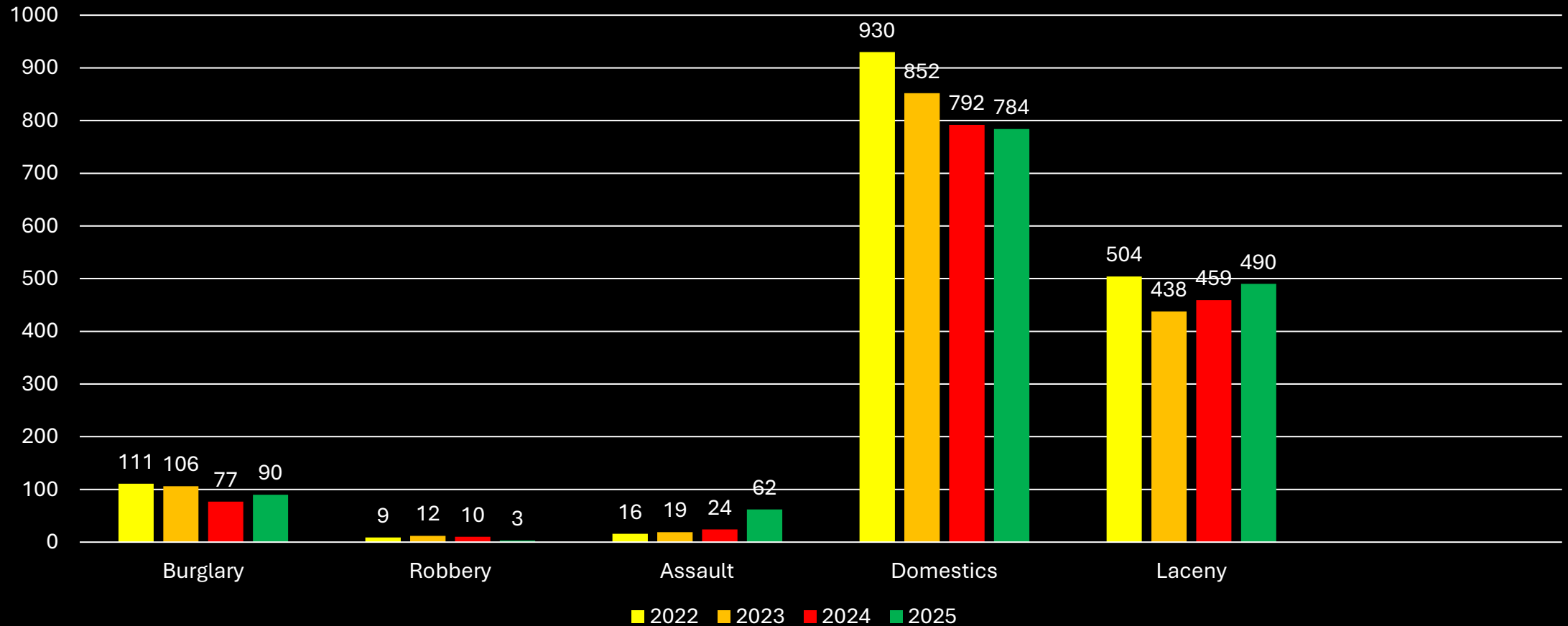

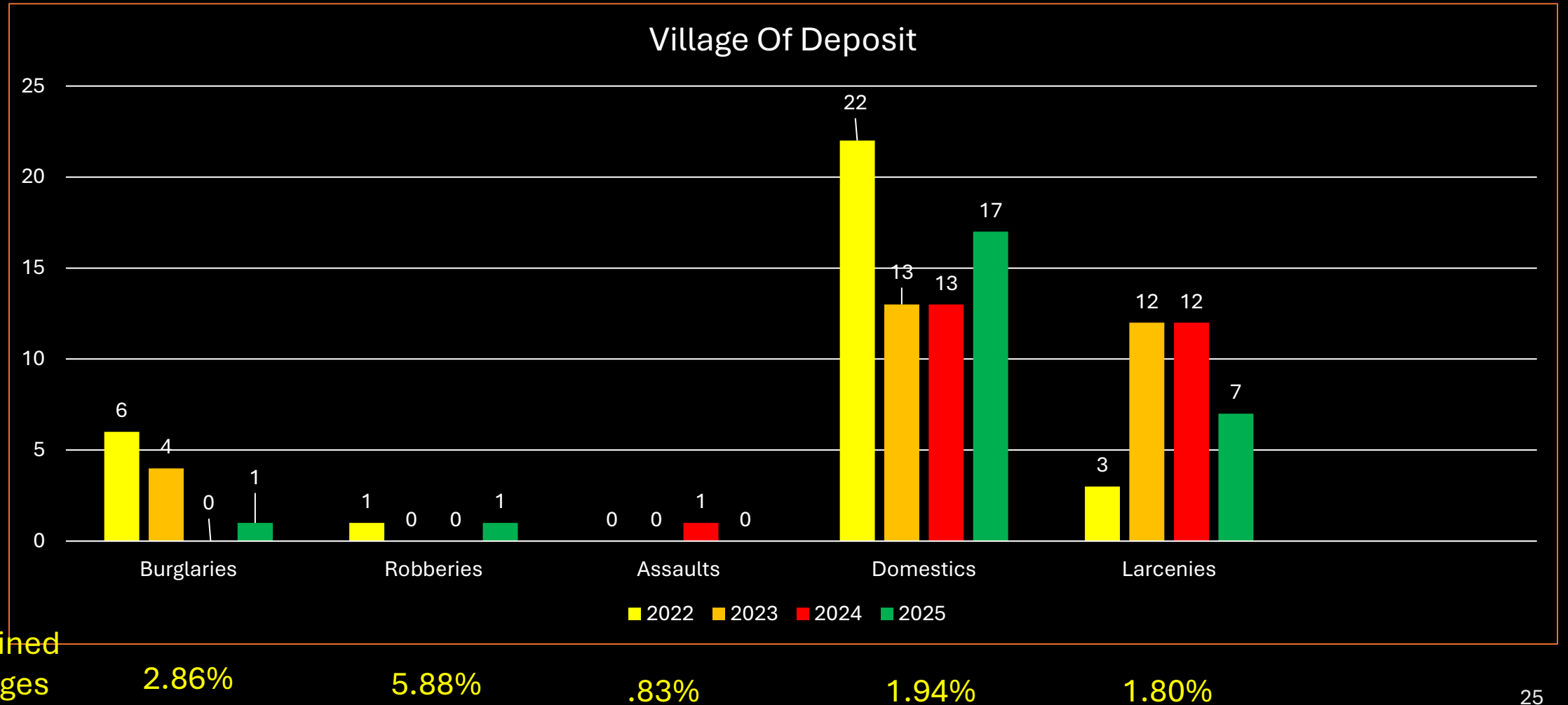

County Calls By year

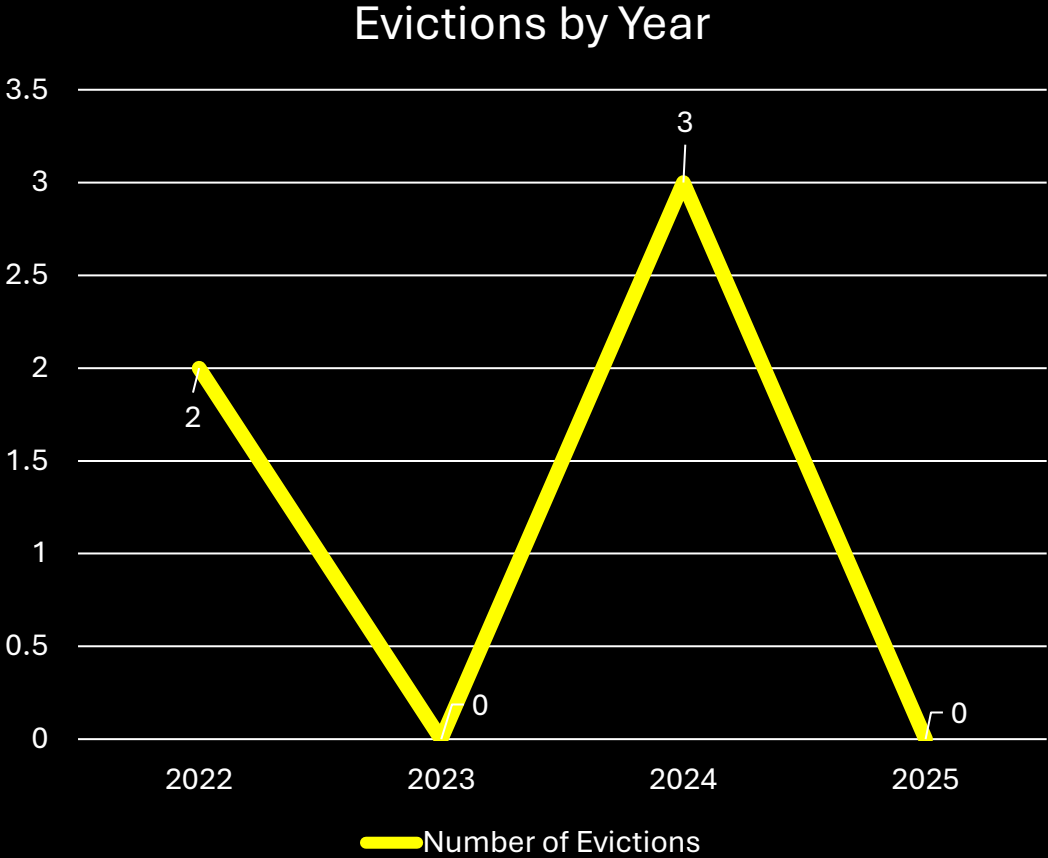


Types Of Calls For Service 2022-2025

- Civil Evictions can be caused by several things and are not always crime related; However, Generally Speaking Evictions are a quality of life, and Standard of living issue for the residents, and property owners alike.



Notable Case 2025

- On November 15, at around 7:53 p.m., members of the Broome County Sheriff's Office Road Patrol observed a motorcycle traveling at a high rate of speed on Second Street in the Village of Deposit. When a deputy attempted to stop the motorcyclist, they failed to comply, sped up, and led the deputy on a pursuit on Old Route 17 out of the Village of Deposit and into the Town of Sanford.
- Road Patrol continued to pursue the vehicle through the Town of Windsor, with the motorcycle reaching speeds between 65 mph and 90 mph and crossing lanes into oncoming traffic as it fled. After reaching the Village of Windsor, the motorcycle continued northbound on Route 79 into the Town of Colesville, where it continued into Chenango County, then Otsego County, still traveling at a high rate of speed.
- Criminal Possession of Stolen Property in the 3rd Degree, a Class D Felony
- Tampering with Physical Evidence, a Class E Felony
- Unlawful Fleeing a Police Officer in a Motor Vehicle in the Third Degree, a Class A Misdemeanor
- Obstruction of Governmental Administration in the Second Degree, a Class A Misdemeanor
- Reckless Endangerment in the Second Degree, a Class A Misdemeanor
- Resisting Arrest, a Class A Misdemeanor
- Multiple traffic violations
